Please pray for the people of the Philippines and peace in Ukraine, I remain,



Rosary to be Prayed before Weekend Masses in May In Catholic tradition, the month of May is dedicated to the Blessed Virgin Mary. In keeping with this tradition, we will pray the Rosary before each of the weekend masses in May, starting 30 minutes before each mass.

Transubstantiation: "Substantia"-substance, essence, nature: the underlying principle that makes something be what it is and not be something else.

"Species"-appearances, that which is visible to the senses; color, taste, shape; e.g. visible under microscope;

Miracle at wedding feast at Cana. Substance of water changed to substance of wine. "Species" of water changed to "species" of wine. Miracle because change visible to senses.

Transubstantiation: Substance of bread is changed into the substance of the Body and Blood of Christ.

Substance of wine is changed into the substance of the Body and Blood of Christ. Substance of bread and of wine changes.

"Species" of bread and wine remain; change known only by faith.

Transubstantiation: not a miracle because change NOT visible to senses. Change known only by faith.

From our music director...

Regina Caeli: The Hymn Created During a Pandemic

What a beautiful custom that Sacred Heart parish observes by singing the Regina Caeli during the Easter season. This ancient text dates to the sixth century during the time of a pandemic. How relatable! The city of Rome was being plagued by a health crisis, and Pope St. Gregory the Great led a prayerful procession out of St. Peter's Basilica past the Mausoleum of Hadrian. Suddenly, on top of the mausoleum, the pope saw an angel singing the Regina Caeli. He replied by singing: "Ora pro nobis Deum, alleluia!" which means, "Pray for us to God, alleluia!" Upon witnessing this angelic event, the local citizens then called the mausoleum: Castel Sant' Angelo (Castle of the Holy Angel). They also referred to a nearby bridge as the Ponte Sant' Angelo (Bridge of Angels).

The Regina Caeli is the official Marian antiphon that is observed by the church for all fifty days of Easter, ending at Pentecost. This hymn also replaces the Angelus during Easter, which is traditionally observed at 6:00am; 12:00pm; 6:00pm. The church received two gifts that day the angel appeared: The local pandemic was alleviated, as the faithful were all cured! And the Universal Church received this beautiful prayer, which reminds us of the powerful intercession of our Blessed Mother. *Pray for us to God, alleluia!*

Catholic Communion

Visitors to Catholic parishes often complain that they may not join in Communion at Mass. Many other denominations welcome all who profess faith in Christ to the Communion Table, but Catholics have always restricted who shares the meal. For many who practice hospitality at home by setting an extra place at the table for visitors, the Catholic custom gives offense.

However, Catholic Communion is just that, a sign of Catholic unity. The Eucharist not only symbolizes our union with God, but also our union with one another.

Many groups use a symbol to identify their members. Students wear school jackets. Scouts earn medals. These customs give groups signs of association. When a new member joins the group, the symbol frequently becomes part of the rite of initiation, a sign of transition, and a source of pride. Those baptized in other communions who make a profession of faith with us may be received into the full communion of the Catholic Church. Their Communion becomes the high point of their transition into membership.

Ordinarily, Catholics do not share Communion at other churches, nor do other believers share Communion in Catholic churches. Exceptions exist, but they are rare. In danger of death, for example, or in some grave necessity, non-Catholics might receive permission from a Catholic bishop to receive Communion. If they do not have regular access to their own minister, ask for Catholic Communion on their own, and express a Catholic faith in the Eucharist, they may obtain permission to receive Communion.

Theologians debate the possibilities for full Communion while ordinary families find themselves separated by what often appears to them as small differences in their beliefs. The more unity we find among ourselves, the closer all Christian churches will come to resolving the differences.

Remain Close

Today's readings: Acts 2:14, 22–33; Psalm 16:1–2, 5, 7–8, 9–10, 11 (11a); 1 Peter 1:17–21; Luke 24:13–35. The Gospel story that recounts Jesus meeting disciples on the road to Emmaus mirrors our journey of faith. Just as Jesus drew near and walked with the disciples, Jesus continually draws near and accompanies us on our path of life. Sometimes we see him right away and welcome his company. Other times, like the two disciples, our eyes are prevented from recognizing his presence. Nevertheless, Jesus persists in making himself known to us.

The disciples' response to Jesus is "Stay with us" (Luke 24:29). And he does, just not in the way they expect. First, he unpacks the Scriptures with them. Next, as he did

at the Last Supper, he gives his real presence in the bread they share when they sit down at the table to eat together. So it is with us, every time we gather around our community table, the altar, Jesus stays with us. He becomes truly present under the appearance of bread and wine. We receive him into our very bodies, hearts, and souls.

As we journey through these Easter days, aglow with joy, God unceasingly pleads with us to "remain close." That can be done through keeping up the spiritual disciplines practiced throughout Lent. We can also remain close through being fully present at the celebration of the Eucharist, where Jesus draws near to us and invites us to spiritual union: communion.



THIS WEEK AT HOME

Monday, April 24

Faith in the One He Sent

Jesus offers the key to discipleship to the crowds following him from shore to shore, pleading for more miracles. Jesus instructs, “This is the work of God, that you believe in the one he sent” (John 6:29). There it is in a nutshell: have faith. How do we fuel ourselves as disciples? Daily prayer, faithfully attending Mass, reading Scripture, sharing our faith with others, and more. There is much to learn about the call to discipleship through the Scripture readings this third week of Easter. Attend closely. *Today’s readings: Acts 6:8–15; Psalm 119:23–24, 26–27, 29–30; John 6:22–29.*

Tuesday, April 25

St. Mark

Today the Church commemorates St. Mark, disciple and evangelist. Mark’s Gospel serves as a handbook for discipleship. We listen to the final words spoken by Jesus to his contemporary disciples and all who follow him forever after: “Go into the whole world and proclaim the gospel to every creature” (Mark 16:15). The mission of the Church and our call as Christian disciples continues to be to share the good news about Jesus Christ in our words, action, gestures, and relationships. *Today’s readings: 1 Peter 5:5b–14; Psalm 89:2–3, 6–7, 16–17; Mark 16:15–20.*

Wednesday, April 26

Stand Up for Faith

The challenges of discipleship are on full display in today’s passage from Acts. The early Christians suffered terrible persecution and the scattering of their communities. Christians have faced persecution across the centuries to this day. Stories abound about courageous stands for faith in the face of grave threats. No matter what, the disciples of the early Church persisted and brought many more followers to faith, growing the Church against all odds. *Today’s readings: Acts 8:1b–8; Psalm 66:1–3a, 4–5, 6–7a; John 6:35–40.*

Thursday, April 27

Called to Teach

Philip demonstrates the call of discipleship to serve as catechist (one who “echoes” the faith). The eunuch seeks understanding and Philip responds, using the Scripture as his starting point, “telling him the good news of Jesus” (Acts 8:35). We are called to follow Philip’s example as catechists, teachers, parents, and friends. Start with the Scriptures and unpack the truths of our faith, persistently sharing the joy of the Gospel with all who will listen. *Today’s readings: Acts 8:26–40; Psalm 66:8–9, 16–17, 20; John 6:44–51.*

Friday, April 28

Called and Chosen

The reading from Acts tells the compelling narrative of the conversion of St. Paul on the road to Damascus. Proclaimed in this reading are the flash of light from the sky, the fall, the voice of Jesus, three days that St. Paul was blinded, scales falling from the eyes, and the call to discipleship. Most of us will experience our call to discipleship without the drama and stunned witnesses. Called on the day of our baptism, we are continually invited throughout our life to follow Jesus and serve as his voice, hands, and feet. Reflect on your call today. Embrace it anew in solidarity with St. Paul’s faithful response. *Today’s readings: Acts 9:1–20; Psalm 117:1bc, 2; John 6:52–59.*

Saturday, April 29

St. Catherine of Siena

Today the Church lifts up St. Catherine of Siena, mystic, healer, peacemaker, unifier, scholar, and writer. Catherine is a model for all who seek to listen deeply for the will of God and courageously step out to steer the Church to her fullest potential. St. Catherine of Siena, pray for us. *Today’s readings: Acts 9:31–42; Psalm 116:12–13, 14–15, 16–17; John 6:60–69.*
