



# Fr. Sadie's "Cogitationes" 304-546-4330

"Take and eat... take and drink". Communion under the form of bread and of wine is a clearer sign of sharing in the sacrifice that is being celebrated. Mt 26:26-28; Mk 14:22-24; Lk 22:17-19. While the priest celebrant at Mass must receive Communion under both forms, others need not. From the earliest times there were occasions and "grave and just reasons" mentioned by the Council of Trent (Session XXI, Ch.1) why others received Communion only under the form of bread. (1 Cor 11:27) Whosoever eats the bread or drinks the cup of the Lord unworthily will have to answer for the body and blood of the Lord. The Council of Constance, Doctrine of Concomitance: Christ's Body, Blood, Soul, Humanity and Divinity are present under the form of bread and under the form of wine.

### From our music director...

### A Joyful Psalm #84: Psalm 118

It was St. Pope John Paul II who canonized St. Faustina and proclaimed this Sunday, "Divine Mercy Sunday." This weekend is an excellent opportunity to reflect on God's justice and mercy. What is justice? What is mercy? Justice is getting something you deserve. Mercy is getting something you don't deserve. Our God is *all merciful and all just*.

How does God infuse His mercy? Through the Sacrament of Reconciliation (Confession), which Our Lord institutes during the Gospel Reading this weekend: "Jesus said to the apostles, 'Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, so I send you.' And when he had said this, he breathed on them (this had not happened since God breathed life into Adam [Gen. 2:7]) and said to them, 'Receive the Holy Spirit. Whose sins you forgive are forgiven them, and whose sins you retain are retained.'" (Jn 20:19-31)

Psalm 118 praises God's mercy. Three times the psalmist sings of God's mercy: "(1) Let the house of Israel say, 'His mercy endures forever.' (2) Let the house of Aaron say, 'His mercy endures forever.' (3) Let those who fear the LORD say, 'His mercy endures forever.'" (Ps. 118:2-4) In Hebrew, the number three means "all" or "total." This confirms that God forgives *all sins*. If we come to Him in the Sacrament of Reconciliation, there is no sin that God will not forgive. *His love is everlasting*.

I am Fr. Rayappa Kurakula from the Southern part of India. I was born on the 2nd of July in the year 1989. My parents are farmers. I am a semi orphan; I lost my dad due to sickness when I was 9 years old. I have one older sister, she is married and one younger brother. My brother passed away within a year of his birth.

With the help of my parish priest I completed my studies at St. Joseph's High School in Rentachintala. I joined in the seminary for the formation to the Priesthood in the year 2004. I was ordained for the diocese of Guntur on 27th of March in the year 2017. I did my pastoral ministry in different parishes as co-pastor as well as parish pastor and educational institutions in our diocese.

I am happy to be here in West Virginia and work in the Diocese of Wheeling-Charleston, moreover I feel blessed to work in Our Basilica of the Co-Cathedral of the Sacred Heart.

### Easter Octave

Easter Day is eight days long. Easter reigns as the most important feast in the liturgical year. One single day cannot contain it. One entire week cannot contain it. We celebrate Easter for a week and a day. The period is called the Octave of Easter.

Weekday Masses are celebrated "as Solemnities of the Lord" (Universal Norms on the Liturgy Year and the General Roman Calendar, 24). The only difference is that the Creed is not recited and there is no Second Reading. We include the Glory to God in the Introductory Rites. The Easter Sequence may follow the Responsorial Psalm. Each Gospel tells one story of how the Risen Christ appeared to his disciples. Whenever the priest chooses the first Easter Preface or Eucharistic Prayer I, he includes words and phrases that call the weekday "Easter day." The dismissal dialogue at the end of the Mass concludes with two alleluias. The liturgy treats each weekday of the octave as if it were Easter Sunday all over again.

In the early days of the Church, those who were baptized at Easter participated at the cathedral Eucharist every day for a week. Their joy was so full that they kept coming back for more. During this period, the bishop offered them daily catechesis on the sacraments of the church during his homily at the Masses of the Easter Octave.

The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults does not explicitly encourage the newly baptized to participate in the Eucharist during the Easter Octave, but the prayers at Mass still presume that they are there. The Mass prayers assigned to the priest this week make frequent references to these neophytes. The Easter Octave is a sign of the Church's joy. Christ is risen, and we repeat the good news again and again—eight days a week.



Sunday, April 16, 2023 Divine Mercy

Today's readings: Acts 2:42–47; Psalm 118:2–4, 13–15, 22–24; I Peter 1:3–9; John 20:19–31. During the Jubilee Year of 2000, Pope John Paul II canonized Sr. Faustina Kowalska and declared that the universal Church would henceforth observe the Sunday after Easter as the Sunday of Divine Mercy. As we end the Octave of Easter, we are invited to contemplate the mystery of the resurrection in the light of God's infinite mercy. The richness of God's mercy radiates through today's Scriptures and especially in Jesus' compassionate response toward Thomas' unbelief. The gift of mercy is explicitly given when Jesus commissions his disciples as ministers of divine mercy: "He breathed on them and said to them, 'Receive the holy Spirit. Whose sins you

forgive are forgiven them, and whose sins you retain are retained" (John 20:22-23). Through entrusting the first disciples with the gift of forgiving sins, Jesus initiated a waterfall of mercy for all of humanity.

Sr. Faustina repeatedly heard a call to proclaim God's mercy to the world. She promoted the chaplet of divine mercy to raise spiritual awareness of God's mercy. Today, many Catholics will visit shrines devoted to divine mercy and pray the chaplet of divine mercy. Our Church announces to the world that God is merciful and that we are invited to rest in his loving embrace. May our hearts grow more aware of the mercy of God in our lives. In turn, may we actively show mercy to those who need it most.



# THIS WEEK AT HOME

# Monday, April 17

### Follow Acts

A reading from Acts is proclaimed on nearly each day of the Easter season. Written as a continuance of his Gospel account, Luke paints the broad strokes of the Church's development from the resurrection of Jesus to Paul's first imprisonment. Luke emphasizes the powerful role of the Holy Spirit in the formation of the Christian community and the spread of the Word of God. Read Acts through to gain a perspective of how this period unfolded. Today's readings: Acts 4:23-31; Psalm 2:1-3, 4-7a, 7b-9; John 3:1-8.

# Tuesday, April 18

# Everyone Had Enough

The early Christian community laid the groundwork for upholding the common good by placing their treasure in a common purse to be shared fairly across the community. As a result, everyone had enough. Religious communities and some other intentional Christian communities follow this practice to this day. The care for the whole community supersedes the wants of the individual. While this ideal may seem radical to our modern way of thinking, there is much to be learned. How can you more intentionally share from our wealth with the most vulnerable in society? Today's readings: Acts 4:32–37; Psalm 93:1ab, Icd-2, 5; John 3:7b-15.

# Wednesday, April 19

# Walk in the Light

During the Advent season as we await the birth of Christ, the prophet Isaiah announces, "The people who walked in darkness have seen a great light" (Isaiah 9:1). Jesus himself proclaims, "I am the light of the world. Whoever follows me will not walk in darkness, but will have the light of life" (John 8:12). In today's Gospel reading, Jesus equates light with the eternal power of good and dark with the power of evil. As Christians, we are invited to walk in the light, to seek the truth, and to practice goodness. Today's readings: Acts 5:17-26; Psalm 34:2-3, 4-5, 6-7, 8-9; John 3:16-21.

# Thursday, April 20

# Obey God

When confronted by the temple leaders about their bold preaching, Peter and the apostles reply, "We must obey God" (Acts 5:29). The Latin root of the word obey means "listen" or "hear." This is powerful instruction for us today. There are so many loud and competing voices in the world. As Christians, we are charged to listen to the voice of God. Attending carefully to the preaching of the apostles in Acts and the speeches of Jesus in the Gospel of John will strengthen the words of truth in our hearts and help drown out all others. Today's readings: Acts 5:27–33; Psalm 34:2 and 9, 17–18, 19–20; John 3:31–36.

# Friday, April 21

# My Light and My Salvation

Our responsorial psalm for today captures the essence of Easter faith. We keep our eyes glued on the Lord throughout our earthly life with hope that we will rest in the house of the Lord for all of eternity. Carry Psalm 27 in your pocket, tape it on your bathroom mirror, and pray it daily until you have it memorized. It will carve a path to holiness. Today's readings: Acts 5:34–42; Psalm 27:1, 4, 13–14; John 6:1–15.

# Saturday, April 22

# Miracles Abound

We hear of two powerful miracles in today's readings. Acts relates that the number of those in Jerusalem coming to believe in Jesus "increased greatly" (Acts 6:7). John's Gospel recounts how Jesus rejoined the disciples in the boat by walking across the water. Which miracle stirs your heart more: the exponential number of people coming to faith or Jesus walking across the sea? Take it to prayer. Today's readings: Acts 6:1–7; Psalm 33:1–2, 4–5, 18–19; John 6:16–21.


