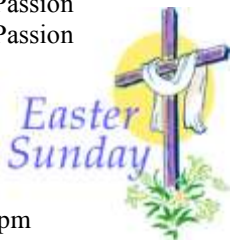

- 1) Fasting is to be observed on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday by everyone 18 years and older, who has not yet celebrated their 59th birthday. On a fast day, one full meal is allowed. Two other meals, enough to maintain strength, may be taken, according to each one's needs, but together they should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted, but consuming liquids, including milk and juices, is allowed.
- 2) Abstinence is observed by everyone 14 years of age or older. On days of abstinence, no meat is allowed. Note that when health or the ability to work is affected, the law does not oblige. Ash Wednesday, all the Fridays during Lent, and Good Friday are days of abstinence. If a person is unable to observe the above regulations due to ill health or other serious reasons, other suitable forms of self-denial are encouraged.

## **UPDATING THE PARISH CENSUS AND CONTACT INFORMATION**

This weekend February 24th/25th and next weekend March 3rd/4th after all of the Masses, volunteers will be in the Gathering Space with a printed census form for each parish family that is registered. Our goal is to get everyone to look at their family information, and with the help of our volunteers make any corrections (phone number, address, email address, etc.), add missing information, or confirm that the information we have is correct. **Please pay special attention to email addresses.**

We will also have blank census forms available in case someone has recently had a child that is not already included on their census form or for those who are not registered and want to be. If a family has adult children listed on the census form, we would like to either register them separately if they are still in the area and are active members, or remove them from the census if they are inactive or have left the area.

## Third Sunday of Lent (Year A)

### Parched Hearts

Merciful God, you are the wellspring of all life, look upon your people who, with stony hearts, find themselves grumbling in the desert of sin. May your love strike our parched hearts and, like the woman at the well and the Israelites, fill them with your grace so we may go forth telling others of your mighty deeds. Keep us mindful of your presence and help us hear your voice, which calls us from sin to the cleansing waters of Baptism. May your Son, Jesus, quench our thirst and soften our hardened hearts, so that transformed by grace, we may never thirst again. Through Christ our Lord. Amen.

### Sunday, March 4, 2018-Living Water



*Today's Readings: Exodus 17:3-7; Psalm 95:1-2, 6-7, 8-9; Romans 5:1-2, 5-8; John 4:5-42.* What did you experience during the times when you were thirsty? For most in the United States, water is accessible, so we can easily satisfy our parched lips. In some parts of the world, clean water can be scarce. The metaphor in our Gospel today invites us to examine our deep thirsts, which can only be identified when we take time in quiet prayer to listen to the movement of the Holy Spirit. Do you know your deepest thirst?

In the story of the Samaritan woman at the well Jesus reminds us that he is the source of all life. As he speaks to the woman, he explains that those who drink from the water that he gives will never thirst again. The woman's heart is changed during the conversation, and she comes to know that Jesus is the Messiah. When we open ourselves to this Gospel, God's merciful love is revealed to us.

Today, parishes around the world will celebrate the First Scrutiny with the elect. This reading accompanies the ritual because it helps us talk about faith and how our faith brings us to know Jesus intimately. The elect, along with the whole assembly, are asked to name all that is sinful so that once sin is shed, the good within them can flourish and faith can take root. Fill a bowl with water and place it near your family prayer space. Use it in prayer and consider the ways Christ quenches your thirst.

### This Week at Home

- **Monday, March 5-The Need for Healing**

In the Gospel, Jesus tells us that a prophet is not accepted in his native place. As he tells of the healing of Naaman, by Elisha, Jesus shows the power of God's Word. Like the prophets of old, Jesus announces and shares the Good News. Jesus was driven out of town because of what he said. When have you heard Jesus but were unwilling to heed his instructions? Naaman eventually listened to Elisha and was healed. Spend fifteen minutes in silent prayer, listening to God. *Today's Readings: 2 Kings 5:1-5ab; Psalm 42:2, 3; 43:3, 4; Luke 4:24-30.*

- **Tuesday, March 6-Boundless Mercy**

We hear Peter again ask about forgiveness. Jesus reminds Peter that since God's mercy has no limits, we cannot put a number on the amount of times we should forgive another. Consider the Lord's Prayer. It reminds us, as does the parable, that we are to forgive as God forgives. At dinner, using the crosses you made that first week, discuss the importance of forgiveness. *Today's Readings: Daniel 3:25, 34-43; Psalm 25:4-5ab, 6 and 7bc, 8-9; Matthew 18:21-35.*

- **Wednesday, March 7-Sts. Perpetua and Felicity**

The two saints we remember today were beheaded at public games in Carthage because they refused to deny their Christian faith. The First Reading reminds us to keep the commandments. Look carefully at verse nine, which warns us to not forget the things we have seen. Like Perpetua and Felicity, we have seen the living God and we must not forget his love and mercy. We are called to give witness to the Paschal Mystery in all we do. Pray today for widows and all those unjustly imprisoned. *Today's Readings: Deuteronomy 4:1, 5-9; Psalm 147:12-13, 15-16, 19-20; Matthew 5:17-19.*

- **Thursday, March 8-God's People**

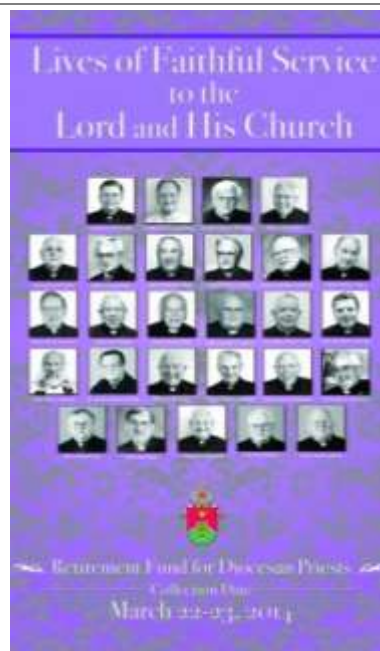
Jeremiah has a tough audience before him. The Lord has said that those who listen and follow him will be his people and prosper, but the Lord reveals to Jeremiah that the people have not listened. This refusal of the people to listen is heard many times during Lent. Time and time again, the Lord sent prophets to his people to call them back, and yet, they remained in the darkness of their hearts. Do the People of God listen today? To open your heart to God's voice, pray the refrain to the Psalm: If today you hear his voice, harden not your hearts. *Today's Readings: Jeremiah 7:23-28; Psalm*

• **Friday, March 9-St. Frances of Rome**

The reading from Hosea paints a picture of God’s profound love for his people. God yearns for us to turn back to him and share in his life and love our neighbor as ourselves. This is exactly what Frances of Rome did. She longed for the Lord, which led her to serve Rome’s poor. We are also called to witness God’s love. This caring for neighbor is a prophetic voice, like Hosea’s, that calls all people to share in the life God offers. Today consider how you can help the poor in your community during the next week. Perhaps you could make a dessert for the homeless shelter. *Today’s Readings: Hosea 14:2–10; Psalm 81:6c–8a, 8bc–9, 10–11ab, 14 and 17; Mark 12:28–34.*

• **Saturday, March 10-Return to the Lord**

Hosea’s words are clear that God will heal all that is weak and dead within us. When we turn to God in love, we grow in faith and holiness and God showers us with love so that we might live. What does it look like to love God? Let the coming spring be a reminder of God’s unfading love for us. Take time to pray with the images of the First Reading today. *Today’s Readings: Hosea 6:1–6, Psalm 51:3–4, 18–19, 20–21ab; Luke 18:9–14.*

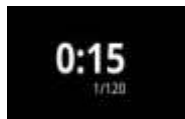
