## First Sunday of Advent

### God's Justice

God of justice, you surprise us with your choices of the smallest nation to bless the world, a shepherd boy to be their king, and a baby born in a stable to be the King of Kings. Give us a heart like yours that loves the least among us and values them as the greatest. Teach us your justice that will always forgive and bring forth life from death. We make our prayer through Jesus, the long-awaited Messiah, the fulfillment of the promise from all ages. Amen.

Sunday, December 2, 2018-A Season of Waiting

**Today's Readings:** Jeremiah 33:14–16; 1 Thessalonians 3:12—4:2; Luke 21:25–28, 34–36. Many good things require waiting and planning: a wedding celebration, the birth or adoption of a baby, running a marathon. For such events, we enter into a mode in which much attention is focused on the preparation, even while the obligations of our daily life continue.

This kind of preparation is needed to have a good Advent. It may be hard to imagine even more preparation when already there are presents to be bought and wrapped, a tree and lights to be put up, cookies to be baked, and cards to be written. Preparing for Advent is not hard work; it is a work of the heart. There are many ways to prepare our hearts—attending daily **Mass, reading and reflecting on each day's readings, praying Morning and Evening Prayer, praying the Rosary, and meditating in silence for fifteen minutes each day.**

**The work of the heart we choose keeps our eyes fixed on the miracle that in God's plan, he spoke his Word and the Word became flesh and dwelt among us. Jesus is the Word expressed in flesh and blood, to allow us to draw closer to the God of infinite mystery. Jesus gives his very flesh and blood to us—once in history on Calvary, and for all time in the Eucharist.**

**While we await his return, we have good reason to “stand erect and raise [our] heads,” as today's Gospel counsels. We cannot become too fatigued or too anxious to remember that “[our] redemption is at hand.”**

Monday, December 3-St. Francis Xavier, Priest

Prophets know that God's saving work is not just for the Jewish people. Isaiah calls his countrymen to “walk in the light of the Lord,” anticipating the day when “all nations shall stream toward [Jerusalem].” Jesus meets a Roman centurion whose faith amazes him compared to many “children of the kingdom.” As Advent begins, we might ask ourselves whether we, who have had the benefit of hearing the Word of God and receiving sacraments, have weak or strong faith. **Today's Readings:** Isaiah 2:1–5; Psalm 122:1–2, 3–4b, 4cd–5, 6–7, 8–9; Matthew 8:5–11.

Tuesday, December 4-Blessed Are We

Isaiah speaks of a time when the earth will be filled with knowledge of the Lord, and there will be peace among nations and even animals. **These events await the fulfillment of God's plan when Jesus returns in glory. Yet Jesus knows how blessed his disciples are to see him in the flesh and hear his words. When we take the Risen Christ into our body in the Eucharist and listen to the Word, we are blessed with a foretaste of the time when we will know him fully.** **Today's Readings:** Isaiah 11:1–10; Psalm 72:1–2, 7–8, 12–13, 17; Luke 10:21–24.

Wednesday, December 5-Making God Known

For the third day, we hear Isaiah describe a mountain where all will come to know God as he provides rich, plentiful food and destroys death. **In Matthew's Gospel, Jesus feeds more than four thousand people and heals all who are sick. Surely, God is making himself known in their midst! When we prepare food for others or tend them when they are sick, are we aware that we are making God known?** **Today's Readings:** Isaiah 25:6–10a; Psalm 23:1–3a, 3b–4, 5, 6; Matthew 15:29–37.

Thursday, December 6-St. Nicholas

Advent is a good time to evaluate whether our religious practices are built on the rock-solid foundation of Jesus or a lack of trust. Isaiah says that peace will reign when we fully trust God. St. Nicholas, who remains a revered saint 1,800 years after he lived, is remembered for his generosity to the poor and the secrecy of his good deeds. He heard the words of Jesus and acted on them. **Today's Readings:** Isaiah 26:1–6; Psalm 118:1 and 8–9, 19–21, 25–27a; Matthew 7:21, 24–27.

Friday, December 7-St. Ambrose

When Jesus heals two blind men, they tell everyone they know. In the fourth century, St. Ambrose was renowned for both his preaching and his arguments against heresy while bishop of Milan. People loved him best for his first act as bishop: selling all he had and giving to the poor. During this holy season we beg Christ to remove our blindness to our sins, open our lips to tell others about him, and open our hearts to care for the poor among us. **Today's Readings:** Isaiah 29:17–24; Psalm 27:1, 4, 13–14; Matthew 9:27–31.

Saturday, December 8-Immaculate Conception

During Advent, while the whole Church waits with Mary, we ponder her special role in salvation history and celebrate that she, the perfect vessel who would give birth to the Savior, was conceived without sin. The angel who brought her the news called her “favored one.” The Church echoed those words when, in 1854, it proclaimed as doctrine the Immaculate Conception. So widespread was this belief that eight years before the Vatican pronouncement, United States bishops had embraced Mary as America's patroness under the title of the Immaculate Conception. **Today's Readings:** Genesis 3:9–15, 20; Psalm 98:1, 2–3ab, 3cd–4; Ephesians 1:3–6, 11–12; Luke 1:26–38.

## **Priests Credibly Accused of Abuse Against Minors**

WHEELING, W.Va.—The Diocese of Wheeling-Charleston has released the names of clergy who have been credibly accused of sexual abuse of minors as it pertains to the Charter for the Protection of Children and Young People set forth by the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops in 2002 and the diocese's own policy on sexual abuse in place since 1985. The list dates back to approximately 1950, which is the period for which there are reasonably reliable files. More than 2,000 files were reviewed, containing tens of thousands of documents.

The release of the list is part of the Diocese of Wheeling-Charleston's ongoing commitment to transparency in addition to helping aid in the process of reconciliation and healing for the faithful of West Virginia. "We hope the release of this list," said Archbishop William E. Lori, Apostolic Administrator for the Diocese of Wheeling-Charleston, "will be one of many steps taken to restore trust with parishioners and the broader community in West Virginia. We hope people see the release of this list as a sign of good faith that the diocese is committed to transparency, accountability and to providing a safe environment for children and adults. As we continue to pray for all victims of sexual abuse, let us also recommit ourselves to do everything we can to ensure the protection of all who are entrusted to our care."

The list includes the names of credibly accused clergy from the Diocese of Wheeling-Charleston and credibly accused priests from other regions or Dioceses who have served within the Diocese of Wheeling-Charleston, but for which no claims have been filed in the Diocese of Wheeling-Charleston.

A "credible" accusation means there is reasonable cause to believe that an offense has occurred considering all factors—time, place, age of the parties, background and history available, personnel files, and any other pertinent facts. The list does not include those cases where an accusation was not credible—meaning an accusation which, after review by law enforcement and/or other civil, lay, and church officials, was not supported by evidence or there is no reasonable probability that the accused committed sexual abuse of a child.

The released list does not differentiate between criminal or non-criminal misconduct committed by priests of the Diocese of Wheeling-Charleston, rather it refers specifically to violations of the Charter for the Protection of Children and Young People. Some of the claims do not involve criminal conduct as determined by public authorities or do not involve actual physical contact with the victims, such as soliciting, nonetheless, they are considered violations of the Charter. The list does not purport to address matters that might involve immorality or illegality that were not sex abuse cases involving minors, that is those under age 18.

The list was developed with the assistance of outside counsel and was reviewed by the Diocesan Lay Review Board, to include an in-depth examination of the facts and documentation for each case. The board is comprised of lay members with an array of professional experience, including child and adolescent health care, the treatment of abuse survivors, and human resources. Board members volunteer and function independently of the Diocese.

Although this list is exhaustive and comprehensive as it relates to the Charter at this time and in its present form, the Diocese reserves the right to update the list should more information become available as time goes on.

"This list undoubtedly reveals the failings of the Diocese of Wheeling-Charleston to fully protect young people within the Church," Archbishop Lori said. "Rightly, many have a cause for anger and pain. I offer my sincerest apologies to all victims of sexual abuse and vow to strive to take proper action to ensure the safety of children and others in our care."

The Diocese of Wheeling-Charleston remains committed to the protection of children and young people. A hotline has been created to aid anyone who wishes to report cases of sexual abuse by clergy, staff or volunteers in the Diocese. We encourage anyone who may be a victim of any abuse by any member of the Church to contact your local civil authorities and the Office of Safe Environment for the Diocese of Wheeling-Charleston by calling a newly set-up Sexual Abuse Hotline at 1-833-230-5656. All calls to the hotline will be answered by staff members equipped to properly document details of abuse and direct callers to victim's assistance if required.

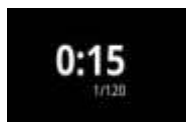
