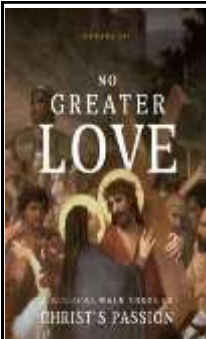
Bringing People to Christ

LENTEN GUIDELINES FOR ALL CATHOLICS

Fasting is to be observed on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday by everyone 18 years and older, who has not yet celebrated their 59th birthday. On a fast day, one full meal is allowed. Two other meals, enough to maintain strength, may be taken, according to each one's needs, but together they should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted, but consuming liquids, including milk and juices, is allowed. Abstinence is observed by everyone 14 years of age or older. On days of abstinence, no meat is allowed. Note that when health or the ability to work is affected, the law does not apply. Ash Wednesday, all the Fridays during Lent, and Good Friday are days of abstinence. If a person is unable to observe the above regulations due to ill health or other serious reasons, other suitable forms of self-denial are encouraged.

A Lenten Reflection from Bishop Brennan

Dear fellow pilgrims in faith,

In just a few days it will be Ash Wednesday, the beginning of the season of Lent which our Church has observed since the early centuries to prepare for the annual commemoration of our Lord's death and resurrection by which we have been saved. This year Lent takes place in what Pope Francis has designated as a Jubilee Year of Hope.

The virtue of hope fits perfectly in the Lenten framework, because this season calls us to turn from our sinful habits and to be renewed in our faith, goals which move us to pray and hope for God's help. With hopeful and trusting hearts, we open our ears in Lent to hear once again Jesus' call: **Repent and believe** the Good News.

Sin is the great barrier between us and God, for He made us to be good, not bad. But, like parents who love the children who sometimes disobey them, our heavenly Father loves us so much that He sent His Son to be the propitiation or satisfaction for our sins so that we might no longer be burdened by them. The forgiveness of our sins which Jesus Christ obtained by his sacrifice on the cross makes us eligible for the grace of a true renewal of our lives on earth and for the ultimate gift of eternal life.

There are people who think that their sins are unforgivable. They give up asking for God's forgiveness because they think He will never forgive them. Some women who have had abortions think this and men, too, who have pushed women to abort or have assisted or acquiesced in an abortion. But abortion is not an unforgivable sin, though a truly evil act it is. My years of counseling post-abortive women and men have convinced me that they can move from remorse and repentance to healing and peace. If you or a loved one is **in that situation, trust that the Lord's words are true: Father, forgive them and I have come that they may have life and have it more abundantly.**

There are other people who are content to live a morally and spiritually mediocre life, instead of wanting to **have the image of God in which they are made glow brightly. What a waste! Don't let Ash Wednesday be a ritual with no meaning. Resolve to look at yourself honestly and ask God's assistance to overcome your sins. A sincere confession of sins is a great help. Then, form a plan to overcome the sins that trouble you the most. The Holy Spirit will enlighten you and a priest or any wise friend might offer good advice. Aided by God's grace, you can become the good and loving person God made you to be. Let the ashes on your forehead symbolize your desire to burn away sin so that new life, like the phoenix of ancient lore, may rise from the ashes.**

This is my hope for you. I pray that it is your hope for yourself. Let us journey together toward Easter, hopeful and every day stronger in faith and love.

Third Sunday of Lent

Patently Cultivating

God our Redeemer, you are merciful and gracious. We often find ourselves grumbling, struggling in our desire of evil things. We are slow to repent, yet your kindness abounds. You tend to us as a patient gardener continues to cultivate and fertilize his tree as he waits for his orchard to bear fruit. Grant that we might remember that you make us holy. Through Christ our Lord. Amen.

Sunday, March 23, 2025-Repent!

Today's readings: Exodus 3:1-8a, 13-15; Psalm 103: 1-2, 3-4, 6-7, 8, 11; 1 Corinthians 10:1-6, 10-12; Luke 13:1-9. Jesus continues to teach on repentance in today's Gospel. He instructs that the Galileans who died at the hands of Pilate and those who died at Siloam are not greater sinners because of their death. Jesus clarifies that their death was not a punishment. If the victims are not greater sinners than those gathered (or any of us), then all must repent and return to the Lord.

Jesus then tells a parable about a gardener. Though many of us are not surrounded by agriculture as were people in Jesus' time, we can still relate to the gardener. Have you ever tended to a plant, a pet, or even cared for a child with a specific hope in mind? Perhaps you hoped your plant would blossom, unlike another plant that did not do so well. You may have hoped that your pet would eat the food set out instead of getting into yet another article of clothing. Or you may have hoped your child would play with the toys you purchased instead of rummaging through the trash again.

It is easy for us to become frustrated or impatient when our hopes are unmet. God, unlike us, meets our continued sinfulness with kindness and compassion. Like the gardener who tirelessly cares for the fig tree, God continues to tend to us. Though grateful for God's abundant grace, we are still called to repent and work to be better. This week, consider how you can actively choose to allow God to cultivate your heart. As we continue our Lenten journey, say yes to God so your heart can blossom.



This Week at Home

Monday, March 24-Being Prophetic

Today we are reminded that responding to the call to Christianity is not easy. Jesus tells the people in the synagogue at Nazareth that "no prophet is accepted in his own native place." We know he will be rejected and crucified for his ministry. We are called to repent, to see God in all things, and to share our faith with others. This week, reach out to someone you love, and ask to share a prayer with him or her. If your invitation is accepted, lead with a simple prayer. If the invitation is declined, lift up the individual in your personal prayer. Today's readings: 2 Kings 5:1-15b; Psalm 42:2, 3; 43:3, 4; Luke 4:24-30.

Tuesday, March 25-Annunciation of the Lord

Understandably, Mary is "greatly troubled" when the angel Gabriel appears. Still, Mary courageously and faithfully responds yes to God's request. Her response is much like the words in today's psalm: "Here I am, Lord; I come to do your will." Set aside time to pray the Rosary. As you pray, ask for the humility to hear God and the courage to respond to God. Today's readings: Isaiah 7:10-14, 8:10; Psalm 40:7-8a, 8b-9, 10, 11; Hebrews 10:4-10; Luke 1:26-38.

Wednesday, March 26-Teach Them

Moses reminds the Israelites to observe and teach the Lord's commandments, to share the goodness of the Lord that they have witnessed with their children and their children's children. Jesus tells his disciples that "whoever obeys and teaches these commandments will be called the greatest in the Kingdom of heaven." Say a prayer in gratitude for someone who taught you about your faith. Consider how you can teach others the way of the Lord with your actions and your words. Today's readings: Deuteronomy 4:1, 5-9; Psalm 147:12-13, 15-16, 19-20; Matthew 5:17-19.

Thursday, March 27-Harden Not Your Hearts

We are reminded not to harden our hearts when we hear God. Jesus powerfully claims that "whoever is not with me is against me, and whoever does not gather with me scatters." Reflect today on your Lenten journey. Have you taken time to listen to God? How have you responded? Commit to an action that will help open your heart to hear God's voice: consider attending daily Mass a few times during the week, praying at a consistent time daily, or journaling with regularity. Today's readings: Jeremiah 7:23-28; Psalm 95:1-2, 6-7, 8-9; Luke 11:14-23.

Friday, March 28-Sinners Stumble

Though we stumble, we are challenged to walk the path of the Lord. Jesus' answers to the query about the greatest commandment guides us in walking the path of the Lord. We are to love God with all our being and, from that, love our neighbor. Before going to sleep tonight, pray the examen. For information on doing so, visit The Daily Examen at IgnatianSpirituality.com. Focus on how you have loved God and your neighbor today and how to resolve to love God and your neighbor tomorrow. Today's readings: Hosea 14:2-10; Psalm 81:6c-8a, 8bc-9, 10-11ab, 14 and 17; Mark 12:28-34.

Saturday, March 29-A Heart Contrite and Humbled

Jesus' parable encourages us to give God "a heart contrite and humbled." The Pharisee, haughty and overly confident in being justified, compares his goodness to the tax collector and shares that he fasts, pays tithes, and keeps the commandments. The tax collector, on the other hand, repents and asks for God's mercy. Acknowledging our sins frees us and gives space for God's mercy. This weekend, offer God "a heart contrite and humbled" by going to confession. Today's readings: Hosea 6:1-6; Psalm 51:3-4, 18-19, 20-21ab; Luke 18:9-14.

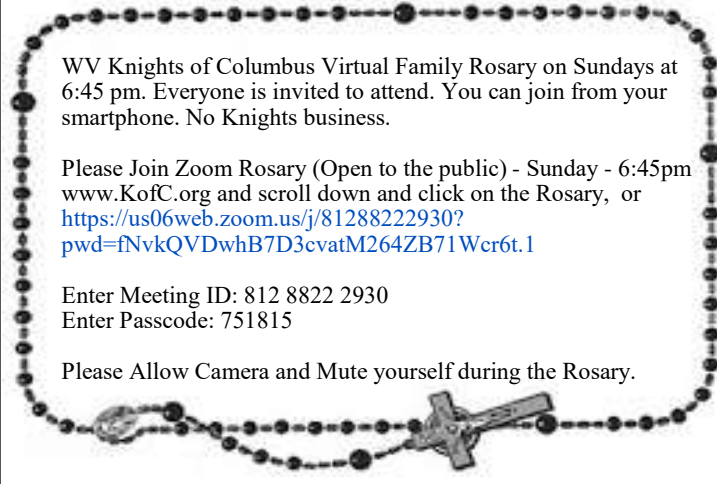

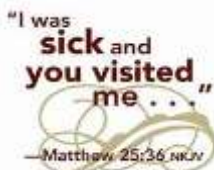
