This week we celebrate with our Catholic Schools. This year's theme is, "Faith, Excellence, Service".

According to the "brief history" from our parish directory of 2005, our parish began a school in 1866. Our parish school had a number of starts and stops until 1903 when the Franciscan Sisters of Penance and Christian Charity of Stella Niagara reopened our Catholic school. It was in 1920 that the grade school was built which is now called Seton Hall. In 1927, the property of J. E. Chilton at 1108 Virginia Street was used as the Sacred Heart High School until 1940. In 1941 our new high school building was built and renamed Charleston Catholic High School. Our current Sacred Heart Grade school was built in 1962. The Sacred Heart Early Learning Center was built in 2012. Due to the very gracious generosity of parishioners, past and present, millions of dollars have been spent on enlarging and improving the buildings over the years. These considerable investments have assured that we have been able to provide excellent educational programs. Our teachers and the parents of our students have also greatly invested through their sacrifice in the mission and life of our schools. A number of religious women and men orders have served our schools over the years with great apostolic zeal.

As we celebrate our Catholic Schools this week, let us pray that our schools will continue to be places where faith, excellence and service are taught and experienced.

May those who graduate from our schools leave with an appreciation and deep understanding of our Catholic Faith and know of their lifelong responsibility to serve the needs of the world.

I have heard from many parents who are very grateful for our principals and teachers who have risen to the great challenges placed on them as we continue in the second year of this pandemic. Our students are also doing a great job in keeping safe.

May the Lord continue to bless them in the great work they do.

From our Music Director...

A Joyful Psalm #37: Psalm 71

I find motherhood to be one of the most incredible things to witness in this life – *especially pregnancy*. Renae and I currently have five children. Observing the development of our unborn children has been truly fascinating! At 3 weeks, the first nerve cells, face, mouth, lower jaw, and throat are all developing. At around 4 weeks, the heart beats about 65 times a minute. At 5-8 weeks, arms, legs, fingers, toes, and eyes are forming. At 9-12 weeks, the baby is starting to explore; opening, and closing her fists and mouth. At 13-16 weeks, she is sucking her thumb and making faces. At 17-20 weeks, hair begins to grow. At 21-24 weeks, eyes begin to open, and she begins to hiccup. At 25-28 weeks, hearing is developed, and she now responds to sound, light, and pain.

The readings this weekend recognize God's love for us – even within our mother's womb. The first reading says, "Before I formed you in the womb, I knew you." (Jeremiah 1:4) Similarly, Psalm 71 states, "On you I depend from birth; from my mother's womb you are my strength." (Psalm 71:5-6)

May we ever *sing of the Lord's salvation* and thank Him for the gift of our very lives!

This past year we have helped with the Clay County Food Drive where food is collected in the Thanksgiving and Christmas seasons and also during lent. Other sponsored events include Coats for Kids which helps to give coats to needy students and St. Baldricks Childhood cancer research fund drive works to help eliminate Childhood Cancer, Our local Knights council played a large part in sponsoring a Cross Catholic Food Packing Event which packed over 100,000 meals for needy families, some 10,000 West Virginia Families. We even lend a hand to help decorate the church to Keep Christ in Christmas. We have started to host mini church gatherings such as hot dog socials and hope to do more in the future. PARENT INFORMATION REGARDING TUITION ASSISTANCE 2022-2023 DIOCESAN TUITION ASSISTANCE PROCESS IS OPENING SOON

For the 31st consecutive year, the Diocesan Tuition Assistance Program (TAP) is striving to keep Catholic school education affordable for Catholic families who desire it for their children but who may need some financial assistance to make that dream a reality. Thanks to the ongoing and genuine commitment of The Most Reverend Mark Brennan to the Catholic schools in our Diocese, funds have, once again, been allocated for distribution to Catholic families in need of financial assistance.

Applying for TAP through FACTS is easy and affordable. You are encouraged to apply if your child is already enrolled or has been accepted by one of the Catholic schools in the Diocese of Wheeling-Charleston for the 2022-2023 school year.

Who is eligible? Any Catholic student accepted for the 2022-2023 school year in any Diocesan Catholic school (PK thru grade 12) and who belongs to a parish included on the drop-down list as part of the on-line application is eligible. Determinations are based upon a family's degree of need relative to all other applicants.

How do I apply? Applications are made on-line. Go to www.factsmtg.com, click on "Grant & Aid Assessment" and log in. If you do not have Internet access, contact your school office for assistance.

Cost? The application fee is \$35. The Diocese will pay \$17.50 and families pay the other \$17.50.

Grants: Diocesan grants for Catholic families who have completed their applications and show financial need will receive up to 50% of the child's tuition.

Phase I Deadline In order to receive notification in late May, applications (including all required documentation and payment of the fee) are to be received by FACTS by April 29, 2022. Phase I is intended for families with children currently enrolled or already accepted for the 2022-2023 school year in any Catholic school in the Diocese of Wheeling-Charleston.

Phase II Deadline: In order to receive notification in early September, all applications for 2022-2023 (including all required documentation and payment of the fee) MUST be RECEIVED by FACTS no later than August 31, 2022. This is a firm deadline. Phase II is intended for families new to the school or who have had a life-changing event (i.e. birth, death, loss of job, major illness). If an application was submitted during Phase I, please contact the school. Please do NOT submit a second application.

Note 1: No assistance will be available from the Diocese or from any school unless: an application is completed in full (ALL questions answered) and submitted all required documentation is provided, AND the family portion (\$17.50) of the application fee is paid by the deadline.

Note 2: ONLY ONE APPLICATION PER FAMILY should be submitted per school year. If you made an error or had a life event change, please do NOT submit a second application. Contact your principal and your application can be updated by FACTS.




