

The Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ,

On the last Sunday of the liturgical year, the Church celebrates the Solemnity of Christ the King. The feast was instituted by Pope Pius XI with the encyclical *Quas primas*. The Holy Father speaks directly to the problem of “anticlericalism,” which seeks to extirpate Christian influence from political life. We see a version of anti-clericalism today, for example, when it is suggested that belief in Catholic teachings renders a person unfit for a judicial appointment.

When our nation is beset by civic unrest, racial tension, and a pandemic, we do well to turn to Our Lord, who reigns over every people and nation.

Jesus is the Word of God made flesh, the Incarnate Lord. “The foundation of this power and dignity of Our Lord is rightly indicated by Cyril of Alexandria. ‘Christ,’ he says, ‘has dominion over all creatures, a dominion not seized by violence nor usurped, but his by essence and by nature.’ His kingship is founded upon the ineffable hypostatic union. From this it follows not only that Christ is to be adored by angels and men, but that to him as man angels and men are subject, and must recognize his empire; by reason of the hypostatic union Christ has power over all creatures.” –*Quas primas*, 13

Jesus shares a law of charity to show the way to communion with God. “Not only do the gospels tell us that he made laws, but they present him to us in the act of making them. Those who keep them show their love for their Divine Master, and he promises that they shall remain in his love.” –*Quas primas*, 14

“At the end of our life we will be judged on love, that is, on our concrete commitment to love and serve Jesus in our littlest and neediest brothers and sisters. That mendicant, that needy person who reaches out his hand is Jesus; that sick person whom I must visit is Jesus; that inmate is Jesus, that hungry person is Jesus. Let us consider this.” –Pope Francis

The Church acknowledges the reign of Christ, not only privately, but publicly. “Thus by sermons preached at meetings and in churches, by public adoration of the Blessed Sacrament exposed and by solemn processions, men unite in paying homage to Christ, whom God has given them for their King. It is by a divine inspiration that the people of Christ bring forth Jesus from his silent



SAINT OF THE WEEK -Saint Clement of Rome, Feast Day – November 23

In the revised New American Bible, Clement is listed as the fourth pope, serving 88-97. He is an important witness to the first century of the Catholic Church. Early Christian writers called him a disciple of the apostles, and he may be the Clement mentioned in St. Paul's Letter to the Philippians (4:3). As bishop of Rome, Clement wrote an Epistle to the Corinthians that is believed to be the earliest surviving record of an intervention by Rome in the affairs of a local church. Whatever problems prompted the letter, Clement gently urges the Corinthians to reconcile and accept apostolic tradition. Some legends suggesting his martyrdom are

Christ the King-Cycle A - (Msgr. Sadie)-2011

Christianity is greatly indebted to Judaism. One aspect of Judaism not sufficiently appreciated by Christians is a God ready and able to make commitments to a series of partners, who are thereby empowered to make a difference in the world.

God's first partner is Israel, the chosen people called by God to a relationship through Abraham, Moses and the freed slaves in Egypt.

God, as the origin of all that exists, is also in partnership with creation whose beauties and harmonies reflect the wisdom, care and providence of its creator.

Israel also learned and has taught that God is a partner with each human being made in God's image and blessed to share in God's dominion over the earth.

This partnership is beautifully expressed as Ezekiel describes a shepherd's willingness to see to all the needs of his helpless sheep. Shepherds and sheep share a personal relationship.

The authors of Sacred Scripture used this appealing partnership to describe the relationship between God and Israel nowhere more beautifully, effectively than in Psalm 23. After being anointed by Samuel, the shepherd David did shepherd his people well, and all kings after him were held to the high standards he set.

Eleven times in this brief reading, Ezekiel uses the pronoun "I" to emphasize the personal and devoted care of God. God would partner with the Jewish people as a shepherd partners with his sheep and provides for their food, security, and well-being. Ezekiel underscores the hands-on quality of our Shepherd, Partner, King and Lord.

Gradually, our ancestors in the faith grew in the awareness that God has also chosen to be a partner to all nations. Like Israel, all nations were made by God and are called to glorify God as their Creator, Redeemer, and King, above all other kings.

Even more challenging is God's partnership with humans in Christ Jesus. The Son of God became our partner in the flesh, suffered and died for us, rose to glory and paved the way for us to follow.

Challenging, but more unsettling to our notion of God, is the truth we hear in Matthew's Gospel. There we are reminded that God chooses not only to partner with Israel, with creation, with all the nations, with each human being but, in an incredibly special way, partners with the least ones among us.

Jesus insists that the criteria of our final judgment will be our respect for His partnership with the victims of this world: the hungry, the thirsty, the stranger, the naked, the sick, the imprisoned.

Caring for the needs of these poor ones does not require earth-shattering deeds or headline making activities. Rather, it is simple things ... a cup of cold water, a shared meal, a friendly visit, the gift of clean, warm clothing, the willingness to listen to another and share his or her struggles, hopes and dreams.

These are the actions that make the power of the Resurrection and the glory of our King Jesus present to others. Just simple acts of kindness will identify believers as people who belong to God, as the lack of such acts will make them unrecognizable to Him.

Note: those who hear the Risen Christ say, "depart from me" are not necessarily guilty of dastardly deeds or heinous crimes.

They didn't mistreat the hungry, the thirsty, the sick; they simply did not recognize and honor the partnership they share with God. They did not recognize the face of Jesus in His most distressing disguise, and they did not reach out to meet His needs and ease His plight.

These criteria have remained unchanged for 2000 years and yet the victims of our world, the least ones with whom God chooses to be a partner, with whom Jesus chooses to identify, continue to increase in number, continue to increase in the depth of their suffering.


