The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA) is the process established for the universal Church for individuals to become Catholic and receive the sacraments of Initiation, Baptism, Confirmation, and the Eucharist. This initiation process also involves a parish community experiencing a renewal in faith as it prepares and welcomes new members into the Church. The Rite speaks of conversion as a "spiritual journey." Centered on fostering a deep relationship with Jesus and the Church he founded, this journey takes place through distinct stages over a period of time (late August to Easter) suitable to bring about a thorough catechesis, significant experience of the parish community, and commitment to the liturgical and moral life of the Catholic faithful. The RCIA process is a restoration of the ancient catechumenate, arising within the first three centuries following the era of the apostles. It was the early Church's way of Christianizing the pagan Roman Empire. The Second Vatican Council called for the restoration and use of this venerable and powerful method of initiation for the worldwide Church.

Knights of Columbus

From our music director...

"A Joyful Psalm" #101: Psalm 63

Location matters! Sometimes we can make certain decisions based upon our physical location. For instance, you may have heard that it is unwise to go grocery shopping if you're hungry. This is because the resulting decision will be to buy everything in the store! Locations have affected the poetic decisions of the authors of scripture as well.

Last week, Jesus told Peter: "You are Peter and on this rock I will build my church." (Mt.16:18) When Jesus said these words, he was *literally* standing with Peter next to a massive boulder that is still standing at the foot of Mount Hermon, on the Golan Heights, near the modern-day border of Syria and Lebanon. It is quite fitting that Our Lord changes Simon's name to Peter (meaning "rock"), and that Peter becomes the literal rock on which the Catholic Church is founded. All while standing next to a massive rock.

Location similarly affects King David as he pens Psalm 63. King David writes this psalm of longing while he is *literally* in the Desert of Idumea. It's no surprise that Psalm 63 speaks about a thirsting desire for God: "for you my flesh pines and my soul thirsts like the earth, parched, lifeless and without water." (Ps.63:2)

Indeed, location matters. Perhaps we might locate ourselves within the church for some extra time of prayer and adoration. King David suggests that the sanctuaries of our own parishes are the greatest location to be close to God: "Thus have I gazed toward you in the sanctuary to see your power and your glory, for your kindness is a greater good than life; my lips shall glorify you." (Ps.63:3-4) If you are physically hungry, don't go to the grocery store. If you are spiritually hungry, run to the church!

We learn of God's love through the scriptures, the testimony of God himself, where we read that "whatever you did for one of these least brothers of mine, you did it for me." (Mt 25:40)

Breaking Open the Theme: In *Amoris Laetitia*, Pope Francis called on the family to have an "expanding fruitfulness" that seeks to give life outside of one's own family through charity. Charity is a living out of the family's kingly mission to serve others.

Meditation: A married couple who experience the power of love knows that this love is called to bind the wounds of the outcast, to foster a culture of encounter and to fight for justice. 
