


# Feast of the Sacred Heart-June 16

Dear Monsignors, Fathers, Deacons,

With the beautiful feast of Corpus et Sanguinis Christi, the Body and Blood of Christ approaching this coming Sunday, we have an opportunity to speak to our people of the great gift the Lord makes of himself to us in the Eucharist. In that light, I would like to briefly address a few matters:

- Convey to your people as simply and effectively as you can that the Lord Jesus gives us
  his very Body and Blood in the Eucharist. It is nothing less than his fulfillment of his
  promise to be with us always and never to leave us orphans. We cannot explain
  adequately the mystery of his presence, which remains hidden, but we experience its
  reality when we receive the Eucharist with faith in the one whom we are receiving.
- 2. Help your people to see that receiving Holy Communion is not only an act of personal piety it is that, of course but also a sign of our unity in faith and love as members of the Church and a means of building up those virtues. The Lord gives himself to us to strengthen our living of the faith and to enable us to come nearer to our neighbor in prayer and in service to those in need through works of justice, charity, and peace.
- 3. In the Liturgy as renewed under Pope St. Paul VI, the faithful may receive Holy Communion either on the tongue or in the hand. Both means are of ancient origin, and both can be received reverently. The means of receiving the Sacrament is the communicant's choice, not the choice of the minister of Holy Communion, and that choice must be respected.
- 4. Please remind your people that, if they receive the Eucharist in the hand, their hand should be clean, and they should make a throne an open palm for the Lord. They should receive the Host, not snatch it from the minister. If they receive on the tongue, their mouth should be clean, with no remnants of lunch or breakfast remaining nor chewing gum or candy vying for their attention. The one receiving on the tongue should open his or her mouth widely and stick out the tongue. The minister of Holy Communion should not have to enter a cave with sharp teeth.
- 5. The proper posture for receiving Holy Communion in the United States for over fifty years has been to stand. It is a bodily sign of our unity in faith and love. No one is to be denied Holy Communion who chooses to kneel. On the other hand, it is not permissible to put out kneelers for the faithful, for that encourages them to act contrary to the liturgical norm.

I would also urge you, if it is not too difficult to arrange, to have a public procession with the Eucharist after one of your Masses on *Corpus Christi* Sunday – best done in the streets of your town or village. Jesus Christ is the Savior of the whole world, not just of us who have come to faith in him. We should not be shy about proclaiming his True Presence in the world.

May God bless you and give you zeal and joy as you serve His people.

### Orthodox Coptic Christian Martyrs added to Catholic Martyrology

Pope Francis added 21 Coptic Christians murdered in 2015 to the Catholic Church's martyrology during last week's visit to Rome by the head of the Orthodox Coptic Church, Pope Tawadros II of Alexandria.

The visit marked the fiftieth anniversary of May 9-13, 1973 meetings between St. Paul VI and Pope Shenouda III of Alexandria, the first encounter between leaders of the two Churches, Tawadros joined Francis for the general audience and addressed the crowd in St. Peter's Square. "Despite the differences in our roots and affiliation," he said, "we are united by the love of Christ." He presented a reliquary containing the blood of the 21 martyrs to Francis, who had "no words" to express his gratitude.

"May the prayer of the Coptic martyrs, united with that of the Theotokos (Our Lady), continue to grow the friendship between our Churches," Francis said.


This visit marked 10 years since his meeting with Pope Francis. On Sunday, the leader of more than 10 million faithful in Egypt celebrated a Coptic Mass in the Basilica of St. John Lateran. Fr. Hyacinthe Destivelle OP, a member of the Dicastery for Promoting Christian Unity, said: "It will be the first time that a non-Catholic will celebrate in the Pope's cathedral."



### **Instituted Acolyte**

The word "acolyte" comes from the Greek word "akolouthos". The definition is "he who comes, a follower, an attendant".

According to the Church's law and practice, the instituted acolyte is called to serve at the altar, including assisting the Priest and Deacon with the care of the sacred vessels and distributing Communion as an extraordinary minister if needed (GIRM #98). As distinct from the typical parish server or extraordinary minister of Holy Communion, you will now exercise this ministry in a permanent way.

- Appointed to aid the Deacon and minister to the Priest. It is therefore his duty to attend to the service of the altar and assist the Deacon and the Priest in liturgical celebrations; especially in the celebration of Mass
- He is also to distribute Holy Communion as an extraordinary minister when the ordinary minister is not available or when it is necessary to do so
- He may be entrusted with publicly exposing the Blessed Sacrament for adoration by the faithful and afterward replace it, but not with blessing the people
- He may also instruct the faithful who also assist the priest and deacon in liturgical celebrations (altar server trainings)
- Destined as he is in a special way for the service of the altar, he should learn all matters concerning public divine worship and strive to grasp their inner spiritual meaning: in that way he will be able each day to offer himself entirely to God
- He should be an example to all by his seriousness and reverence in the sacred building and have a sincere love for the Mystical Body of Christ, the People of God, especially the weak and the sick.
- He must possess a firm will to give faithful service of God and the Christian people.


