MSGR SADIE "STAY-AT-HOME" REFLECTIONS #2

• Thess 5:16-17 "Semper gaudete. Sine intermissione orate."

Five weeks in the hospital, six eye surgeries, several CT scans, a few MRI's, four penetrations of my esophagus with camera or medical devices, and stay-at-home recommendations have led me to appreciate better the instructions of St. Paul to the Thessalonians: "Rejoice always. Pray without ceasing."

I have learned to pray while getting dressed, preparing my meals, taking my daily walks, doing my private physical therapy, washing my hands (one Our Father and one Hail Mary), before and after meals, before naps in my lounge chair, waiting to fall asleep. I spoke person-to-person to God, the Father, Jesus, His Son, Mary. the Son's mother, various saints, deceased parents, brother and friends. I rely a lot on memorized prayers: Our Father, Hail Mary, Angelus, Come Holy Spirit, Act of Contrition, Hail Holy Queen, "Memorare." More and more I realize how I have been blessed. "On the importance of prayer, St. Jane Frances is credited with saying: 'Enter into your prayer by faith, remain in it in hope and do not abandon it except for that charity which serves and endures.' As we endure personal and collective struggles, we can look to Scriptures and examples like St. Frances to help us remain prayerful and hopeful during times of uncertainty." Ms. Jamie L. Waters

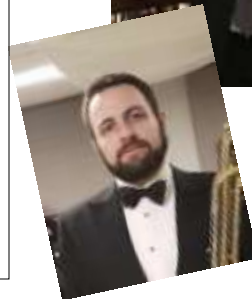

Notice to Sacred Heart Parishioners and Guests: Sacred Heart is performing a high touch point cleaning in the church, gathering space and restrooms between each Mass. Under Pope Francis's *Vos estis lux mundi* and the Directives of the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops, the following forms of misconduct by bishops should be reported using this dedicated reporting system: 1) forcing someone, by violence or threat or through abuse of authority, to perform or submit to sexual acts; 2) performing sexual acts with a minor or a vulnerable person; 3) the production, exhibition, possession or distribution, including by electronic means, of child pornography, as well as by the recruitment of or inducement of a minor or a vulnerable person to participate in pornographic exhibitions; and 4) actions or omissions intended to interfere with or avoid civil investigations or canonical investigations, whether administrative or penal, against a cleric or a religious regarding the misconduct referred to in 1-3 above.

The Diocese of Wheeling-Charleston encourages reporting to civil authorities first and foremost if a crime has been committed. We also encourage utilizing www.reportbishopabuse.org to report. If you have reason to believe that a bishop has engaged in sexual misconduct or has interfered with an investigation into sexual misconduct, please contact civil authorities in the applicable jurisdiction and visit www.reportbishopabuse.org.

Statement from Most Reverend Mark E. Brennan, Bishop of the Diocese of Wheeling-Charleston

Monday, June 1, 2020

Let Us Unite in Prayer for Peace

The killing of George Floyd was an egregious act of violence with no justification whatsoever, all the worse for having been perpetrated by some police officers who are sworn to serve and protect their fellow citizens. Most law enforcement officials are decent men and women who train hard to restrain any violent impulses and to be respectful as they deal with the public. Mr. Floyd did not meet that kind of police officer the day he was killed.

I join other Americans in prayer for Mr. Floyd, his family and friends and for the African American community of Minneapolis and throughout our country. Every human being is made in God's image and likeness and deserves respect and fair treatment. The protests taking place in many US cities reflect the anger and frustration of millions of Americans who, to this day, experience racism in their daily lives. If I find abhorrent the resurgence of the ugly language, violence and racial discrimination I witnessed as a child, with how much more right do African Americans react against it! We American bishops addressed the issue of enduring racism in our society in our Pastoral Letter, *Open Wide Our Hearts*, in November, 2018 (usccb.org website). I urge you to read it.

The justified protests currently underway must not be tainted by those who wish to spread violence or ruin the livelihoods of their neighbors. Such acts do not advance the cause of racial equality and respect for the human dignity of all. Pope St. Paul VI said, "If you want peace, work for justice." Injuries to persons and destruction of property are not the work of justice and will not bring peace.

Let us honor George Floyd and others who have died in similar incidents by working for true justice and an America in which, as Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., said, a person is "judged not by the color of his skin but by the content of his character."

Dear Parishioners,

Greetings in the Lord!

Last Sunday, it was with great happiness we welcomed thirteen people into the Catholic Church. They waited an extra fifty days to be received into the Lord's Church. Please pray for them as they take their place among our faith community. This weekend as we celebrate the Feast of the Holy Trinity, a very warm welcome to Mark Haas, our new Music Director. We look forward to Mark's ministry of music. Please check out his announcement in this bulletin.

We returned to our Sacred Home two weeks ago. I am very grateful for the work of our parish staff. I am also very grateful to our property manager, John Blake and his staff who worked hard on getting everything in place for our careful and safe return. Many thanks also to our ushers who work very well in assisting you with our new procedures. Please be aware of the following:

REVISED MASS SCHEDULE

Our Sunday Mass times will be as follows until further notice,

Saturday Vigil 5:30pm

Sunday 8am, 10am and 12 Noon

We will not have the 5pm Sunday Mass until further notice.

Our weekday Mass will be at 12pm. There will be only one daily Mass, Monday through Friday. There will be no Saturday morning Mass until further notice.

DISPENSATION STILL IN PLACE

Bishop Brennan has continued the dispensation from the obligation to attend Mass until further notice. Persons who are ill and those more susceptible to infection, the elderly, or those already in frail health, are urged to remain at home and participate in televised or online Mass. Anyone who fears being infected by attending Mass should stay home. I fully understand if you have concerns regarding returning for a Sunday Mass, perhaps consider a weekday Mass

WHAT TO EXPECT AT MASS

Social distancing will be required at Mass. Those who live in the same household may sit together; otherwise, there must be six feet of separation between persons. Everyone will be required to wear a mask during Mass, except in the moment of receiving Holy Communion. You are asked to bring your own mask. We will have some available if you forget to bring one. Some common practices will be omitted: the use of hymnals-we will provide a one-use worship aid, holding hands during the Our Father, the Sign of Peace, and the offering of the Precious Blood. The Church will be opened 20 minutes before

Mass. You are to use the main entrance of the Basilica on Leon Sullivan Way. You will be greeted by an usher, making sure you use the provided hand sanitizer and are wearing a mask. An usher will escort you to your reserved pew. You are asked not to gather anywhere else in the Church. The usher will release your pew for Communion, as you come up for Communion, you may place your offering in the baskets located in the first pews. The ushers will release your pew to leave at the end of Mass. You may leave the Church by any exit while maintaining social distance guidelines.

SANITIZATION

Our pews, floors, doors and restrooms will be sanitized before the first Mass and after the last Mass. If you use the restroom, you will be asked to wipe any surface you have touched with wipes that we will provide.

RESERVING A TIME FOR MASS

According to the health guidelines, we have a limit of 75 people allowed in our Basilica for each Mass. We require that you reserve a pew. We have pews for families, couples, and singles. Please contact Angie Hodges at ahodges@shccwv.us or 304-342-8175 by Noon on Fridays to reserve a time for a Sunday Mass. You may reserve for a weekday Mass but it is not required.

OPENING AND CLOSING OF THE BASILICA

Our Church door will open 20 minutes before the Mass is set to begin. After Mass ends, the doors will be locked to allow enough time to sanitize before the next Mass. This schedule will be in place for all Sunday and weekday Masses.

We have started using Flocknote, which is an information platform. We can send you timely information by way of email or a text. Please contact Angie Hodges at ahodges@shccwv.us or 304-342-8175 to update your contact information such as your email or cell phone number.

I know this will be very different and challenging for all of us. I ask for your prayers, patience, understanding and cooperation. We will adapt if and when the need warrants.

If you have any questions, please contact our parish office or you may call me on my cell.

Let us continue to pray for each other in these difficult times. Pray for an end to the violence and rioting that is happening across our nation. May we listen to one another and that justice, harmony and peace be restored .

Mount Olivet Mausoleum Mount Olivet Catholic Cemetery, Charleston, WV

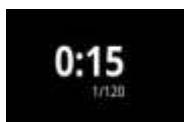
