

Do you know someone who wants to become Catholic?

The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA) is the process established for the universal

Church for individuals to become Catholic and receive the sacraments of Initiation, Baptism, Confirmation, and the Eucharist. This initiation process also involves a parish community experiencing a renewal in faith as it prepares and welcomes new members into the Church. The Rite speaks of conversion as a "spiritual journey." Centered on fostering a deep relationship with Jesus and the Church he founded, this journey takes place through distinct stages over a period of time (late August to Easter) suitable to bring about a thorough catechesis, significant experience of the parish community, and commitment to the liturgical and moral life of the Catholic faithful. The RCIA process is a restoration of the ancient catechumenate, arising within the first three centuries following the era of the apostles. It was the early Church's way of Christianizing the pagan Roman Empire. The Second Vatican Council called for the restoration and use of this venerable and powerful method of initiation for the worldwide Church.

The Transfiguration of the Lord

After six days Jesus took Peter, James, and John and led them up a high mountain apart by themselves. And he was transfigured before them, and his clothes became dazzling white, such as no fuller on earth could bleach them. Then Elijah appeared to them along with Moses, and they were conversing with Jesus. Then Peter said to Jesus in reply, "Rabbi, it is good that we are here! Let us make three tents: one for you, one for Moses, and one for Elijah." He hardly knew what to say, they were so terrified. Then a cloud came, casting a shadow over them; then from the cloud came a voice, "This is my beloved Son. Listen to him." Suddenly, looking around, they no longer saw anyone but Jesus alone with them. - Mark 9:2-8

Jesus Fulfills the Old Testament

The presence of Moses and Elijah shows how Jesus fulfills the Law and the Prophets. In the Old Testament, the Levitical law was given to God's people as a temporary administration, demonstrating their need for a Savior. Later, the prophets told of a coming Messiah, who would mend the rift between God and man that had been caused by sin. Jesus was the only man able to satisfy the Law, the perfect, sinless sacrifice.

Jesus Is the Glorious Son

In this passage God affirms Jesus as his Son, confirming his deity, and telling the disciples to listen to him. Peter, James, and John now see a glimpse of Jesus' true glory: God the Son, who reigns eternal, and against whom the gates of hell shall not prevail. God the Father shows himself as he appeared to the Israelites of the Old Testament: in a cloud, because his glory is too great to be witnessed. That same glory is reflected on Jesus, whose clothes become dazzling white. This event emphasizes both the mystery and necessity of the Incarnation—in order for man to be made right with God, God had to become a man, because we in our finite and sinful state are unable to behold his full glory.

Jesus Tells of His Coming Triumph over Death

This is also one of multiple instances in which Jesus points his disciples to his future resurrection:

As they were coming down from the mountain, he charged them not to relate what they had seen to anyone, except when the Son of Man had risen from the dead. So they kept the matter to themselves, questioning what rising from the dead meant. — Mark 9:9-10

Though the disciples do not understand his meaning, the Transfiguration and Jesus' charge to the disciples present a promise of what is to come. There is hope, because he will soon triumph over sin and death, and be raised in the fullness of glory – the glory of which they have just been given a glimpse.

Singing in them promotes social bonding & joy. Choir members are more optimistic, less lonely, more likely to contribute positively to community. A sense of achievement comes from creating notes with the body & working together to master a work. The text is often inspiring & beautiful, so despite the day's travails, choir members leave rehearsals feeling as though this is a very positive thing that I can be a part of." The Bible knew that all along. Choirs are a biblical part of God's scheme of worship! Don't

"A Joyful Psalm" #98: Psalm 97

I was born and raised in West Virginia ("Mountain Momma")! The very topography of our state is a mini-revelation from God. We know God as All-Mighty; One who reigns *over* all the earth (Ps.97). It's no surprise that God uses mountains to perform His wondrous deeds throughout the history of time: Noah begins the world anew on a mountain; Moses receives God's law on a mountain; Abraham takes Isaac up a mountain; Jesus appoints the Twelve; the Beatitudes and Sermon on the Mount; the Farewell Discourse; the Commissioning of the Twelve; the Crucifixion...

This weekend, we read about the Transfiguration of Jesus *on a mountain*. Jesus acknowledges His Kingship over the entire world, both past and present. Peter, James, and John represent the present (and future) Church. Moses and Elijah represent the Old Covenant. They are all united by the Transfigured Lord and King of the Universe.

The Lord uses mountains to point our minds to heaven. Perhaps a quick look at "Almost Heaven" West Virginia can be a small reminder of His roads that will "take us home."

I realized only later how much they cared and how much I cared.

Teaching is a difficult, challenging, exhausting job and sometimes we make it more so. Know we are grateful for the difference you make in the lives of our children. Thank you and God bless you.
