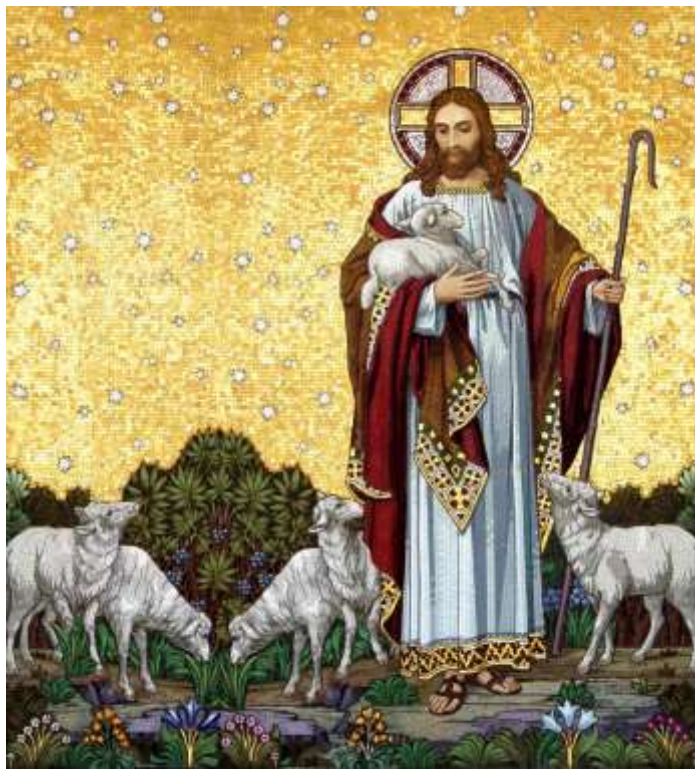

FY 2023 Other Items:

1. Depreciation is a non-cash expense and is not included above. Depreciation was \$469,212 for the church and \$305,667 for Sacred Heart Grade School and the Early Learning Center (ELC).
2. Cash & Cash Equivalents at June 30, 2023 was \$124,677 for the church and \$1,403,393 for Sacred Heart Grade School.
3. Principal remaining on long-term debt at June 30, 2023 was \$293,369 for the church and \$3,300,150 for Sacred Heart Grade School.
4. Diocesan obligation forgiveness - In conjunction with our capital campaign, the Diocese forgave \$696,852 of Diocesan obligations from previous years. This is a non-cash revenue and is not included above.

FY 2022 Other Items:

1. Depreciation is a non-cash expense and is not included above. Depreciation was \$470,188 for the church and \$307,794 for Sacred Heart Grade School and the Early Learning Center (ELC).
2. Cash & Cash Equivalents at June 30, 2022 was \$37,469 for the church and \$1,497,225 for Sacred Heart Grade School.
3. Principal remaining on long-term debt at June 30, 2022 was \$165,036 for the church and \$3,404,798 for Sacred Heart Grade School.

FAMILY FULLY ALIVE - MAY - HOPE

Because love is filled with hope when it is communicated, our family wants to promote hope and the life-giving spirit that flows from it to our families.

Breaking Open the Theme: Christian hope is faith in the redemption of Jesus Christ that enables mankind to face the present, even when there are many problems. **"The dark door of time, of the future, has been thrown open. The one who has hope lives differently; the one who hopes has been granted the gift of a new life."**

Meditation: **From Pope Benedict XVI's Spe Salvi**

Whoever is moved by love begins to perceive what "life" really is. He begins to perceive the meaning of the word of hope that we encountered in the Baptismal Rite: from faith I await "eternal life" — the true life which, whole and unthreatened, in all its fullness, is simply life. Jesus, who said that he had come so that we might have life and have it in its fullness, in abundance (cf. Jn 10:10), has also explained to us what "life" means: "this is eternal life, that they know you the only true God, and Jesus Christ whom you have sent" (Jn 17:3).

1. How would our family life be different if we did not love at all? How would this affect our sense of hope?

2. In what ways has the Catholic faith and God's love shown us how to love? In what way does the faith shape our hopes?

3. Why is having a relationship with God so important to really "living" and "hoping"?

Scripture Readings: Psalm 139:13-18 A prayer to the all-knowing and ever-present God.

Family Project: **Ask each person to choose something "impossible" to pray for this month, and choose one person in your family to pray for every day during the month. Also, to celebrate the life-giving spirit of your family, discuss times in your family's life when you grew together in faith or love.**

The “Family Life Center Food and Personal Care Pantry” at 1024 Quarriers Street in Charleston has been set up to benefit all parishioners in need within the greater Charleston area. This pantry is for you ...and...yours. Access to the pantry is through the “double doors” on Dunbar Street.

We all know that the aftermath of the pandemic as well as other economic challenges have exacerbated the need to reach out to meet the emergency needs of members of our parishes. This pantry can have a profound impact on the lives of many in our area.

The pantry will consist of the following:

- Emergency food
- Emergency Home Care Items
- Personal Care Items

The pantry will be open as follows:

- Tuesdays from 10:00 am until 12:00 noon
- Wednesdays from 2:00 pm until 4:00 pm
- Thursdays from 5:00 pm until 7:00 pm

Catholic Charities West Virginia has been instrumental in caring for the basic necessities of those served and will continue to do so.

This pantry, however, is geared at those considered “low income” in our parish communities, who, from time to time simply need assistance to get through month by month. It is not affiliated with any other pantry in the area and solely sustained by a collective effort of the local parishes.

Parishioners can be referred to the pantry through local priests or parish administrative offices... or...members of any parish. They need only to come during the designated times and our volunteers will assist. If anonymity is an issue, arrangements will be made to provide such.

We ask that you help us to sustain the pantry by weekly/monthly collection of items that we provide. If you prefer, a gift card or monetary donation is acceptable (no checks, please); all proceeds will help us restock and keep our shelves full. One of our volunteers, all representative of local parishes, can assist with parish solicitations.

Together, we can make a positive impact and ensure that no one in our parish community goes to bed hungry or is unable to meet basic needs of life. Collectively, we can be a beacon of hope for those who need us most.

Sixth Sunday of Easter

Remaining in Your Love

Almighty Father, through your Son, you have given us new life. May we seek to remain in you by yielding to your command to love one another. Grant that our hearts may be open to meet the needs of others in our midst so that we might truly call ourselves your friends. Through Christ our Lord. Amen.

Sunday, May 5, 2024-Joy and Love

Today's readings: Acts 10:25–26, 34–35, 44–48; Psalm 98:1, 2–3, 3–4; 1 John 4:7–10; John 15:9–17. **The Gospel provides a sense of the immensity of God's love in the first sentences today.** "As the Father loves me, so I also love you," Jesus tells the disciples. Imagine what that means. Jesus is saying that he loves his followers with the same love that the Father loves him. From these few words, we can begin to understand the communion of love to which we are invited through our baptism.

In the first reading, it becomes apparent that God reaches out to all to share his bountiful love. "In truth, I see that God shows no partiality," Peter explains, citing his reason for meeting with the Gentile Cornelius. Peter well knew that it was unlawful for a Jew to visit a Gentile; however, Jesus had shown him another way. No one was to be considered profane or unclean. As he ministered to the Gentiles, Peter became a living testimony of God's love.

The reading from the First Letter of John explains that we are to love one another because "love is of God." As followers of Christ, we are to spread what is God's. The author of the letter notes that, by loving, we come to know God. Consider who you refrain from loving. Read over today's Scriptures several times this week to deepen your understanding that "God shows no partiality."



This Week at Home

Monday, May 6-Take Your Place

Jesus predicts a dark future for his followers when he says, "They will expel you from the synagogues; in fact, the hour is coming when everyone who kills you will think he is offering worship to God." Preceding that reading is a psalm of thanksgiving, directing that we remember that we belong to God. "We are his people, the flock he shepherds," the psalm proclaims. Dispositions of trust and gratitude may have allowed Lydia, the dealer of cloth in Acts, to open her heart to preaching, seek baptism, and invite the disciples into her home. **Today's readings:** Acts 16:11–15; Psalm 149:1b–2, 3–4, 5–6a, 9b; John 15:26–16:4a.

Tuesday, May 7-Ready Your Hearts

It is not surprising that the disciples grieve upon hearing that Jesus is leaving them. After all, they had spent years with Jesus, witnessing his preaching and healing. Since they had not yet experienced the Spirit, it might have been little comfort when Jesus explained, "For if I do not go, the Advocate will not come to you." The Gospel today refers to the Spirit as the Advocate, and in the Nicene Creed, the Spirit is called "the Lord, the giver of life." How does the Holy Spirit instill life in the Church? **Today's readings:** Acts 16:22–34; Psalm 138:1–2ab, 2cde–3, 7c–8; John 16:5–11.

Wednesday, May 8-Go into the World

St. Paul and the other disciples acted as a Church on mission, traveling to spread the Good News. In today's reading from Acts, St. Paul tells the Athenians that God "gives life and breath and everything." As St. Paul preaches, he yields to the Spirit, who Jesus says in the Gospel will "guide you to all truth." This Easter Time pray to the Holy Spirit for guidance. **Today's readings:** Acts 17:15, 22–18:1; Psalm 148:1–2, 11–12, 13, 14; John 16:12–15.

Thursday, May 9-Thursday of the Sixth Week of Easter

"You will grieve but your grief will turn to joy," Jesus tells the disciples before ascending to be with the Father. The disciples had no idea of what lay ahead so, of course, they were grieving the anticipated loss of their teacher. Can you imagine their joy when they discover that, as followers of Christ, they had a new life in Christ that demanded that they spread the Good News? **Today's readings:** Acts 18:1–8; Psalm 98:1, 2–3ab, 3cd–4; John 16:16–20.

Friday, May 10-Focus on the Joy

Jesus likens the pain and suffering of the disciples to that of a woman in labor. Once the child is born, joy erases the pain. As the disciples anticipate Jesus' departure, they are in pain; however, when they meet the Lord again, their joy will be eternal. As we hear today, no one will take that joy from them. **Today's readings:** Acts 18:9–18; Psalm 47:2–3, 4–5, 6–7; John 16:20–23.

Saturday, May 11-For Your Joy to Be Complete

"Ask and you will receive, so that your joy may be complete," Jesus tells the disciples. Usually, people request things that they think will bring them happiness, and sometimes only fleeting happiness. But Jesus points out that what the Father gives will bring joy. How has God been present during the joys in your life? What does it mean for your joy to be complete? **Today's reading:** Acts 18:23–28; Psalm 47:2–3, 8–9, 10; John 16:23b–28.

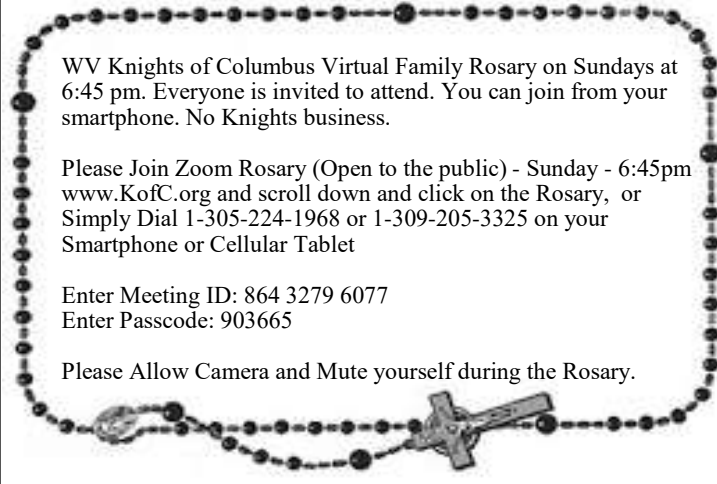
