Fr. Don invites you to join him on a spiritually enriching 12-Day pilgrimage to Catholic Italy October 14-25, 2024.



33 Days to Eucharistic Glory

Are you ready to make a deeper commitment to Christ? Join the 33 Day Consecration to Jesus in the Eucharist!

The program will run from May 1 until June 2, using the book "33 Days to Eucharistic Glory," and will consist of daily readings and weekly discussion groups. Weekly discussions will be held starting April 28, and will be held each week on Sundays at noon in the Gathering Space, Wednesdays at 10:00 am in the Cordis Center, and on Wednesday evenings at 6:30 pm in the Gathering Space. Consecration Day will be on the Feast of Corpus Christi on June 2. Be sure to sign up in the Gathering Space.

Special Collection for West Virginia Flood Relief this Weekend, April 20/21

Efforts continue across the Mountain State after the severe flooding that occurred earlier this month. West Virginia encountered tornados, microbursts, strong winds, heavy rains, and mudslides. Several counties have experienced moderate-to-substantial flooding, notably along the Ohio River and its tributaries. The National Weather Service has confirmed 5 tornadoes in West Virginia – Huntington (Cabell/Wayne), St. Albans (Kanawha), Cross Lanes (Kanawha), Quick (Kanawha) and Lavista (Fayette). A State of Emergency has been declared in 17 West Virginia Counties.

Most Rev. Mark Brennan, Bishop of the Diocese of Wheeling-Charleston, has approved a special collection to be held the weekend of April 20-21, 2024, in all parishes and missions throughout the diocese to support recovery efforts related to the series of disasters that have occurred. Checks should be made out to your respective parish with “Disaster Relief” on the memo line. Donations can also be made on the diocesan website at <https://dwc.org/disaster-relief/>.

Proceeds from this collection will support the long-term humanitarian and recovery efforts of Catholic Charities West Virginia. Their offices assist families long after other organizations have moved out. The role of Catholic Charities will last months and years as they help families and individuals in the rebuilding process to restore safe, secure, and sanitary living conditions. All of the money raised will stay in West Virginia to assist our neighbors.

Please remember in prayer all those whose lives have been changed in the wake of these disasters. Let us come together now to support our brothers and sisters in Christ who have been injured and lost their homes, cars, employment, and access to food and water.

Diocese Names New Superintendent of Catholic Schools

Most Rev. Mark Brennan, Bishop of the Diocese of Wheeling-Charleston, announced today that Jennifer Hornyak has been named superintendent of Catholic Schools for the Diocese of Wheeling-Charleston.

Hornyak has served as interim superintendent of Catholic Schools since July 1, 2023. She has been a part of the Department of Catholic Schools in the diocese for nearly 23 years. Hornyak served as the Associate Superintendent in the Diocese of Wheeling-Charleston for seven years. Prior to her role of associate superintendent, she served as the Director of Educational Technology. During her time at the diocese, Hornyak has worked with teachers and principals in many areas including educational technology, professional development, data analysis of assessment data, and school improvement. In addition to her work at the diocese, Jennifer is an adjunct instructor in the Educational Department at Wheeling University where she has taught both online and in-person education classes over the past ten years.

"I am pleased to appoint Jennifer Hornyak as superintendent of our Catholic Schools," Bishop Brennan said. "Since being named interim superintendent, she has shown a great love not only for our students, but also for the staff and administration of our schools. She has shown a great commitment to our Catholic identity and has worked very hard to create a nurturing environment where students can learn and grow in love of Christ."

Hornyak has earned two undergraduate degrees from Wheeling (Jesus) University and a master's degree in educational technology from Boise State University. She also earned a graduate certificate in School Technology Coordination from Boise State University. In addition, she has earned a Certificate in Catholic School Management from Villanova University.

"I am truly grateful for this opportunity to lead the Catholic schools across the Diocese of Wheeling-Charleston," Hornyak said. "It is a privilege to be entrusted with the responsibility of guiding our schools in faith formation and academic growth of our students. I am very proud of the strong tradition of Catholic education of providing intense academic rigor within the context of our Catholic faith, here in West Virginia. Our Catholic schools are a true gift to all of us."

"I look forward to continuing to work collaboratively with our extremely dedicated principals, teachers, and staff to continue to make our schools the best that they can be. Working in partnership with parents, the primary teachers of their children, we have an important role to help each child recognize, develop, and share their God-given talents." 2

Hornyak added that she is excited to see continued growth in Catholic schools across the diocese—from enrollment to academic achievements to spiritual formation. "I look forward to continuing to improve our schools for our students so that they are always part of a nurturing and supportive learning environment preparing them for academic successes and lifelong moral development shaped by the Catholic faith," she said.

Our Shepherd

God the Father, you are our shepherd, who offer us green pastures, and life-giving water. Through love and kindness, you lead your flock to a restful place. With your tender touch, you cast away our fears. There is nothing we want but to remain by your side. Through Christ our Lord. Amen.


Sunday, April 21, 2024-The Good Shepherd

Today's readings: Acts 4:8–12; Psalm 118:1, 8–9, 21–23, 26, 28, 29; 1 John 3:1–2; John 10:11–18. When you see the Good Shepherd depicted in art, do you see yourself as the lamb? Do you see yourself as one to be protected, guided, and comforted? Or do you think the lamb reflects only a child? Imagining yourself as the lamb will provide insight into who God is for you. "I am the Good Shepherd, and I know mine, and mine know me," Jesus says. This portrayal reveals the intimacy of our relationship with God. God knows us and has given us the capacity to know him.

The shepherd is willing to lay down his life for his sheep. The Good Shepherd has already done this for us, dying on the cross so that we may have eternal life. A hired hand, however, does not have this connection to the sheep; he would not sacrifice his life for the flock. This man "sees a wolf coming and leaves the sheep and runs away."

Our Shepherd is with us—in our loneliness and sorrow as well as in our joy. Spend a few minutes in quiet, imagining yourself with the Good Shepherd in a green pasture.

Let him hear not only your voice but your deepest desires. Seek to expand your quiet prayer time this week so that you might hear the Good Shepherd's voice. Remember your relationship with the Good Shepherd grows as you make space for him in your life.



This Week at Home

Monday, April 22-In Silence

"The sheep follow him because they recognize his voice." The Gospel of John portrays the Lord as intimately connected to his followers. They know his voice, and he has come so that "they might have life and have it more abundantly." Only by pausing our busy lives can we hear God's voice. Consider where you might have even a few minutes in a day to listen to God. Today's readings: Acts 11:1–18; Psalm 42:2–3; 43:3, 4; John 10:1–10.

Tuesday, April 23-Listen

In today's Gospel, we hear that people continue to badger Jesus to prove he is indeed the Son of God. "How long are you going to keep us in suspense? If you are the Christ, tell us plainly," they say. These people are among those who do not recognize the shepherd's voice. Once the sheep are in the flock, Jesus says, "No one can take them [sheep] out of the Father's hands. The Father and I are one." In coming chapters of the Gospel of John, we will hear Jesus yearn for that same unity with humankind. Today's readings: Acts 11:19–26; Psalm 87:1b–3, 4–5, 6–7; John 10:22–30.

Wednesday, April 24-Obeying the Spirit

Today's account from Acts shows Barnabas and Saul sailing to Cyprus to spread the Good News. They wasted no time in responding to the Holy Spirit, who told the community, "Set apart for me Barnabas and Saul for the work to which I have called them." How does your community help people discern their gifts and their mission in the Church? Is there anyone you can meet with in your parish to help you discern your calling to serve the Church and the world? Today's readings: Acts 12:24–13:5a; Psalm 67:2–3, 5, 6, 8; John 12:44–50.

Thursday, April 25-Feast of St. Mark

On the Feast of St. Mark, Evangelist, we hear in the Gospel, "Go into the whole world and proclaim the Gospel to every creature." St. Mark is believed to be the disciple referred to in Acts as "John who is called Mark" (12:25). He was the son of Mary of Jerusalem, who opened her home to the disciples. It is believed that he met Peter, Paul, and other disciples in his mother's home and then joined them in evangelizing. Today's readings: 1 Peter 5:5b–14; Psalm 89:2–3, 6–7, 16–17; Mark 16:15–20.

Friday, April 26-Always Loving

With Thomas voicing confusion, Jesus lovingly replies, "I am the way and the truth and the life. No one comes to the Father except through me." Thomas had followed Jesus for years and still questioned where the Lord was leading the disciples. Believers live with questions. Whether your faith is new or lifelong, you may at times be unsure of the spiritual path you are to follow. Jesus offers assurance that he is not only the way but the truth and the life. Today's readings: Acts 13:26–33; Psalm 2:6–7, 8–9, 10–11ab; John 14:1–6.

Saturday, April 27-In Silence

"Master, show us the Father, and that will be enough for us," Philip tells Jesus. There is a Philip in all of us, looking for reassurance of the presence of God in our lives. Sometimes we ask God for a sign to calm our fears. Jesus directs Philip and us to look not only to his words but his works. Where do you see the work of God in your community? Is there someone who needs reassurance that God is present during struggles? Today's readings: Acts 13:44–52; Psalm 98:1, 2–3ab, 3cd–4; John 14:7–14.


