Dear Sisters and Brothers in the Lord,

Greetings on this Eighth Sunday in Ordinary Time!

Our Lenten Season begins this Wednesday with the celebration of our Ash Wednesday Masses. Please join us at 8:15am -with the Grade School, 12pm and 5:30pm. The central theme of Pope Francis' Lenten Message is encapsulated in the phrase "Let us journey together in hope," which ties into the broader theme of the Jubilee Year "Pilgrims of Hope". In our Pope's letter, he reflects on conversion and speaks of three dimensions: the importance of journeying, journey together, and journeying with hope.

To help in your journey of Lent, I call to mind a number of events to help us journey as individuals, as a family and parish community. Please make use of the Daily Lenten Reflections in our weekly bulletin along with information about our Adult Formation Program, "No Greater Love", The Charleston Vicariate Lenten Mission hosted by the Diocese and Ascension Parish from March 9-11, and join us in praying the Rosary and Stations of the Cross on Fridays of Lent beginning at 5pm.

Bishop Mark has asked that we take up a second collection this weekend specifically for WV Flood Victims. The Southern part of our Diocese has been effected by generational flooding with loss of life, property, and livelihood. Please check the information in this bulletin on how you can give. Thank you for your generosity.



LENTEN GUIDELINES FOR ALL CATHOLICS

Fasting is to be observed on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday by everyone 18 years and older, who has not yet celebrated their 59th birthday. On a fast day, one full meal is allowed. Two other meals, enough to maintain strength, may be taken, according to each one's needs, but together they should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted, but consuming liquids, including milk and juices, is allowed. Abstinence is observed by everyone 14 years of age or older. On days of abstinence, no meat is allowed. Note that when health or the ability to work is affected, the law does not apply. Ash Wednesday, all the Fridays during Lent, and Good Friday are days of abstinence. If a person is unable to observe the above regulations due to ill health or other serious reasons, other suitable forms of self-denial are encouraged.

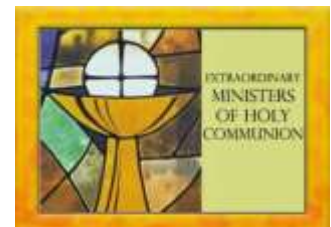

Diocese Announces Disaster Assistance Fund

Thursday, February 20, 2025

WHEELING-Recovery efforts continue across the Mountain State after the severe flooding that occurred earlier this month. Several counties have experienced generational flooding resulting in loss of life, property, and livelihood. More than ten counties in our state remain under a State of Emergency. With many roads just being re-opened, the scope of the devastation is becoming more visible.

Most Rev. Mark Brennan, Bishop of the Diocese of Wheeling-Charleston, has approved a special collection to be held the weekends of February 22-23 and March 1-2 in all parishes and missions throughout the diocese to support recovery efforts related to the series of disasters that have occurred. Checks should be made out to your respective parish with "Disaster Relief" on the memo line. Donations can also be made on the diocesan website at <https://dwc.org/disaster-relief/>.

All of the money collected will remain in West Virginia and will be managed by Catholic Charities West Virginia (CCWVa). Money will be allocated along a four-tier priority list as follows:

1. Parishes in and around the affected area who directly assist families will receive funds to give aid to those in need.
2. CCWVa Regional staff will receive funding for direct, short-term recovery assistance to victims.
3. Partner agencies who work with CCWVa to administer relief to West Virginia residents affected by the flooding.
4. Funds will be given to CCWVa for long-term humanitarian and recovery efforts. This fund assists families long after other organizations have moved out to help families and individuals in the rebuilding process to restore safe, secure, and sanitary living conditions.

To help jumpstart the collection and speed funding to assist West Virginia families, Bishop Brennan, has authorized a challenge grant in the amount of \$50,000 through the West Virginia Catholic Foundation. These funds will be immediately distributed for relief efforts in our state. Bishop Mark hopes the donation will spur others to give generously to help our neighbors in need.

Please remember in prayer all those whose lives have been changed in the wake of these disasters. Let us come together now to support our brothers and sisters in Christ who have been injured and lost their homes, cars, employment, and access to food and water.

Spaghetti Dinner for HOPE this Sunday, March 2nd

Charleston Catholic's HOPE Project will host a Spaghetti Dinner Fundraiser, 5:30-7:30, on Sunday, March 2nd in the CCHS Commons. Tickets are \$15 a plate. Children, age 5 and under, eat for free. Tickets can be purchased ahead of time at the school office or at the door on March 2nd. All of the proceeds from the dinner will go toward the costs for the week-long project in June.

HOPE participants commit to raise \$25,000 so that the Cabwaylingo Appalachian Mission can build a house for a family in need. Students and adult volunteers spend the week repairing homes and helping with the new construction. HOPE has the dual purpose of improving the quality of housing for low income folks in need and instilling the habit of service in students with a commitment to living the works of mercy.

Wednesday, March 5, 2025 - Rend Your Hearts

Today's readings: Joel 2:12–18; Psalm 51:3–4, 5–6ab, 12–13, 14 and 17; 2 Corinthians 5:20–6:2; Matthew 6:1–6, 16–18. In today's first reading, the Lord calls us to return to him with our "whole heart." During Lent, our prayer, fasting, and almsgiving prepares us for the new life in Christ that Easter celebrates. The Lenten season is an opportunity to practice self-discipline to refocus on God. Our prayer, fasting, and charity as we seek conversion allows us to more faithfully follow Jesus.

Aside from abstaining from eating meat on Fridays, self-discipline can be practiced in a number of ways. Some people give up sweets or caffeine during Lent, others attend daily Mass or serve at a soup kitchen. While contemplating a practice that you will work to keep in preparation for Easter, consider asking yourself: What will encourage me to regularly turn to God? How can I give to others, particularly those who may be impoverished in some way? How can I make my sacrifice or dedication a rendering of my current ways to return to the Lord? Our Lenten commitment should challenge us to open our hearts so that we can share our praises to God.

Jesus reminds us that it is important to authentically pray, fast, and give alms. Our Lenten practices are to redirect us to God, not to receive praise from others. As we begin this season, ask God to open your heart and renew a steadfast spirit within you. Turn to God for strength as you prepare to celebrate the resurrection of our Lord at Easter.

This Week at Home-Monday, March 3

St. Katharine Drexel

Today is the Memorial of St. Katharine Drexel, the second person born in the United States to be canonized. St. Katharine, a member of a wealthy family, learned from her parents the importance of serving others and giving from one's abundance. After seeing a need among indigenous and African Americans in her nation, she dedicated her life to serving and educating people in those communities. How can you give from your abundance to a community in need? Today's readings: Sirach 17:20–24; Psalm 32:1–2, 5, 6, 7; Mark 10:17–27.

Tuesday, March 4-St. Casimir

Today, we pray with St. Casimir. Born a prince of Poland in 1461, St. Casimir rebelled against his wealthy upbringing by rejecting a lavish lifestyle and committing himself to Jesus. Despite being rejected by his father for prioritizing loyalty to Jesus instead of to the king, St. Casimir remained steadfast in his prayer and dedication to serving the impoverished. Today, reflect on your loyalties. How can you reorient yourself to serving Jesus? Today's readings: Sirach 35:1–12; Psalm 50:5–6, 7–8, 14 and 23; Mark 10:28–31.

Wednesday, March 5-Be Reconciled to God

St. Paul reminds us that "now is a very acceptable time; . . . now is the day of salvation." Choose daily to return to God through prayer, almsgiving, and fasting. Even if you stumble in keeping your fast or promise this Lent, recommit to returning to God by saying a prayer every evening. Turn to God, for he is "gracious and merciful . . . slow to anger, rich in kindness." Today's readings: Joel 2:12–18; Psalm 51:3–4, 5–6ab, 12–13, 14 and 17; 2 Corinthians 5:20–6:2; Matthew 6:1–6, 16–18.

Thursday, March 6-Choose Life

Today we are reminded of the choice that is always before us: life or death. Just like the Israelites, we must make the daily choice to fast from the things that keep us from the Lord. This evening, reflect on your day. When did you choose to love the Lord, heed his voice, and hold fast to him? How can you choose life and follow Jesus tomorrow? Today's readings: Deuteronomy 30:15–20; Psalm 1:1–2, 3, 4 and 6; Luke 9:22–25.

Friday, March 7-The Fasting That I Wish

The prophet Isaiah calls us to a particular kind of fast today. He reminds us that our return to the Lord requires acts of service. Spend time praying with today's first reading. After praying with the excerpt from Isaiah, sit in silence and ask God how you might serve the oppressed, the hungry, the homeless, and the naked. Make a commitment to respond to this call sometime this week. Today's readings: Isaiah 58:1–9a; Psalm 51:3–4, 5–6ab, 18–19; Matthew 9:14–15.

Saturday, March 8-Teach Me

Set aside time to pray with today's psalm. Familiarize yourself with the excerpt by reading it slowly. Then read it again, paying close attention to a word or phrase that stands out to you. Sit with that word or phrase for a few moments. Read the psalm once more and pause to listen to what God may be saying. Spend a moment in silence, allowing the psalm to sit in your heart. End your prayer with a word of gratitude. Today's readings: Isaiah 58:9b–14; Psalm 86:1–2, 3–4, 5–6; Luke 5:27–32.

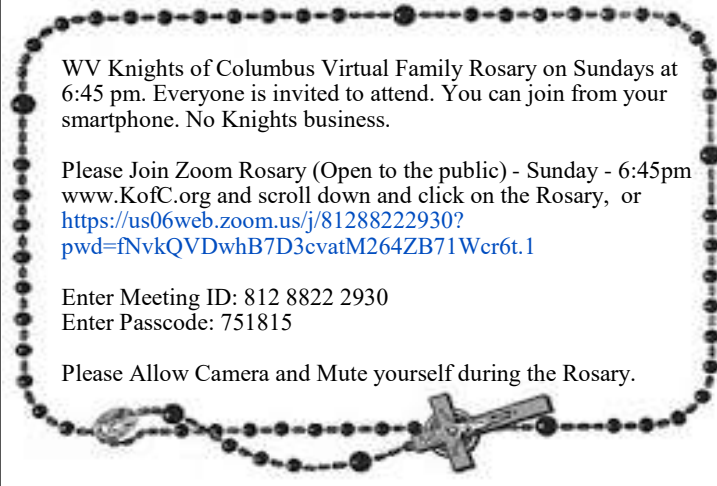
