HURRICANE HELENE RELIEF FUND

In late September, Hurricane Helene slammed the coast of Florida and ravaged portions of the southeast with strong winds and flooding rains. Hundreds of lives have been lost and millions of families lost their homes and everything in them. Entire towns have been destroyed.

Most Rev. Mark Brennan, Bishop of the Diocese of Wheeling-Charleston, has approved a special collection to be held the weekend of October 26th-27th, in all parishes and missions throughout the diocese to support recovery efforts related to the series of disasters that have occurred. Checks should be made out to your respective parish with "Disaster Relief" on the memo line. Donations can also be made securely online by visiting dwc.org and clicking "Click Here to Donate to Hurricane Helene Relief."

Proceeds from this collection will support the long-term humanitarian and recovery efforts of Catholic Charities USA's Hurricane Helene Relief Fund. The fund assists organization on the ground in the immediate aftermath to support individuals and families who have lost nearly everything. Every dollar contributed will be used to provide essential services like shelter, food, and medical care to those affected.

Please remember in prayer all those whose lives have been changed in the wake of these disasters. Let us come together now to support our brothers and sisters in Christ who have been injured and lost their homes, cars, employment, and access to food and water.



Knights of Columbus 771-12630

The Knights of Columbus will be passing out **Boxes of Joy** after all Masses this weekend and next weekend. These small boxes may make a big difference to a child in a developing country. These shoe box sized

boxes can be filled with small items of clothing, pencils, paper, or recreational items. Each box will have a flyer which will include a list of suggested items. These boxes are packed by the donors to be dropped off in late October and are sent to children in Latin American countries so they can be received around Christmas. Each donor is asked to send a check for \$9.00 to cover overseas shipping. We will ask the boxes be returned the weekend of November 2nd and 3rd.

<u>Father Sadie Educational Fund</u> for students at Sacred Heart Grade School and Charleston Catholic High School is currently financially supporting 6 students and will support them until their high school graduation. Father Sadie established this IRS tax exempt fund prior to his death with the goal of supporting a student in each class from preschool through 12th grade. Father Sadie was well known for his belief that Catholic education transforms a child's life. Financial assistance is provided to parish and non-parish children, children of immigrants and children of color. To support a child in each class the fund needs an endowed value of at least \$1 million. It currently is at \$789,000. We are Changing the Way We Shepherd the Flock!

The Diocese of Wheeling-Charleston is revamping its communications tools to better reach the faithful in our digital world.

Currently, the Diocese uses Constant Contact to distribute emails to our database of more than 30,000 members of the faithful across the state. The Catholic Spirit e-edition, our FaithinWV Bulletin, and important messages/pastoral letters were distributed in this manner.

Beginning later this month, we will transition to using Flocknote for these, and other, communications. One of the great tools available through Flocknote is the ability to text registered numbers (if you choose to receive them) in order to better communicate with you. Many of our parishes are already using Flocknote as their main communication service and all have recommended it.

Help us grow the flock! If you were already receiving emails from the Diocese you don't have to do anything! To join our network, or to update your information, simply text DWC1850 to 84576 from your mobile device or visit dwc.flocknote.com. There is nothing to download and you will not be asked to create a username or password. From there, you'll be able to select specific communications you'd like to receive from the Diocese (The Catholic Spirit, FaithInWV Bulletin, Special Messages from Bishop Brennan).

The Diocese takes the security of any information you provide seriously. Flocknote is one of the industry leaders in security and encryption and any contact information you enter (email/phone number) is secure. Do you know someone who wants to become Catholic?

The Order of Christian Initiation of Adults OCIA, (formerly known as RCIA) is

the process established for the universal Church for individuals to become Catholic and receive the sacraments of initiation — Baptism. Confirmation, and the Eucharist. This initiation process also involves a parish community experiencing a renewal in faith as it prepares and welcomes new members into the Church. The OCIA speaks of conversion as a "spiritual journey." Centered on fostering a deep relationship with Jesus and the Church he founded, this journey takes place through distinct stages over a period of time (early September to Easter) suitable to bring about a thorough catechesis, significant experience of the parish community, and commitment to the liturgical and moral life of the Catholic faithful. The OCIA process is a restoration of the ancient catechumenate, arising within the first three centuries following the era of the apostles. It was the early Church's way of Christianizing the pagan Roman Empire. The Second Vatican Council called for the restoration and use of this venerable and powerful method of initiation for the worldwide Church.



1 God made each person, so every life is important and should be protected.




2 God made us to be part of communities, families and countries, so all people can share and help each other.




5 Work is important in God's plan for adults and their families, so jobs and pay should be fair.
