Do you know someone who wants to become Catholic?

The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA) is the process established for the universal Church for individuals to become Catholic and receive the sacraments of initiation — Baptism, Confirmation, and the Eucharist. This initiation process also involves a parish community experiencing a renewal in faith as it prepares and welcomes new members into the Church. The Rite speaks of conversion as a "spiritual journey." Centered on fostering a deep relationship with Jesus and the Church he founded, this journey takes place through distinct stages over a period of time (late August to Easter) suitable to bring about a thorough catechesis, significant experience of the parish community, and commitment to the liturgical and moral life of the Catholic faithful. The RCIA process is a restoration of the ancient catechumenate, arising within the first three centuries following the era of the apostles. It was the early Church's way of Christianizing the pagan Roman Empire. The Second Vatican Council called for the restoration and use of this venerable and powerful method of initiation for the worldwide Church.

A Joyful Psalm #94: Psalm 145

Last weekend, Jesus told us that we must "take up our cross and follow Him" to be worthy of His discipleship (see Mt.10:38). The crosses in our lives can be *heavy*. Jesus reminds us that the Christian life is not easy.

This weekend, Jesus tells us that we need not carry our heavy cross alone. Rather, He is there to carry it with us: "Take my yoke upon you and learn from me, for I am meek and humble of heart; and you will find rest for yourselves. For my yoke is easy, and my burden light." (Mt.11:29) A yoke is a tool that is used to harness weight between two beasts-of-burden. The yoke allows the animals to carry heavy objects *together*. Jesus is always ready to help carry our heavy crosses. Psalm 145 echoes this sentiment: "The LORD lifts up all who are falling and raises up all who are bowed down." (Ps.145:14)

May we ever place our burdens on the yoke of our Lord, our King, and our God!


Please consider joining our wonderful choir!

I believe that our cross of physical pain and mental anguish is part of our human condition as a result of original sin. Our retreat master reminded us of the words of St. John Vianney, patron Saint of priests: "If you carry your cross well, it will carry you all the way to Heaven."

Penitential Celebrations

Penitential celebrations are gatherings of God's people in which they hear Scripture readings inviting them to a conversion and renewal of life. These celebrations are not the same as the Sacrament of Penance. That is, they do not include a confession of sins to a priest nor the words of absolution. These celebrations may be very useful in places where no priest is available to give sacramental absolution, but they may take place in any parish (Rite of Penance, 36–37).

A penitential celebration may be held at church, where it begins with a song and greeting by the minister, who explains the celebration and offers a prayer. Readings from Scripture are proclaimed as they are at any Mass. The homily leads to an examination of conscience.

The minister invites the people to repent. They may listen to a text or recite one together. They may be sprinkled with holy water or perform a devotional act such as veneration of the cross or the Stations of the Cross. They may even be encouraged to follow up this celebration by performing some action on behalf of the sick, the poor, or those suffering some injustice. The service concludes with a prayer, song, and dismissal of the people.

Although a penitential celebration is not the Sacrament of Penance, it may foster a spirit of penance among Christians, help them prepare for confession at a later time, help children form their consciences about sin, or help catechumens on their way to conversion.

Very few parishes use these celebrations because repentant Catholics usually prefer to set time aside to go to confession. But penitential celebrations can be useful for deepening one's awareness of sin and forming a good conscience.

Pious Exercises

Pious exercises are ways that many Christians express their faith either in public or in private. They are not part of the official liturgy of the Church, but they harmonize with it. When prayed well, popular devotions stimulate people's faith and help them worship God even better in the liturgy.

These devotions cover a broad range of interests— the Sacred Heart, the Immaculate Conception, Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament, and the Rosary, to name but a few. They become "popular" as they spread among people who find them helpful to develop their piety as individuals or in groups. Many pious exercises are shared by a large number of people, and their practice has been passed on from one generation to the next. These developments show the value of such devotions.

Prior to the Second Vatican Council, pious exercises profoundly formed the spiritual lives of Catholics partly because they could be prayed in vernacular languages. Although Catholics prayed at Mass when it was always in Latin, they have participated more fully, consciously, and actively ever since the Mass has become available to them in their own tongue.

The liturgical renewal appropriately drew Catholics more deeply into the liturgy, which is the most important form of common prayer. Some pious exercises have become less available and less practiced because devotion to the Mass has increased.

However, Catholics are still encouraged to develop pious exercises to balance a healthy spiritual life. The Vatican has dealt with this matter in its Directory on Popular Piety and the Liturgy: Principles and Guidelines. It indicates that these devotions are at their best when they lead people back to the Mass and other forms of liturgical prayer.
