

# RCIA ...a journey in faith

## Do you know someone who wants to become Catholic?

The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA) is the process established for the universal

Church for individuals to become Catholic and receive the sacraments of Initiation, Baptism, Confirmation, and the Eucharist. This initiation process also involves a parish community experiencing a renewal in faith as it prepares and welcomes new members into the Church. The Rite speaks of conversion as a "spiritual journey." Centered on fostering a deep relationship with Jesus and the Church he founded, this journey takes place through distinct stages over a period of time (late August to Easter) suitable to bring about a thorough catechesis, significant experience of the parish community, and commitment to the liturgical and moral life of the Catholic faithful. The RCIA process is a restoration of the ancient catechumenate, arising within the first three centuries following the era of the apostles. It was the early Church's way of Christianizing the pagan Roman Empire. The Second Vatican Council called for the restoration and use of this venerable and powerful method of initiation for the worldwide Church.




Hello, Sacred Heart parishioners!

#### **Solemnity of the Assumption**

The Catholic Church believes that Mary, the mother of Jesus, was assumed body and soul into heaven at the end of her life. We believe in the resurrection of bodies that decay after death; Mary needed no resurrection of the body because hers was preserved from corruption. She was assumed into heaven.

This belief is a counterpart to the Catholic belief in the Immaculate Conception. To prepare a womb for the coming of the Word Made Flesh, God preserved Mary from all sin from the moment of her conception. Mary did not experience any sin—including original sin, which leads to further sin and death. Hence, sinless (immaculate) Mary also did not experience death as other mortals do. She was assumed into heaven.

The Preface for this day was composed after the Second Vatican Council. It includes these ideas about Mary, as well as this idea about the Church: We are a pilgrim people. This image had been enshrined in the council's Dogmatic Constitution on the Church. The entire Church makes a pilgrimage toward heaven. Mary, who achieved this goal, is a sign of hope and comfort for everyone else along the way. She is the beginning and the image of the Church as it comes to perfection.

The Mass for the Solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary is celebrated in the evening of August 14 and anytime during the day on August 15. When this solemnity falls on a Sunday, it replaces the prayers and readings of Ordinary Time. August 15 is a holyday of obligation in the United States of America, except in those years when it falls on a Saturday or a Monday. This allows those responsible for preparing Sunday worship to relax a bit more.

#### From our music director...

#### "A Joyful Psalm #99": Psalm 85

"ABOUT FACE! FORWARD MARCH!" When I was in high school and college, I was part of the marching band. We learned discipline, teamwork, and (of course) marching! Often, when you see military marching, you will hear the leader barking the order, "About face!" Immediately, all the marchers turn 180 degrees in the opposite direction. This visual imagery tracts perfectly with the lectionary readings for this weekend.

Psalm 85 was composed during Israel's return from the Babylonian Exile to the land of their fathers. St. Pope John Paul II comments: "In the original Hebrew of Psalm 85, one hears repeated the verb  $sh\hat{u}b$ , which refers to the return of the deported, but it also means a spiritual *return*, or a *conversion*." Sometimes in our lives, we may stray away from the direction of God. It is through our metanoia ( $\mu\epsilon\tau\dot{\alpha}\nu\sigma\iota\alpha$ , Greek meaning literally *an about face*) that we begin to walk with God again. "Justice shall walk before him and prepare the way of his steps." (Ps.85:14)

In the Gospel Reading, with his eyes fixed on the Lord Jesus, Peter begins to walk on water. As his eyes drift away, Peter begins to sink into the water. He then shouts the shortest prayer in all of scripture: "Lord, save me!" (Mt.14:30)

May we ever keep our eyes fixed on the Lord, so that we may always "see his kindness" and thus be granted "his salvation." (Ps. 85:7)

The voice of the Church in public life does not threaten democracy. We need the voice of religious leaders to articulate in a <u>secular</u> way their social teachings that are rooted in theological claims.

The Bible teaches that stealing is wrong, but we do not believe the police are imposing a religious belief on others when they arrest a burglar.

When I taught medical ethics to student nurses, I did not state my Church's opposition to abortion. Then and now, religious, philosophical, even atheistic persons believe that every human being is equal in dignity to all other human beings and should be afforded equal rights, especially the most fundamental right to life. Embryology textbooks, then and now, teach that an embryo is a living member of the human species who under the proper conditions will develop from embryo to adult.

The primary obligation of religious leaders is to teach. They influence civic and political life primarily by educating. Pope Francis said, "a good Catholic meddles in politics", Pope Benedict in his encyclical "God is Love" said the Church "cannot and must not remain on the sidelines in the fight for justice. She has to play her part through <u>rational</u> argument, and she has to reawaken the spiritual energy without which justice, which always demands sacrifice, cannot prevail and prosper." Righteous battles against slavery or civil rights would not have succeeded without the prophetic witness and courageous voices of religious leaders and people of faith.

Ironically, many who denounce the Church's stance on abortion welcome her public witness and advocacy when it aligns with their own beliefs such as on the death penalty or access to health care.

The voice of the Church and religious leaders in public life does not threaten democracy, but their voice, transcending ideological or partisan labels, is ever more necessary to exhort people to seek a just society rooted in the common good.




