### Do you know someone who wants to become Catholic?

The Order of Christian Initiation of Adults OCIA, (formerly known as RCIA) is the process established for the universal Church for individuals to become Catholic and receive the sacraments of initiation — Baptism, Confirmation, and the Eucharist. This initiation process also involves a parish community experiencing a renewal in faith as it prepares and welcomes new members into the Church. The OCIA speaks of conversion as a “spiritual journey.” Centered on fostering a deep relationship with Jesus and the Church he founded, this journey takes place through distinct stages over a period of time (early September to Easter) suitable to bring about a thorough catechesis, significant experience of the parish community, and commitment to the liturgical and moral life of the Catholic faithful. The OCIA process is a restoration of the ancient catechumenate, arising within the first three centuries following the era of the apostles. It was the early Church’s way of Christianizing the pagan Roman Empire. The Second Vatican Council called for the restoration and use of this venerable and powerful method of initiation for the worldwide Church.

SISTERS OF ST. FRANCIS OF PENANCE AND CHRISTIAN CHARITY  
CELEBRATE 150TH ANNIVERSARY OF MINISTRY IN THE UNITED STATES

This year, the Sisters of St. Francis are celebrating their 150th anniversary, "Crossing the Threshold - Then and Now!" In 1874, women of courage, Mother Aloysia Lenders, and Sisters Veronica Conradi, Felicitas Dues, and Leonarda Hannappel crossed a threshold; leaving Germany to sail to America, arriving in New York on June 5th, 1874.

After establishing foundations in Buffalo, NY and Columbus, OH, the Sisters of St. Francis were invited to teach at Sacred Heart School in Charleston, WV, and on August 29, 1903, amid thunder, lightning and torrential rain, the first five Franciscan Sisters arrived at the Charleston station.

Their service in Sacred Heart Parish continued until 2000. Most notably, the Sisters ministered at St. Anthony School and Parish from 1922-1975, and again from 1983-1990; as well as, Sacred Heart Elementary School (1903-1989), and Sacred Heart High School (1923-1941), then Charleston Catholic High School (1941-1992). In addition to teaching, they applied their gifts and talents to ministry in parishes, social work, pastoral care and spiritual direction.

Still residing in Charleston are Sister Molly Maloney and Sister Frances Kirtley. Sister Molly is Associate Spiritual Director and member of the West Virginia Institute of Spirituality faculty, where she offers individual and group spiritual direction, Ignatian silent directed retreats, and the 19th Annotation Spiritual Exercises in Everyday Life. She is a certified supervisor for individuals offering group spiritual direction programs and a supervisor intern for individuals offering individual spiritual direction and/or the 19th Annotation in Daily Life. Sister Frances held a variety of positions at Charleston Area Medical Center (CAMC) including her initial positions in nursing practice and education before she established the CAMC Pastoral Care Department in 1980 where she served as director until 1998. She then served as staff chaplain until her retirement. She now continues to serve at CAMC as a volunteer.

## Knights of Columbus 12630

Knights of Columbus Councils 771 and 12630 have voted to merge after about a year of discussions, much of it centered about exactly how to accomplish the details. This request was approved by the Knights of Columbus Board of Directors on July 23, 2024. Council 771 was founded on May 30, 1903 as a general [meaning regional] council. Council 12630 was founded on January 10, 2000 as a parish council. As dictated by protocol the council number will be 771 and the name will be St. Michael the Archangel. More details to follow as the councils complete their merger.

The final meeting for the Sacred Heart **St. Joseph Men's Group** will be Wednesday, the 11th at 6:30pm in the Gathering Space. This week's discussions are on Life and Christ the Cornerstone. Mike Tupta, Deacon Michael Kawash and John Willson will lead this group. All interested Catholic Men are encouraged to attend.

Brother Knight Michael Roderick arrived in Kyiv, Ukraine September 3. His trip took him from Charleston to Chicago to Brussels to Warsaw and a bus trip [and maybe a connection I missed] to Kyiv. Mike is volunteering in a large kitchen but may be also called upon to put his carpentry skills to use. Ukraine is the country with the fastest growing Knights of Columbus membership. ### FAMILY FULLY ALIVE - SEPTEMBER - CHARITY



We learn of God's love through the Scriptures, the testimony of God himself, where we read that "whatever you did for one of these least brothers of mine, you did for me" (Mt 25:40). The Scriptures therefore instruct all, including families, to practice charity because Christ is present in every person, especially the poor and needy.

Breaking Open the Theme - In Amoris Laetitia, Pope Francis called on the family to have an "expanding fruitfulness" that seeks to give life outside of one's own family through charity. Charity is a living out of the family's kingly mission to serve others. Pope Benedict XVI explained that there are three unique elements to fruitful Christian charity that distinguish it from any other form of social assistance: a heartfelt concern for the fullness of another person's humanity, a "heart which sees" and faith.

Meditation - From Pope Francis' Amoris Laetitia - A married couple who experience the power of love know that this love is called to bind the wounds of the outcast, to foster a culture of encounter and to fight for justice. God has given the family the job of "domesticating" the world and helping each person to see fellow human beings as brothers and sisters. ... For their part, open and caring families find a place for the poor and build friendships with those less fortunate than themselves. In their efforts to live according to the Gospel, they are mindful of Jesus' words: "As you did it to one of the least of these my brethren, you did it to me" (Mt 25:40).

1. How do we live out charity in our family towards others?
2. Why does charity enrich family life and expand its fruitfulness? Do we think people can actually encounter Christ by helping those who are in need? Why or why not?
3. How can our family learn to know God better through love in our own family and love toward those we don't know?

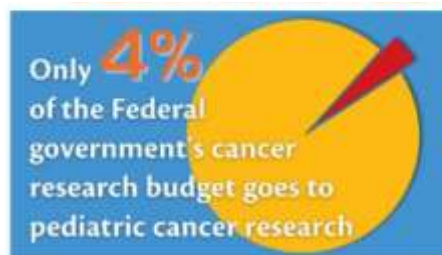


