The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA) is the process established for the universal Church for individuals to become Catholic and receive the sacraments of Initiation, Baptism, Confirmation, and the Eucharist. This initiation process also involves a parish community experiencing a renewal in faith as it prepares and welcomes new members into the Church. The Rite speaks of conversion as a "spiritual journey." Centered on fostering a deep relationship with Jesus and the Church he founded, this journey takes place through distinct stages over a period of time (late August to Easter) suitable to bring about a thorough catechesis, significant experience of the parish community, and commitment to the liturgical and moral life of the Catholic faithful. The RCIA process is a restoration of the ancient catechumenate, arising within the first three centuries following the era of the apostles. It was the early Church's way of Christianizing the pagan Roman Empire. The Second Vatican Council called for the restoration and use of this venerable and powerful method of initiation for the worldwide Church.

Bulletin Readers have asked me to share some highlights of my years as a priest.

I will start with my entrance to St. Charles Preparatory Seminary (High School and 2 years college.) Initial information said bring a black suit. Not sure I would stay, I convinced my mother to buy me a brown suit. Fr. Horning, prefect of discipline, directed me to downtown Baltimore. I selected a very ugly, inexpensive, double-breasted black suit that, unbuttoned, touched my knees. At home for Christmas, my mother bought me a black suit.

Thirteen new students, including me, were sophomores. Seminary policy was we were to repeat freshman year, then skip sophomore year to junior. I balked at this, again fearful I might not stay, Fr. Jack Franey agreed to tutor Don Connally of Philadelphia and me in Latin in our free time. The two of us remained as sophomores.

Every priest on staff except student's confessor (spiritual director) gave each student a conduct mark at the end of the semester. At the end of the first semester, Fr. Horning said to me "Sadie, you're an anomaly. Every new student usually gets an A in conduct; you got enough B's to choke a horse."

I was the only W.VA Seminarian in the High School division. (Fr.) Larry Cann was a college sophomore, (Bishop) Bernard Schmitt and (Fr.) Frank Brunner entered with me into a special sub-freshman college class.

School policy: no rings, no facial hair. Only Bishops and priests with a S.T.D. degree (Doctor of Sacred Theology) wore rings. To this day I have never worn a ring or had a mustache or beard.

Dress

Our Sunday best used to represent the finest duds we owned. Time at church was formal, and folks dressed that way. Of course, dinner was formal too. So was theater. So was **photography. Now it's different. People come to church wearing** everything from tuxedos to cutoffs, from formal gowns to sandals. Society clings to few rules about dress. Restaurants make you wear shoes and shirts. People laugh at your bathrobe, curlers, and bunny slippers.

A backless dress may be elegant at a Saturday wedding, **but gauche on a Sunday morning. Under the roof of God's house, some dos and don'ts prevail, but there is no telling how the** brothers and sisters will dress for the family faith meal. The advance of casual wear has succeeded in many parts of society, not just churches. What constitutes appropriate attire for business and leisure activities continues to fluctuate. Even when invitations specify formal wear, business clothes, or casual dress, respondents may remain confused.

Expectations for Sunday dress vary from one worshiper to **the next. A young participant's outfit reveals some flesh. Some** see no problem; others find it scandalous. Some cannot afford nice clothes; others are coming from work or stop on their way to play.

At its best, the variety of church dress displays the universality of the call to worship. At its worst, it shows carelessness and confusion. The harrumpho-meter generally short-circuits when a worshiper, who arrived expecting a place in the pew, serves as an Extraordinary Minister of Holy Communion, a reader, or song leader for a short-handed celebration. Having Communion offered to you from someone dressed in shorts and a grunge rock T-shirt may shake the most **fervent worshiper's belief in the Body of Christ.**

However, ministers generally prefer to dress well and in a fitting manner. When duty calls them unprepared, they do their best with hearts of faith, seeking to serve, not to offend. When we prepare for church, charity demands consideration in our dress and moderation in our judgment.

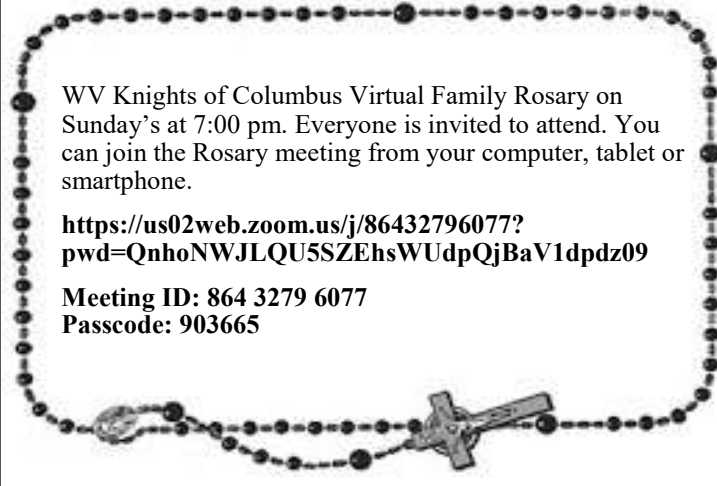
