We begin to celebrate Catholic Schools Week this Monday. According to a "brief history" from our parish directory of 2005, our parish began a school in 1866. Our parish school had a number of starts and stops until 1903 when the Franciscan Sisters of Penance and Christian Charity of Stella Niagara reopened our Catholic school. It was in 1920 that the grade school was built which is now called Seton Hall. In 1927, the property of J. E. Chilton at 1108 Virginia Street was used as the Sacred Heart High School until 1940. In 1941 our new high school building was built and renamed Charleston Catholic High School. Our current Sacred Heart Grade school was built in 1962. The Sacred Heart Early Learning Center was built in 2012. Due to the very gracious generosity of parishioners, past and present, millions of dollars have been spent on enlarging and improving the buildings over the years. These considerable investments have assured that we have been able to provide excellent educational programs. Our teachers and the parents of our students have also greatly invested through their sacrifice in the mission and life of our schools. A number of religious women's and men's orders have served our schools over the years with great apostolic zeal.

As we celebrate our Catholic Schools this week, let us pray that our schools will continue to be places where faith, excellence and service are taught and experienced.

May those who graduate from our schools leave with an appreciation and deep understanding of our Catholic Faith and know of their lifelong responsibility to serve the needs of the world.

I encourage parents to prayerfully consider our Catholic Schools. Please don't allow finances to be the first barrier to the wonderful opportunity of a Catholic education. Please give me a call. Let's talk!

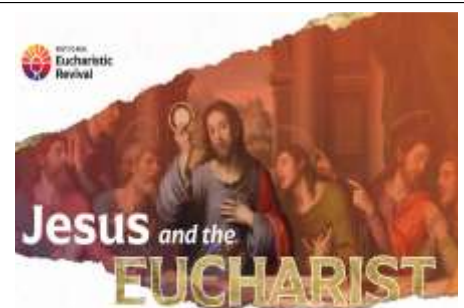
The program begins this Sunday, January 28, and continues for 7 weeks, ending on March 14. Each week, we will provide 3 sessions to cover the material for that week, as follows –

I trust this letter finds you well. On behalf of the entire Risen Lord Food Pantry parishioners, volunteers, and, more importantly, the individuals and families we serve, I wanted to take a moment to express our deepest gratitude for your incredibly generous donation.

Your contribution of \$2,735 (check 1187 on 12/13/2023) and a lot of canned good, food, has made a significant impact on our ability to provide essential support to those in our community facing food insecurity. It is through the kindness and generosity of donors like you that we are able to continue our mission of ensuring that no one goes to bed hungry. We helped 335 families (830 individuals) on Thanksgiving and 324 families on Christmas; monthly we still have more than 300 families and 106 kids weekly.

### **Adoration**

Adoration before the Blessed Sacrament draws the worshipper into spiritual communion with God. Whether done on one's own time or at a scheduled service, adoration of the Eucharistic presence of Christ fosters our devotion for participation in the Mass.

Jesus instituted the Eucharist for our eating and drinking. Sharing communion at Mass brings us nourishment, healing, and sustenance. There is no substitute for participation in the Eucharist; adoration should enhance it, not replace it.

Catholics reserve leftover communion breads in a tabernacle. The primary purpose for this custom is to have the Body of Christ ready for the dying at any time. The tabernacle also provides communion for the sick or those unable to come to Mass. Because it houses the sacramental Body of Christ, it serves as a place for adoration.

Adoration may be private or public. When adoring the Blessed Sacrament in private, Catholics usually go to any church, where the communion hosts are kept inside the tabernacle. They say whatever prayers they wish. In this form of adoration, the doors of the tabernacle may be opened so the ciborium containing the consecrated hosts is visible.

Public adoration may take place in the context of a brief service (traditionally called "Benediction" although that only refers to the blessing that concludes it) or over a more extended period of time. The Blessed Sacrament is usually presented for adoration outside the tabernacle on an altar or a stand. The Order for the Solemn Exposition of the Holy Eucharist is used when the Blessed Sacrament is placed in a monstrance for public adoration and prayer.

Extended periods of adoration used to be common. They filled the void for people who were not receiving communion frequently. However, in the twentieth century, the Church urged people to more frequent communion and has forbidden exposition during Mass. Participation in the Eucharist at Mass accomplishes spiritual communion more perfectly and renders simultaneous adoration unnecessary. Prolonged periods of adoration may happen in church where a large number of the faithful are gathering and when the bishop has given his approval. If Mass is celebrated, the Blessed Sacrament should be returned to the tabernacle.

Whether the Blessed Sacrament is inside or outside the tabernacle, adoration may invite us into prayer and prepare us for the Eucharist.

LGBT and the Church**

**The new rules of the game**

**By reaffirming traditional teaching on marriage, but insisting that same-sex couples are "blessable" rather than "contemptible", Pope Francis has opened a way forward that will allow LGBT Catholics to be listened to on their own terms while maintaining the unity of the Church/by James Alison**

Slowly but quietly – and much more through personal relationships than through official teaching – acts of process and nudges are moving us towards a place where anthropological learning about who we are is becoming non-controversial: that we LGBT people are not defective straight people, and therefore that attempts to categorize who we are and how we live by means of negative deductions from the marital act open to procreation are both wrong and damaging. This is the "synodal" path of process.

It will take time, because changes in relationships, taking place in so many different cultures and at different speeds, cannot be skipped over by imposing new teaching without grave risk of schism. But the movement is clearly in one direction: that of learning that LGBT people are being -truthful when we share what we have learned to be true about ourselves, and that in our path of conversion to becoming sons and daughters of God, grace reaches us starting with who we are, and not in spite of our being who we are.

The recent Synod advanced this process by calling, with huge majorities, for reconsideration of our typical anthropology so as to include what we are learning inductively about being human. To that end the delegates proposed high-level meetings with guarantees of confidentiality so that -frankness can emerge. Meetings at which some among us would be able to speak in the first person as witnesses. For, as is obvious, there can be no real discussion "about us" without us.

Let us remember that there is no major Christian body that has been able to deal with this matter without the threat, or actuality, of schism. Those that have refused to begin to deal with it have had to give up on basic Christianity and ally themselves with violent expressions of "the powers of this world", including criminalization and even executions, in order to maintain a pretend purity that fools only themselves.

First: establish a firmly conservative account of the traditional teaching. Next: stretch almost to breaking point everything permissible under that account.

And this, to my mind, is the genius of *Fiducia Supplicans*, and why it is faithful to Pope Francis' thinking following *Amoris Laetitia* (which the DDF's 2021 *Responsum* manifestly was not): it climbs out of the labyrinth "from above" by using a reflection on blessings to manifest a practical Catholic account of the abundance of grace. Which it then extends in the maximum possible degree: to all of us.

So *Fiducia Supplicans* gives the "rules of the game" by which Catholicity is to be lived in such a way as to keep its unity: the Church is for sinners. All of us live in the mud, and yet all of us are capable of being transformed into diamonds starting from where we are. Leave official teaching where it is, at least for the moment, but never use it to judge others, for that is the way to hell. Meanwhile, learn to perceive people you might have despised as "blessable" rather than "contemptible", and then let God's subtle grace sort out the efficacy of blessing in their – our – lives, and what we can learn from each other about who we really are.

We'll soon see whether Cardinal Víctor Manuel Fernández and his colleagues are up to the task of living out the promise of *Fiducia Supplicans*: will they be even-handed in giving nudges to different parts of the Church? Will they be as strong in weaning African hierarchies from their reluctance to support decriminalization (without which "blessable" rather than "contemptible" has no chance) as they are in slowing Germans down in their path to formal written rites and blessings? There will be many such tests of *Fiducia Supplicans* as an aid to governance in unity over the next years, many opportunities to see this adventure in action as our consciences are enjoined in coming to a shared truthfulness.

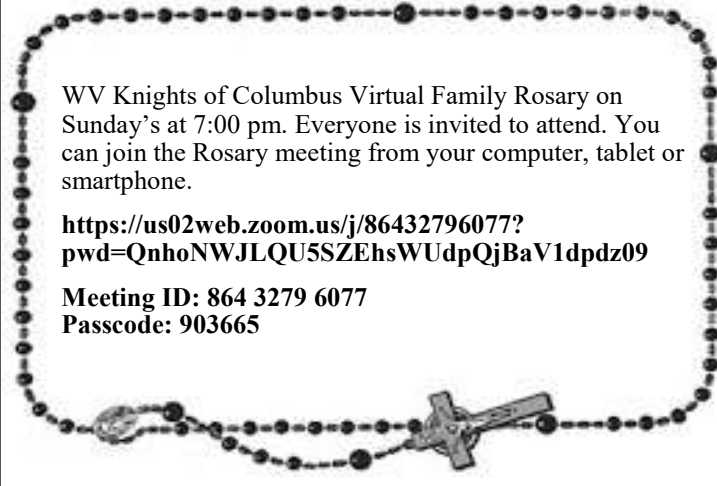
