

Do you know someone who wants to become Catholic?

The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA) is the process established for the universal Church for individuals to become Catholic

and receive the sacraments of Initiation, Baptism, Confirmation, and the Eucharist. This initiation process also involves a parish community experiencing a renewal in faith as it prepares and welcomes new members into the Church. The Rite speaks of conversion as a "spiritual journey." Centered on fostering a deep relationship with Jesus and the Church he founded, this journey takes place through distinct stages over a period of time (late August to Easter) suitable to bring about a thorough catechesis, significant experience of the parish community, and commitment to the liturgical and moral life of the Catholic faithful. The RCIA process is a restoration of the ancient catechumenate, arising within the first three centuries following the era of the apostles. It was the early Church's way of Christianizing the pagan Roman Empire. The Second Vatican Council called for the restoration and use of this venerable and powerful method of initiation for the worldwide Church.

From our music director...

A Joyful Psalm #96: Psalm 86

Last week, Jesus emphasized the importance of preparing our soil (our hearts) to accept the seeds (the Gospel). This week, He warns us of an enemy (the devil) who will come to plant weeds (concupiscence and sin) within our fields (our souls): "The kingdom of heaven may be likened to a man who sowed good seed in his field. While everyone was asleep his enemy came and sowed weeds all through the wheat, and then went off." (Mt.13:24-25)

As Christian followers, it is necessary to examine ourselves to discern between the wheat and weeds within our lives. The Catechism says that "in everyone, the weeds of sin will still be mixed with the good wheat of the Gospel." (CCC 827) One excellent way to sift through the weeds is through the sacrament of confession. Before entering the confessional, we are invited to privately make an examination of conscience (I would recommend a free PDF version from fathersofmercy.com). By making a good examination of conscience, we can more accurately identify the weeds that sprout up within our lives.

Psalm 86 is the perfect compendium to the sacrament of confession, as the psalmist endlessly praises the Lord for His great mercy and forgiveness: "You, O LORD, are good and forgiving, abounding in kindness to all who call upon you... You, O LORD, are a God merciful and gracious, slow to anger, abounding in kindness and fidelity." (Ps.86:5,15)

There is one person who does not want you to go to confession, and that is the devil – the enemy who comes to plant weeds at nightfall. May we have the courage to examine our own hearts and sift through our own wheat and weeds.

Grandparents

The Church teaches that parents are the first teachers of their children in the ways of faith. And Wilton Cardinal Gregory, Archbishop of Washington says grandparents "put the icing on the cake."

July 26 is the feast of Saints Joachim and Anne, the grandparents of Jesus, the Christ. For the second time, Pope Francis has designated the Sunday closest to July 26, "World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly." The theme for the celebration this year is "His mercy is from age to age."

I agree with Cardinal Gregory from my experience in Charleston as pastor of St. Agnes Parish and the Co-Cathedral of the Sacred Heart.

Pope Francis writes the Holy Spirit "blesses and accompanies every fruitful encounter between different generations: between grandparents and grandchildren, between young and old." In view of World Youth Day scheduled soon in Lisbon, Portugal, August 1-6, the Pope has asked young people to visit their grandparents and an elderly person who lives alone and ask for their prayers.

I have been greatly impressed over the years here to see the close ties between grandparents and grandchildren. They visit each other regularly, eat and worship together. The parish and schools bring them together through parish and school functions, especially athletic contests.

Mary grew up in the home of Saints Joachim and Anne. She was surrounded by their love and faith. There in their home, she learned to listen to the Lord and to follow His will. How precious is the family as the privileged place for transmitting the faith. How important are grandparents for the family life, for passing on the human and religious heritage so essential for each and every society.

Gomez further noted the One Million Rosaries for Vocations are to include vocations to the Catholic married or Catholic single life, because we are all called to holiness - to join Christ through our Baptism, serving God as we serve others.
