From our music director...

A Joyful Psalm #67: Psalm 121

Sometimes at Mass we can feel like mere observers. Sometimes we can feel like a member of the audience. Sort of like a football game: You sit in the bleachers; you grab a beverage; you observe the players on the playing field. In fact, the Church teaches that *we are all on the playing field*. It's not merely the priest alone celebrating Mass. By nature of our baptism, we are adopted into a kingdom of priests, and we are all present to offer the one sacrifice. We are there to *assist* at Mass.

This assistance is visible throughout the ancient liturgical life of the Church. In the Extraordinary form of the Mass (the Latin Mass), there is a beautiful moment when the deacon or altar server raises the priest's chasuble slightly as he elevates the Host and Chalice. This solemn gesture comes directly from this weekend's First Reading. Aaron and Hur were assisting Moses during the battle against Amalek: "As long as Moses kept his hands raised up, Israel had the better of the fight... Moses' hands, however, grew tired... Aaron and Hur supported his hands, and Joshua mowed down Amalek and his people with the edge of the sword." (Ex 17:8-13)

When we assemble for Mass, we assist the priest, who offers the one true sacrifice of Christ on our behalf. Then, we can mow down Satan and his armies. In return, our help then comes from the Lord, who made heaven and earth. (Psalm 121)



In 1673, Jesus appeared to Margaret Mary and revealed that His heart was to be a symbol of His divine-human love. The form of devotion revealed to Margaret Mary includes First Friday devotions, Holy Hour Adoration, and celebration of the Feast of the Sacred Heart. Jesus’s Sacred Heart represents His infinite love for us.



Special Collection for Hurricane Ian Relief

In the aftermath of Hurricane Ian, which devastated areas across Florida and other parts of the southeastern US, recovery and cleanup efforts continue. Many lives have been lost and thousands of homes, business, and Church properties have been damaged or destroyed.

Throughout the region, Catholic Charities USA (CCUSA), Catholic Relief Services (CRS), in conjunction with other agencies, are already hard at work providing humanitarian aid. Items like food, water, sanitation assistance and clean-up services are already being provided and the agencies will remain in the area to support repair and rebuild efforts in communities.

To support the efforts of these organizations, Most Rev. Mark Brennan, Bishop of the Diocese of Wheeling-Charleston, has approved a special collection to be held the weekend of October 29-30, 2022. 


