

The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA) is the process established for the universal Church for individuals to become Catholic and receive the sacraments of Initiation, Baptism, Confirmation, and the Eucharist. This initiation process also involves a parish community experiencing a renewal in faith as it prepares and welcomes new members into the Church. The Rite speaks of conversion as a “spiritual journey.” Centered on fostering a deep relationship with Jesus and the Church he founded, this journey takes place through distinct stages over a period of time (late August to Easter) suitable to bring about a thorough catechesis, significant experience of the parish community, and commitment to the liturgical and moral life of the Catholic faithful. The RCIA process is a restoration of the ancient catechumenate, arising within the first three centuries following the era of the apostles. It was the early Church’s way of Christianizing the pagan Roman Empire. The Second Vatican Council called for the restoration and use of this venerable and powerful method of initiation for the worldwide Church.

From our music director...

"A Joyful Psalm" #103: Psalm 103

We *must* forgive others. This is a non-negotiable for God, as we see in the readings this weekend. Easy right? Nope! Christian author C.S. Lewis once said, "Forgiveness is a beautiful idea—until you have something to forgive."

The First Reading states that wrath and anger are hateful things that sinners cling to (Sir. 27:30). If we cling to anger, God will cling to it as well (Sir. 28:1). Psalm 103 describes a master willing to forgive our debts (Ps. 103:2-4), but only if we forgive others, as described in the Gospel Reading: Jesus tells a story about a servant who withholds forgiveness, and the master is not happy. "You wicked servant! I forgave you your entire debt because you begged me to'...his master then handed him over to the torturers until he should pay back the entire debt. So will my heavenly Father do to you, unless each of you forgives your brother from your heart." (Mt. 18:18-35)

And so, we proceed with this daunting task of forgiveness. Like Peter, we ask, "Okay, Lord, but how many times should we forgive? Like, seven times?" Jesus says, "I say to you, not seven times but seventy-seven times."

Fr. Sadie's "Cogitationes"

Bulletin Readers have asked me to share some highlights of my years as a priest.

After graduation from St. Charles Prep Seminary, we entered St. Mary's Seminary, Paca Street, in downtown Baltimore, (America's first seminary) for two years of Philosophy. The seminary was enclosed with high walls with the tops covered with encased broken glass. We were told this was not to keep us in, but to keep undesirables out.

Rooms at Paca Street had no running water. Before going to sleep, we filled our pitchers with (cold) water to wash in the morning using a basin.

At Paca Street, you had a roommate. Still no food in the room, no secular magazines, no radio, no entering rooms of other students except with food tray to the sick, no talking, even to roommate, after "grand silence," i.e. after night prayer until after breakfast.

At Paca Street, my spiritual director, confessor, was Dr. Carlton Sage, a convert from the Anglican Church and, professor of History of Philosophy. When kneeling at the Prie-dieu for confession, I was distracted by the books of ancient Eastern philosophies and religions on both sides of the crucifix. He was very knowledgeable of the Upanishads, ancient Sanskrit religious and philosophical texts of Hinduism. I wish he could have lived to see Pope Francis visit mainly Buddhist Mongolia because Buddhists are responsive to Jesus and His teachings.

Christian and Buddhists share common ground: need to care for the poor, duty of compassion for all living things, the value of community life, the emptying of self, the suppression of ambitious egoism, and distance from material possessions. Pope Francis' namesake, Francis of Assisi, would have embraced Buddhist monks and nuns as brothers and sisters, and instantly understood the lives they lead.

Last weekend we celebrated the one hundredth anniversary of Charleston Catholic High School. Many thanks to the hundreds of alumni, current families, parents of alumni and current students, members of the faculty and staff, and of course the students who are all important parts of the Charleston Catholic family.

We are blessed to be a part of an institution that has stood the test of time. That longevity is a testament to the standards of excellence that were established long ago, back in 1923 when Sister Annunciata and those first 21 freshmen got started. At that time it was Sacred Heart High School and was located at the corner of Quarrier and Broad Streets. Sister Annunciata was the only teacher and the principal. Each year an additional grade was added. The first graduation of Sacred Heart High School was in 1927 in the church for 11 graduates.

The school moved to 1108 Virginia Street in 1927 due to its growing enrollment. It was decided that a larger space was needed as enrollment increased throughout the 1930s, so construction began on a new school building in 1940. The first classes were held in our current building in January 1941. Still known as Sacred Heart High School, the lot and construction of the two story building cost \$238,000.

In a letter dated August 22, 1941, Bishop Swint declared Sacred Heart High School to be a central Catholic High School for the City of Charleston and South Charleston and surrounding areas and re-named the school Charleston Catholic High School.

Since the re-naming, our school has endured enrollment swings, economic bursts and downturns, and multiple renovations. Over the years, the third floor was added; the new wing and the Commons were added; the basement was converted from the cafeteria to classrooms; the off-site Athletic Facility was opened, and the fourth floor was added. In the 1980s the middle school moved from the elementary schools to our school as well.

In the mid 1980s, enrollment had declined significantly and the school was struggling financially. It was decided that the school would be closed. Msgr. Sadie was the rector at Sacred Heart at the time and he didn't want to give up on the school, so he asked for more time. In 1986, he hired Debra Sullivan to be principal of the school. Together they turned things around, and Charleston Catholic entered an era of growth and success.

A lot has changed in 100 years. But a lot has not. I have learned a lot about the history, but more importantly, the traditions and the legacies of our school during my preparations for the celebration over the last several months.

My husband's grandmother graduated from Sacred Heart High School in 1930. We recently found the program from her graduation and her dance card from the senior dinner dance that was held just before graduation in late May 1930. As we looked through her items, the similarities between her Charleston Catholic activities and our activities today made me smile- things like prom, senior festivities, community service, drama productions, mass as a student body, and the enthusiasm for Homecoming have not changed. So many of our activities today celebrate our young people while also upholding the longstanding traditions of those who came before us.

I look at the four values that we include at the top of our school profile: scholarship, leadership, service, and character. Those values have always been at the heart of our institution. They have shaped and molded generations of students who have wandered the halls of CCHS.

And we will continue to uphold those values.

But Charleston Catholic is much more than an institution or a building. Charleston Catholic is, and always has been, about the people. It is about all who gathered last weekend to celebrate and reminisce and reconnect and all who were with us in spirit. It is a vibrant community of people who come together to share joys and grieve losses. The friendships that are made in the building at the corner of Leon Sullivan Way and Virginia Street will never be contained by those walls.

As we celebrate the 100th year of Charleston Catholic, it's important to thank God for the blessing of Charleston Catholic High School and for the people who have built the school and to pray and work for its continued success as we lay the foundation for the next 100 years.

Thank you to all who were a part of the celebration- both in the planning phase and during the event!


