Second Sunday of Advent

Ready to Forgive

Father of mercy, you give us prophets who call us back to you by proclaiming your mercy and loving kindness. You give us John the Baptist, a prophet to bridge the old and new covenants with a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins. Give us strength in our weak moments, lift us up when we fall, and always reassure us that you are ready to forgive every time we leave behind what separates us from you, and turn back to you. Through Christ our Lord. Amen.

Sunday, December 9, 2018-The Salvation of Our God

Today's Readings: Baruch 5:1-9; Psalm 126:1-2, 2-3, 4-5, 6; Philipians 1:4-6, 8-11; Luke 3:1-6. While kings and priests go about their important work, something is happening in the desert. "The word of God" comes to John, whose birth was surrounded by such marvelous events that people had asked, "What, then, will this child be?" (Luke 1:66). John, the fulfillment of Isaiah's prophecy, is "a voice . . . crying out in the desert." He has an urgent message for the people of his time: to prepare the way of the Lord.

The Word of the Lord comes to us, too, when we take a rest from our work and withdraw to a place of silence. Try to spend ten minutes a day this week in silence, opening your heart to Jesus, making straight his paths by removing resentment, bitterness, vengeful thoughts, anger, greed, envy, and anything else that might block his path. His great desire is to enter our hearts with the healing that he alone can bring.

With the path cleared, Jesus will amaze us with what he can do. He will lower mountains and hills in our life that had seemed insurmountable, straighten winding roads that seem to be leading nowhere, and smooth rough ways that are difficult to navigate. As the love of Christ makes a home in our heart, it will begin to overflow to every person and situation in our life. We will be ready to celebrate Christmas with joy, knowing that it is but a foretaste of the joy we will know when Christ returns "and all flesh shall see the salvation of God."

Monday, December 10-Bringing Others to Jesus

As in today's Gospel, people with disabilities sometimes need friends to bring them to Jesus. Does someone need a ride to Mass? Can all people access our church, sanctuary, religious education, and social spaces? Are children and adults with disabilities invited to participate in religious education and liturgical ministries? We must ask these questions if we are to say that "all are welcome." *Today's Readings: Isaiah 35:1-10; Psalm 85:9ab and 10, 11-12, 13-14; Luke 5:17-26.*

Tuesday, December 11-The Good Shepherd's Love

The metaphor of God as Shepherd and us as his sheep dates to the Old Testament. Isaiah compares God to a shepherd who feeds, carries, and leads his flock. In the New Testament, Jesus calls himself the "Good Shepherd." Today's Gospel has an example of how he is "good": when just one of us goes astray, he leaves the others behind to search for that one. God never forgets about us or gives up on us. *Today's Readings: Isaiah 40:1-11; Psalm 96:1-2, 3 and 10ac, 11-12, 13; Matthew 18:12-14.*

Wednesday, December 12-Our Lady of Guadalupe

Mary, lowly and poor herself, showed concern for the poor when she appeared, with brown skin and wearing indigenous robes, to Juan Diego near Mexico City in 1531. She asked him to build a church in her honor. His bishop disbelieved such a story from this poor indigenous man. Three days later, when she told him to ask again, dozens of red roses dropped from his cloak, and the bishop saw the image of Mary imprinted on it. He built the church! Mary gave hope to Mexico's oppressed people, and to this day she is invoked to intercede for the poor and suffering. *Today's Readings: Zechariah 2:14-17; Judith 13:18bcde, 19; Luke 1:39-47.*

Thursday, December 13-St. Lucy

In the Gospel, Jesus sings the praises of John the Baptist, who will soon be martyred at the hands of Herod. Today the Church honors another martyr, St. Lucy, who died in AD 304 during a Roman persecution of Christians. She is said to have brought food to Christians hiding in the catacombs, wearing a wreath of candles to light her way. Lucy means "light," and we remember her during this season of waiting for the Light of the World. *Today's Readings: Isaiah 41:13-20; Psalm 145:1 and 9, 10-11, 12-13ab; Matthew 11:11-15.*

Friday, December 14-St. John of the Cross

The first psalm is a recipe for a happy and fruitful life: "The law of the Lord is their joy; God's law they study day and night." John of the Cross, in sixteenth-century Spain, was called to a life of prayer in a Carmelite monastery. When other friars turned on him and imprisoned him for nine months, he had encounters with God that he described in mystical poems. He spent those days and nights joyfully with nothing to distract him from the love of the Lord. *Today's Readings: Isaiah 48:17-19; Psalm 1:1-2, 3, 4 and 6; Matthew 11:16-19.*

Saturday, December 15-An End to Wrath

Today we hear about the great prophet Elijah. Taken to heaven in a whirlwind, he is to return as a forerunner of the Messiah: "to put an end to wrath before the day of the Lord." Jesus, who has just been transfigured and appeared with Moses and Elijah, explains that John the Baptist has fulfilled the mission of Elijah. Who will prepare the way for the Messiah's return? Who among us helps to turn hearts toward God and each other? *Today's Readings: Sirach 48:1-4, 9-11; Psalm 80:2ac and 3b, 15-16, 18-19; Matthew 17:9a, 10-13.*

Priests Credibly Accused of Abuse Against Minors

WHEELING, W. Va.—The Diocese of Wheeling-Charleston has released the names of clergy who have been credibly accused of sexual abuse of minors as it pertains to the Charter for the Protection of Children and Young People set forth by the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops in 2002 and the diocese's own policy on sexual abuse in place since 1985. The list dates back to approximately 1950, which is the period for which there are reasonably reliable files. More than 2,000 files were reviewed, containing tens of thousands of documents.

The release of the list is part of the Diocese of Wheeling-Charleston's ongoing commitment to transparency in addition to helping aid in the process of reconciliation and healing for the faithful of West Virginia. "We hope the release of this list," said Archbishop William E. Lori, Apostolic Administrator for the Diocese of Wheeling-Charleston, "will be one of many steps taken to restore trust with parishioners and the broader community in West Virginia. We hope people see the release of this list as a sign of good faith that the diocese is committed to transparency, accountability and to providing a safe environment for children and adults. As we continue to pray for all victims of sexual abuse, let us also recommit ourselves to do everything we can to ensure the protection of all who are entrusted to our care."

The list includes the names of credibly accused clergy from the Diocese of Wheeling-Charleston and credibly accused priests from other regions or Dioceses who have served within the Diocese of Wheeling-Charleston, but for which no claims have been filed in the Diocese of Wheeling-Charleston.

A "credible" accusation means there is reasonable cause to believe that an offense has occurred considering all factors—time, place, age of the parties, background and history available, personnel files, and any other pertinent facts. The list does not include those cases where an accusation was not credible—meaning an accusation which, after review by law enforcement and/or other civil, lay, and church officials, was not supported by evidence or there is no reasonable probability that the accused committed sexual abuse of a child.

The released list does not differentiate between criminal or non-criminal misconduct committed by priests of the Diocese of Wheeling-Charleston, rather it refers specifically to violations of the Charter for the Protection of Children and Young People. Some of the claims do not involve criminal conduct as determined by public authorities or do not involve actual physical contact with the victims, such as soliciting, nonetheless, they are considered violations of the Charter. The list does not purport to address matters that might involve immorality or illegality that were not sex abuse cases involving minors, that is those under age 18.

The list was developed with the assistance of outside counsel and was reviewed by the Diocesan Lay Review Board, to include an in-depth examination of the facts and documentation for each case. The board is comprised of lay members with an array of professional experience, including child and adolescent health care, the treatment of abuse survivors, and human resources. Board members volunteer and function independently of the Diocese.

Although this list is exhaustive and comprehensive as it relates to the Charter at this time and in its present form, the Diocese reserves the right to update the list should more information become available as time goes on.

"This list undoubtedly reveals the failings of the Diocese of Wheeling-Charleston to fully protect young people within the Church," Archbishop Lori said. "Rightly, many have a cause for anger and pain. I offer my sincerest apologies to all victims of sexual abuse and vow to strive to take proper action to ensure the safety of children and others in our care."

The Diocese of Wheeling-Charleston remains committed to the protection of children and young people. A hotline has been created to aid anyone who wishes to report cases of sexual abuse by clergy, staff or volunteers in the Diocese. We encourage anyone who may be a victim of any abuse by any member of the Church to contact your local civil authorities and the Office of Safe Environment for the Diocese of Wheeling-Charleston by calling a newly set-up Sexual Abuse Hotline at 1-833-230-5656. All calls to the hotline will be answered by staff members equipped to properly document details of abuse and direct callers to victim's assistance if required.

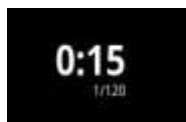
