Our parish school had a number of starts and stops until 1903 when the Franciscan Sisters of Penance and Christian Charity of Stella Niagara reopened our Catholic school. It was in 1920 that the grade school was built which is now called Seton Hall. In 1927, the property of J. E. Chilton at 1108 Virginia Street was used as the Sacred Heart High School until 1940. In 1941 our new high school building was built and renamed Charleston Catholic High School. Our current Sacred Heart Grade school was built in 1962. The Sacred Heart Early Learning Center was built in 2012. Due to the very gracious generosity of parishioners, past and present, millions of dollars have been spent on enlarging and improving the buildings over the years. These considerable investments have assured that we have been able to provide excellent educational programs. Our teachers and the parents of our students have also greatly invested through their sacrifice in the mission and life of our schools. A number of religious women and men orders have served our schools over the years with great apostolic zeal.

As we celebrate our Catholic Schools this week, let us pray that our schools will continue to be places where faith, excellence and service are taught and experienced.

May those who graduate from our schools leave with an appreciation and deep understanding of our Catholic Faith and know of their lifelong responsibility to serve the needs of the world.

I have heard from many parents who are very grateful for our principals and teachers who have risen to the great challenges placed on them because of the pandemic. Our students are also doing a great job in keeping safe.

May the Lord continue to bless them in the great work they do.

PARENT INFORMATION REGARDING DIOCESAN 2021-22 TUITION ASSISTANCE

Parents can apply for the Diocesan Tuition Assistance Program (TAP) through FACTS. The 2021-2022 Diocesan Tuition Assistance process is open. You are encouraged to apply if your child is already enrolled or has been accepted by one of the Catholic schools in the Diocese of Wheeling-Charleston for the 2021-2022 school year.

Who is eligible? Any Catholic student accepted for the 2021-2022 school year in any Diocesan Catholic school (PK thru grade 12) and who belongs to a parish included on the drop-down list as part of the on-line application is eligible. Determinations are based upon a family's degree of need relative to all other applicants.

How do I apply? Applications are made on-line. Go to www.factsmgt.com, click on "Grant & Aid Assessment" and log in. If you do not have Internet access, contact your school office for assistance.

Cost? The application fee is \$35. The Diocese will pay \$17.50 and families pay the other \$17.50.

Grants: Diocesan grants for Catholic families who have completed their applications and show financial need will receive up to 50% of the child's tuition.

Phase I Deadline-April 30, 2021 In order to receive notification in late May, applications (including all required documentation and payment of the fee) are to be received by FACTS by April 30, 2021. Phase I is intended for families with children currently enrolled or already accepted for the 2021-2022 school year in any Catholic school in the Diocese of Wheeling-Charleston.

Phase II Deadline-August 14, 2021 In order to receive notification in early September, applications (including all required documentation and payment of the fee) must be received by FACTS by August 14, 2021. Phase II is intended for families new to the school or who have had a life-changing event (i.e. birth, death, loss of job, major illness).

Note: No assistance will be available from the Diocese or from any school unless: 1. an application is completed in full (ALL questions answered) and submitted; 2. all required documentation is provided, and 3. the family portion (\$17.50) of the application fee is paid by the deadline.

ONLY ONE APPLICATION PER FAMILY should be submitted per school year. If you made an error or had a life event change, please do NOT submit a second application. Contact the parish office and your application can be updated by FACTS.

The Presentation of the Lord February 2, 2021

"We too are called to welcome Jesus who comes to meet us. To encounter him: the God of life is to be encountered every day of our lives; not now and then, but every day. To follow Jesus is not a decision taken once and for all, it is a daily choice."

The Presentation of Jesus in the temple shows him to be the firstborn Son who belongs to the Lord. With Simeon and Anna, all Israel awaits its encounter with the Savior—the name given to this event in the Byzantine tradition. Jesus is recognized as the long-expected Messiah, the "light of the nations" and the "glory of Israel," but also "a sign that is spoken against." The sword of sorrow predicted for Mary announces Christ's perfect and unique oblation on the cross that will impart the salvation of God has "prepared in the presence of all peoples" (CCC, no. 529).

World Day for Consecrated Life will be celebrated in the Church on Tuesday, February 2, 2021 and in parishes on the weekend of February 6-7, 2021. Please pray for all those who have made commitments in the consecrated life, and be sure to thank them on their special day!



4th Sunday in Ordinary Time Cycle B 2000 (Msgr Sadie)

We believers had become accustomed to listening to the familiar voices of the Old Testament prophets: Amos, Isaiah, Hosea, Ezekiel, Jeremiah and others. But what did it mean to be a prophet in Israel? How did God make use of prophets to work out the divine story of Salvation? What were prophets supposed to be, to do?

Not primarily, as many think, to make predictions, to tell people what would happen in days or years to come. Rather, the prophets were inspired by God to speak in God's name. In the presence of the people, prophets took the part of God; in the presence of God, they took the part of the people.

First, the prophets were extraordinarily sensitive to evil and injustice. Rabbi Abraham Heschel describes it thus: "To us, a simple act of injustice, cheating in business, exploitation of the poor-is slight; to the prophet, it is a disaster. To us, injustice is injurious to the welfare of the people; to the prophets, it is a deathblow to existence; to us, an episode; to them, a catastrophe, a threat to the world."

Consequently, and secondly, the prophets feel fiercely. In their voice, God rages. They rarely sing, they castigate; their words shock, not edify.

Thirdly, the prophets challenge sacred institutions, sacred beliefs, sacred persons. They cry out that the temple will not save the people, only good and just deeds will. The sacrifices of priests and people are not acceptable as long as the priests and people are not faithful. Ezekiel even denounces the kings anointed to shepherd Israel: "The weak you have not strengthened, the sick you have not healed, the crippled you have not bound up, the strayed you have not brought back, the lost you have not sought, but with force and harshness, you have ruled them."

Fourthly, the Hebrew Prophet is embarrassed, lonely, and frustrated: embarrassed - because he threatens destruction while others predict peace and prosperity; lonely - because he alienates all, the wicked and the pious, cynics and believers, princes and priests; frustrated - because he speaks, and no one listens.

Fifthly, the prophets' words are charged with divine power because they have experienced a God involved in human history, a loving and compassionate God who is disappointed, indignant, angry with His people.

But my friends in Christ, these holy men of the Old Testament are not the only prophets. Nor did prophetic communication cease with the death of the last Scriptural prophet. For those who have ears to listen and the openness-of-heart to understand, there have been, there are, there always will be voices to speak the Word of the Lord that commands our attention, that challenges our individual and our collective consciences.

When Abraham Lincoln, in 1863, proclaimed the freedom of the slaves in the United States, his voice was the voice of a prophet. When his contemporary, Susan B. Anthony, pioneered the suffrage movement that eventually led to the passage of the 19th amendment, (1920) and gave women the right to vote, hers was the voice of a prophet.

When Pope Leo the XIII delivered his encyclical "On the Condition of the Working Man" and called upon Christians to change unjust labor laws and practices, his voice was the voice of a prophet.

When Cardinal Leo-Josef Suenens of Belgium, at the end of the first session of Vatican II, urged the bishops to examine and address the Church's relationship to and responsibility for the world at large, his voice was the voice of a prophet.

Rachel Carson, author of "Silent Spring," was prophetic in making the world aware of environmental pollution.

When Anglican Archbishop Desmond Tutu drew the world's attention to the dangers and injustices of apartheid, his voice was the voice of a prophet; so also, the voices of Dorothy Day, Mother Teresa, Mahatma Gandhi, Martin Luther King, Teilhard de Chardin, the Latin American bishops who affirmed the church as "an instrument of liberation, an agent of social justice, and a defender of the poor and the oppressed."

All of these prophetic men and women understood and taught us that prophecy is not necessarily concerned with the unknowable future but with the present. They did not believe that voices of prophets speak only to matters of "sacred" or "religious" significance. On the contrary, prophets are to bring the reality of the sacred into every sphere of human life, penetrating and redeeming the secular by the very Word of God they have been sent to speak.

The Second Vatican Council reaffirmed the age-old teaching of the Catholic Church that you and I, through Baptism, share in the prophetic office of Jesus Christ. We hear it at every Baptism: "God, the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, has freed you from sin, given you a new birth by water and the Holy Spirit, and welcomed you into His Holy people. He now anoints you with the chrism of salvation. As Christ was anointed Priest, Prophet and King, so may you live always as a member of His Body, sharing everlasting life."

My friends in Christ, today you and I are challenged to listen, not only to the prophetic messages of Moses, Paul, Mark, and Jesus, but also to the prophetic voices of prophets among us. And not only to listen, but to let their prophetic messages penetrate our consciences and claim us for God and those beloved of God who need our love, compassion, concern and service.

Grace beckons us to exercise the ministry of prophecy for people today in our words, our works, our manner of living. As I speak on the continuing need for contemporary prophets, let me close with the disconcerting reflection of a perceptive woman; author Alice L Camille writes: "Prophets make lovely additions to the Bible, but you certainly don't want one in your neighborhood. No sir! Prophets wreak havoc on the status quo,, but still we like to have a few prophets around somewhat marginalized and carefully controlled... but if they get out of line and become really dangerous to the system as-it-stands, never fear... They will probably be assassinated.... prophets don't have very long careers and they have no insurance, only the power of oracle and God's eternal promise." God bless you.

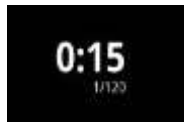
