
A Joyful Psalm #93: Psalm 89

It's very close to the 4th of July, the day in which Americans celebrate their national independence. One of my favorite movies is *Independence Day* (1996) starring Will Smith and Jeff Goldblum. Planet earth is being invaded by aliens, and times are *very bad*. The president of the United States (Bill Pullman) needs to give a great "pep-talk" speech to his army of fighter pilots: "We will not go quietly into the night! We will not vanish without a fight! We're going to live on! We're going to survive! Today, we celebrate our Independence Day!" Hoorah!

Psalm 89 was composed by King David when times were *very bad*. By all appearances, the House of David was imploding. There was great political turmoil; the walls protecting Jerusalem were in ruins; the Kingdom of David was marked with disgrace and shame. They needed a "pep-talk" prayer from their leader. It's as if King David says, "We're going to live on! We're going to survive! 'Forever we will sing the goodness of the Lord!'" (Ps.89:1) Hoorah!



Mary, Queen of Heaven and Earth, Intercede for us, your children in America, as we pray for our nation, our military, and our families.


We pray for our government leaders, that they will make just decisions and govern us in accordance with truth and the principles upon which our nation was founded.

Believing In Miracles "Catholic Herald" February 2023

"18th century philosopher David Hume, argued that it is irrational to believe in miracles, Hume's argument is based on the definition of a miracle as a violation of the laws of nature."

"Dr. Alexis Carrel was brought up a Catholic, but he had long since abandoned his faith when in 1902 a former classmate of his asked him to take his place as the doctor in charge of a train carrying sick people to Lourdes. One of the passengers was a 22-year-old woman, Marie Bailly, who was suffering from tubercular peritonitis and was very near to death. They arrived in Lourdes on May 27. The next day she insisted on being carried down to the grotto, despite the warnings of Carrel and the other doctors. Once at the Grotto, Marie was deemed too unwell to be allowed to be immersed in the baths, so she requested that some water from the baths be poured over her abdomen. Within half an hour many of her symptoms had disappeared and by May 30, when she left Lourdes, she was able to walk unaided. Carrel made detailed notes of what he witnessed at the Grotto describing it as "a sudden, a marvelous cure, a real resurrection". Marie Bailly went on to make a full recovery; she entered a convent of the Daughters of Charity where she remained for the rest of her life, dying in 1937

As for Carrel, he went on to lead a glittering career in medicine, winning the Nobel Peace prize for physiology in 1912. He did, however, struggle for many years to make sense of what he had witnessed at Lourdes and could only speculate that Marie Bailly's cure must be attributed to some unknown force of nature. But in 1939, no doubt strengthened by the prayers of Marie Bailly, Carrel began seriously to consider a return to the faith of his childhood. He became good friends with a Catholic priest, Fr. Alexis Presse, and in 1942, only a couple of years before his death. Carrel announced: "I believe in the existence of God, in the immortality of the soul, in Revelation, and in all the Catholic Church teaches."

Among these teachings of the Catholic Church is that when God miraculously heals someone like Marie Bailly, it is not a violation of nature but a restoration of nature, and God brings about such miracles in order to strengthen our faith so that we may believe in the redeeming work of Jesus Christ."

Ordinary Time Weekdays

The lectionary for Ordinary Time weekdays contains a meticulous series of readings. Each year begins with a nearly complete presentation of Mark's Gospel proclaimed over nine weeks. The remaining weeks divide nearly evenly between Matthew and Luke. These focus on the unique stories not found in Mark. (Significant passages from John's Gospel are heard during the second half of Lent and throughout Easter Time.)

The First Readings spread over a two-year cycle. They present books of the Old and New Testaments in alternation. These are semi-continuous readings: The principal passages of each book are heard in sequence, but not the complete book.

Year One of the weekday lectionary cycle opens with the Letter to the Hebrews and then moves to the first part of the Book of Genesis. Excerpts from Sirach and Tobit follow. From the New Testament, Second Corinthians is proclaimed. Then a whole series of passages from the bible's historical books tell the record of salvation history. Several New Testament letters come next, followed by a collection of the Minor Prophets. Several weeks are next given to the Letter to the Romans, and the year concludes with Wisdom, Maccabees, and Daniel.

Year Two opens with the historical books Concerning the kings of Israel. Then the weekday lectionary turns to a group of New Testament letters. Next, the historical books resume where they left off, and with them come the remaining major and Minor Prophets. More New Testament letters follow, and then some books from the Old Testament's Wisdom Literature. The remaining New Testament letters come next, and the year closes with the Book of Revelation.

Those who heed this sequence at daily Mass or in private prayer will encounter the main passages of the entire bible every two years.


