Greetings on this Sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time!

As announced last week, after consultation with you and our parish pastoral council, our Sunday Mass schedule will change on March 5th. We will be combining the 10am Mass and the 12 noon Mass into one at 10:30am. The rest of the weekend Mass schedule remains in place. I ask for your patience and understanding for this move. An additional benefit for this change will be an extended time for our religious education program (RE) on Sunday. Currently, we have a total of 45 minutes for RE, with this change, an hour can be devoted for instruction.

Fr. Dominic has arrived in Preston Country and settling in for his new assignment. Please pray for him as he begins serving the people of St. Sebastian Parish in Kingwood, St. Zita Mission in Masontown, and St. Edward the Confessor Mission in Terra Alta.

The Hope Scholarship Program is the state of West Virginia's education savings account (ESA) program that will allow parents and families to utilize the state portion of their education funding to tailor an individualized learning experience that works best for their child. The scholarship allows K-12 students to receive financial assistance that can be used for tuition, fees, and other expenses.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION for the 2023-24 academic year!

Beginning on March 1, 2023, the Hope Scholarship board will accept applications for NEW Hope Scholarship students for the 2023-24 academic year. To qualify, a student must be a West Virginia resident and be one of the following: Eligible to be enrolled in kindergarten for the 2023-24 school year. Enrolled full-time in public elementary or secondary school in West Virginia for an entire instructional term of the 2022-23 academic year. Enrolled full-time and attending a public elementary or secondary school in West Virginia for at least 45 consecutive calendar days during the current instructional term at the time of application.

****Do not try to submit an application in the EMA portal or your Notice of Intent to your county board of education for the 2023-24 school year before March 1, 2023. ****

Notices for Current Hope Scholarship Students-Students who were awarded the Hope Scholarship for 2022-23 school year must renew their applications annually to receive the Hope Scholarship. The renewal application period is expected to open up in February 2023. Check back here for more updates.

PARENT INFORMATION REGARDING TUITION ASSISTANCE

2023-2024 DIOCESAN TUITION ASSISTANCE PROCESS OPENS FEBRUARY 1ST 2023

For the 32nd consecutive year, the Diocesan Tuition Assistance Program (**TAP**) is striving to keep Catholic school education affordable for families who desire it for their children but who may need some financial assistance to make that dream a reality. Thanks to the ongoing and genuine commitment of The Most Reverend Mark Brennan to the Catholic schools in our Diocese, funds have, once again, been allocated for distribution to families in need of financial assistance.

Applying for **TAP through FACTS** is easy and affordable. You are encouraged to apply if your child is already enrolled or has been accepted by one of the Catholic schools in the Diocese of Wheeling-Charleston for the 2023-2024 school year.

- **Who is eligible?** Any student accepted for the 2023-2024 school year in any Diocesan Catholic school (PK thru grade 12) is eligible. Determinations are based upon a family's degree of need relative to all other applicants.
- **Phase I: open to Catholic families ONLY**
- **Phase II: open to ALL families**
- **How do I apply?** **Applications are made on-line. Go to www.factsmgt.com, click on "Grant & Aid Assessment" and log in.** If you do not have Internet access, contact your school office for assistance.
- **Cost?** The application fee is \$35. The Diocese will pay \$17.50 and families pay the other \$17.50.
- **Grants:** Diocesan grants for families who have completed their applications and show financial need will receive **up to 50%** of the child's tuition.
- **Phase I Deadline** In order to receive notification in late May, applications (*including all required documentation and payment*) are to be received by **FACTS by April 30, 2023**. Phase I is intended for **Catholic families ONLY** with children currently enrolled or already accepted for the 2023-2024 school year in any Catholic school in the Diocese of Wheeling-Charleston. **Families must belong to a parish included on the drop-down list as part of the on-line application.**

NEW: PLEASE READ

Phase II Deadline In order to receive notification in September, all applications for 2023-2024 (*including all required documentation and payment of the fee*) **MUST** be **RECEIVED** by FACTS no later than **August 31, 2023**. Phase II is now intended for **Catholic and Non-Catholic families**. If an application was submitted during Phase I, please contact the school. *Please do NOT submit a second application.*

Note 1: No assistance will be available from the Diocese or from any school unless:

1. an application is completed in full (ALL questions answered) and submitted
2. all required documentation is provided, **AND**
3. the family portion (\$17.50) of the application fee is paid **by the deadline**.

Note 2: ONLY ONE APPLICATION PER FAMILY should be submitted per school year. If you made an error or had a life event change, please do NOT submit a second application. Contact your principal and your application can be updated by FACTS.

Ash Wednesday Special Collection

On February 6, a 7.8 magnitude earthquake devastated large areas of southern Turkey and northwest Syria. The death toll has surpassed 20,000 and continues to climb. Thousands of people have been injured and many are trapped beneath the rubble. The earthquake is the worst to strike Turkey this century. Within the subsequent 24 hours, the region experienced multiple aftershocks and a second 7.5 magnitude quake.

Across affected areas, apartment buildings and schools have been leveled. Telecommunications are disrupted, preventing families from identifying and accounting for missing loved ones. In Syria, displaced people are seeking shelter in schools and community centers in areas already devastated by years of war. Across southern Turkey, schools are closed, airport transportation is impaired and hospitals have been declared unusable.

Catholic Relief Services is supporting local partners in their efforts to provide urgent relief and assistance for long-term recovery. CRS has partnerships with Caritas Turkey and Caritas Syria, as well as other local partners. To support the efforts of these organizations, Most Rev. Mark Brennan, Bishop of the Diocese of Wheeling-Charleston, has approved a special collection to be held on Ash Wednesday, February 22, 2023, and for collection baskets to remain available for the collection through the first Sunday of Lent. Bishop Brennan appreciates your generosity this past summer to those affected by the severe storms and flooding in Eastern Kentucky and Southern West Virginia. But he feels impelled once again to ask you to do what you can to help those affected by this most recent disaster.

All funds collected in the Diocese of Wheeling-Charleston will be given to Catholic Relief Services with the special designation for use in the Turkey/Syria Earthquake Recovery Effort.

As we hold the victims and first responders in our prayers during these critical days, let us also spend time in prayer and discernment as we prepare for this upcoming collection. Let us come together now to support our brothers and sisters in Christ who are suffering this horrible loss.

Sunday Scriptures at Home

Many people find it helpful to pray over the Sunday Scripture readings at home before going to church. The practice puts them in touch with the Church's prayer, helps them listen as the readings are proclaimed at Mass, prepares them to hear the homily, and engages them personally in the Word of God.

The Sunday readings are available in many publications and online at www.usccb.org. To prepare the readings at home, get a copy of them, or just get the citations and look them up in a Bible. Create some time and space for this prayer. If you do it alone, remove yourself from other activities. Choose a place where you can center yourself. Open the Scriptures and read over them. You might keep a journal and jot down some thoughts that come to you. Ask yourself some questions such as these: "What is going on in this reading? Is something similar happening in my life? What is God saying to me this week?"

If you pray with others, choose a time when everyone is together. You could pray in the living room at the end of the day or around the table before a meal. Someone reads the Scripture aloud. All think about it. Then each shares a few thoughts. Read the passage again. You may choose one or more readings at a time. The exercise can be repeated throughout the week. God's word is able to go as deep inside you as you give it time and room. When you get to church, do not read along while the readings are proclaimed. Lift your head and open your ears and heart to the Word of God.
