Do you know someone who wants to become Catholic?

The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA) is the process established for the universal Church for individuals to become Catholic

and receive the sacraments of Initiation, Baptism, Confirmation, and the Eucharist. This initiation process also involves a parish community experiencing a renewal in faith as it prepares and welcomes new members into the Church. The Rite speaks of conversion as a "spiritual journey." Centered on fostering a deep relationship with Jesus and the Church he founded, this journey takes place through distinct stages over a period of time (late August to Easter) suitable to bring about a thorough catechesis, significant experience of the parish community, and commitment to the liturgical and moral life of the Catholic faithful. The RCIA process is a restoration of the ancient catechumenate, arising within the first three centuries following the era of the apostles. It was the early Church's way of Christianizing the pagan Roman Empire. The Second Vatican Council called for the restoration and use of this venerable and powerful method of initiation for the worldwide Church.

However, at the end of our lives, we can't take anything (from this life) with us to our eternal reward. This is what the readings from the lectionary remind us this weekend.

In the first reading, God offers Solomon *anything* he asks for. Solomon asks not for money, but for an understanding heart: "Because you have asked for this...nor for riches...I give you a heart so wise and understanding." (1 Kings 3:12)

Similarly, Psalm 119 emphasizes not a love for riches, but a love for the Lord and His commands: "The law of your mouth is to me more precious than thousands of gold and silver pieces... For I love your command more than gold, however fine." (Ps.119:72,127)

There is certainly nothing wrong with attaining wealth in this life. However, it's humbling to remember that we can't take it with us.

What is Failure?

A failure is not someone who fails, but someone who quits. Don't let successes go to your head or let failure go to your heart. It seems great people were at times also great failures. Following are some known failures.

He could not speak fluently until the age of nine. His rebellious nature led to expulsion from school. Teachers thought he was unteachable. He was refused admittance to the Zurich Polytechnic School. He said, "I have tried ninetynine times and failed, but on the hundredth time came success." Albert Einstein. Failure? I think not!

He was sixty-five years old when he set out with nothing more than a social security check and a recipe for fried chicken. He was rejected over a thousand times before finding a franchise partner. Colonel Sanders. Failure? I think not!

He said "I've missed more than nine thousand shots in my career. I've lost almost three hundred games. I've been trusted twenty-six times to take the game winning shot and missed. I've failed over and over again and that is why I have succeeded." Michael Jordan. Failure? I think not!

He was king of strikeouts, leading the American league in strikeouts five times, with a total of 1,330 strikeouts. Babe Ruth. Failure? I think not!

He was born in poverty and faced defeat throughout his life. He lost eight elections, twice failed in business, and suffered a breakdown. His resilience in the face of defeat became his greatest strength. Because he didn't quit, he became one of America's greatest presidents. He stated, "Whatever you are, be a good one." He failed all the way to the White House. Abraham Lincoln. Failure? I think not!

He denied the Lord three times and followed Him from afar (Luke 22:54). Simon Peter. Failure? I think not!

He was beaten five times, received thirty-nine stripes, was stoned, was three times in shipwrecks, was in immediate dangers of robbers, enemies, in cities, in the wilderness, often in weariness, pain, hunger and thirst. Besides all those things, he had the care of all the churches. Apostle Paul. Failure? I think not!

He was despised, rejected, spit upon, beaten, falsely accused and finally crucified on a cruel cross. Jesus Christ. Failure? I think not!

Angels

Angels, we have heard on high, sing sweetly o'er the plain. Our voices blend with theirs in an unending hymn of praise at every Mass. They've made it big in recent years on Broadway, major league baseball, the best-seller list, and the top 40. Few doubt their influence.

Angels have secured a place in popular spirituality. The faithful who try to make sense out of good fortune or coincidence frequently attribute the incidents to the presence and activity of angels. For many, they resemble benign spiritual hackers who break into the data of our lives and rearrange the bits according to their own plan. However, in Scripture and in liturgy, they play a far less mischievous role.

Angels, properly speaking, are messengers. In the Old Testament they appear nearly as manifestations of God. When you ask people to deliver a message for you, you expect their words to be received as your own, their presence to represent your own. That's what angels did in the Bible. The Book of Tobit tells of the angel Raphael who heals on behalf of God. Michael appears as the protector against evil in Daniel 10:21, Jude 9, and Revelation 12:7. And Gabriel brings the good news of salvation to Zechariah (Luke 1:11) and to Mary (Luke 1:26-27). However, Paul warned the Colossians against the worship of angels (Colossians 2:18).

At Mass, angels turn their attention toward God. They appear in every preface, before we sing the "Holy." The first Eucharistic prayer asks that God's angel take the sacrifice to God's altar on high. During the Creed we acclaim the God who has created not only things visible, but also invisible—like angels. And in the fall each year the archangels get their own feast (September 29) and the guardian angels follow (October 2). Prior to 1965, we used to end every Mass with a prayer to St. Michael.

Thus, angels have secured a place in the Scripture and liturgy of our Church. For us, they have performed as messengers of God's word. For God, they worship with all creation. As messengers and worshipers, they model the responsibilities we share in the church to spread the good news and praise God.

Archangels

Every September 29th the Catholic Church celebrates a feast of three archangels: Michael, Gabriel, and Raphael. The word archangel appears once in the Bible, in reference to Michael (Jude 9). Tradition has added the other two names to the list because both play significant roles with him in the bible.

Raphael appears in the Book of Tobit, where he is both matchmaker and healer. Gabriel is best known for his appearances in the New Testament. He announces to Zechariah the forthcoming birth of John the Baptist (Luke 1:13, 19), and most famously he announces to Mary that she will conceive Jesus (Luke 1:26–38).

Michael appears in the Book of Daniel as a defender of the chosen people (see chapters 10 and 12). In Jude he disputes with the devil over the body of Moses. And in Revelation he and his angels fight the dragon. Michael is the patron of police and others who protect the welfare of people.

No church had ever been dedicated to Michael until the sixth century, when the faithful erected one on the Via Salaria in Rome. It was dedicated on September 29th, which became the Feast of St. Michael on the Roman calendar. The other two archangels were added to this day after the Second Vatican Council. The Collect for the Mass stresses two functions of the archangels: They defend the Christian people, and they minister to God in heaven.

A fourth archangel, Uriel, is acknowledged in Christian tradition, though he does not appear in the Bible, and hence has no place on the liturgical calendar. The apocryphal gospels say he carried John the Baptist and his mother Elizabeth to join Jesus, Mary, and Joseph on the flight into Egypt. Uriel is one of the characters in Leonardo de Vinci's masterpiece, Virgin of the Rocks.
