

Dear Sisters and Brothers,


Greetings on this Fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time.

This weekend, we say farewell to Fr. Dominic Asthisu, who will be leaving us after the Noon Mass. As announced last week, Bishop Mark has asked Fr. Dominic to become administrator of the Churches in Preston County. It is because of a sudden pastoral need, that Fr. Dominic is leaving us so soon. We are very grateful for his pastoral care and priestly service to us since last March. Please keep him in your prayers as he takes on this new assignment.

It may be a while before a new associate is appointed so we are adjusting the weekday Mass schedule as is noted in this bulletin.

As announced last week, we are taking this opportunity to adjust the Sunday Mass schedule. Studying our attendance numbers for the past five years, four of our five Masses average less than a third of our capacity. After seeking the advice of our parish pastoral council members and your preference (your vote through Flocknote), I announce that beginning on March 5th, we will combine the 10am Mass and the 12pm Mass into one at 10:30am. From our music director...

A Joyful Psalm #76: Psalm 112

Do you love food? I love food. We just so happen to be concluding "Restaurant Week" here in Charleston, WV, and it is quite fitting for the readings this weekend. I have decided that *God loves food*. Consider the following: the first sin is committed by the *consumption* of food; the Israelites are instructed to *eat* the Passover lamb; God *feeds* them in the desert with manna from heaven; Jesus is born in the City of Bethlehem, which means "City of *Bread*"; He is born in a *feeding* trough where animals *eat*; He gives himself to us to be *eaten* in the Holy Eucharist.

The matter used for the Holy Eucharist is especially unique. All the other Sacraments use the naturally occurring materials of oil and water. The Eucharist uses bread and wine, which we physically make ourselves. During the presentation of gifts at Mass, we present our broken, unfermented selves, and the Lord changes this matter into Himself!

In the Gospel Reading, Jesus says, "You are the salt of the earth. But if salt loses its taste, with what can it be seasoned? It is no longer good for anything." (Mt.5: 13) As the Body of Christ, we are meant to "stick out" of the crowd just as well-seasoned food "stick out" of the menu. We are to be the "light of the world that must shine before others." (Mt. 5:16)


Do you love food? God loves you, and he wants to season you to go forth and be a light to others: to be a "light in darkness for the upright." (Ps. 112)

The Hope Scholarship Program is the state of West Virginia's education savings account (ESA) program that will allow parents and families to utilize the state portion of their education funding to tailor an individualized learning experience that works best for their child. The scholarship allows K-12 students to receive financial assistance that can be used for tuition, fees, and other expenses.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION for the 2023-24 academic year!

Beginning on March. 1, 2023, the Hope Scholarship board will accept applications for NEW Hope Scholarship students for the 2023-24 academic year. To qualify, a student must be a West Virginia resident and be one of the following: Eligible to be enrolled in kindergarten for the 2023-24 school year. Enrolled full-time in public elementary or secondary school in West Virginia for an entire instructional term of the 2022-23 academic year. Enrolled full-time and attending a public elementary or secondary school in West Virginia for at least 45 consecutive calendar days during the current instructional term at the time of application.

**Do not try to submit an application in the EMA portal or your Notice of Intent to your county board of education for the 2023-24 school year before March 1, 2023. **

Notices for Current Hope Scholarship Students-Students who were awarded the Hope Scholarship for 2022-23 school year must renew their applications annually to receive the Hope Scholarship. The renewal application period is expected to open up in February 2023. Check back here for more updates.

PARENT INFORMATION REGARDING TUITION ASSISTANCE 2023-2024 DIOCESAN TUITION ASSISTANCE PROCESS OPENS FEBRUARY 1ST 2023

For the 32nd consecutive year, the Diocesan Tuition Assistance Program (TAP) is striving to keep Catholic school education affordable for families who desire it for their children but who may need some financial assistance to make that dream a reality. Thanks to the ongoing and genuine commitment of The Most Reverend Mark Brennan to the Catholic schools in our Diocese, funds have, once again, been allocated for distribution to families in need of financial assistance.

Applying for **TAP through FACTS** is easy and affordable. You are encouraged to apply if your child is already enrolled or has been accepted by one of the Catholic schools in the Diocese of Wheeling-Charleston for the 2023-2024 school year.

- Who is eligible? Any student accepted for the 2023-2024 school year in any Diocesan Catholic school (PK thru grade 12) is eligible. Determinations are based upon a family's degree of need relative to all other applicants.
- Phase I: open to Catholic families ONLY
- Phase II: open to ALL families
- How do I apply? Applications are made on-line. Go to www.factsmgt.com, click on "Grant & Aid Assessment" and log in. If you do not have Internet access, contact your school office for assistance.
- Cost? The application fee is \$35. The Diocese will pay \$17.50 and families pay the other \$17.50.
- **Grants:** Diocesan grants for families who have completed their applications and show financial need will receive **up to 50%** of the child's tuition.
- Phase I Deadline In order to receive notification in late May, applications (including all required documentation and payment) are to be received by FACTS by April 30, 2023. Phase I is intended for Catholic families ONLY with children currently enrolled or already accepted for the 2023-2024 school year in any Catholic school in the Diocese of Wheeling-Charleston. Families must belong to a parish included on the drop-down list as part of the on-line application.

NEW: PLEASE READ

Phase II Deadline In order to receive notification in September, all applications for 2023-2024 (including all required documentation and payment of the fee) MUST be RECEIVED by FACTS no later than August 31, 2023. Phase II is now intended for Catholic and Non-Catholic families. If an application was submitted during Phase I, please contact the school. Please do NOT submit a second application.

Note 1: No assistance will be available from the Diocese or from any school unless:

- 1. an application is completed in full (ALL questions answered) and submitted
- 2. all required documentation is provided, AND
- 3. the family portion (\$17.50) of the application fee is paid by the deadline.

Note 2: ONLY ONE APPLICATION PER FAMILY should be submitted per school year. If you made an error or had a life event change, please do NOT submit a second application. Contact your principal and your application can be updated by FACTS.

Concerns for Immigrants Among Us

As a priest I have spent over thirty-five years serving and getting to know immigrants to our country. They are good people. While, we may not have large numbers of immigrants in West Virginia, those who are here deserve respect and fair treatment. I am concerned that proposals in the West Virginia legislature may harm immigrants and produce effects counter to the intention of those proposals.

The US constitution gives the conduct of foreign affairs and associated matters such as immigration to the federal government. Reforming our struggling immigration system, restoring order at the southern border, overcoming the obstacles facing those seeking asylum or refuge from oppression or starvation, being fair to immigrants brought here as children, and keeping families together when parents lack legal status, but their children born here are citizens – these challenges are for the federal government to solve, not the individual states. As Americans we can both welcome the foreigner out of charity and respect for his or her humanity and live in a country that takes reasonable steps to secure its borders and enforce its laws for the common good.

Here at home, West Virginians should focus on building compassionate and caring communities that foster the basic conditions necessary to permit human flourishing. I am concerned that reforming our code to impose draconian penalties on local governments and agencies when they fail to prioritize national immigration law over more local concerns may lead to labor exploitation where immigrant communities do not feel able to report unfair pay practices or unsafe working conditions to civil authorities; to human trafficking where people feel trapped and unable to go to the police for help; to unjust discrimination where the penalties for missing someone with a detainer order are so extreme that oppressive measures seem preferable; and to the ability of law enforcement to deal with crime, because immigrants who are witnesses to crimes or themselves victims, may fear cooperation with the police because of the threat of deportation or the deportation of loved ones.

I was ordained a priest in our nation's bicentennial year, 1976. That year, the Smithsonian Institution, our national museum, had an exhibit entitled "A Nation of Nations." The exhibit recognized that, since the beginning, the immigrant experience has always been a major part of the American experience. We are all the descendants of immigrants or are immigrants ourselves. We must work together to reform our immigration laws at the national level, to end human trafficking and drug smuggling, to provide adequate security at our borders and to address the basic needs of food, shelter and safety of those who arrive on our doorstep. Trying locally to root out a few strangers in West Virginia is not a productive, proportionate or humane response to these immigration concerns.

When King Herod threatened the life of Jesus Christ, Mary and Joseph became refugees in Egypt. Today we can remember our refugee Lord in our humane and fair treatment of those strangers among us.


