





Bulletin Readers have asked me to share some highlights of my years as a priest.

During my second year of theology, I signed up for the ministry of teaching catechism to deaf children with the Sisters of the Sacred Heart Center in Baltimore. The children were expected to learn by lip-reading. Diocesan seminarian, future priest Steve Wolan and I were taught sign language one evening a week by a deaf layman. When I practiced signing my night prayers in front of a mirror, my roommate, future priest, Fr. Robert Park accused me of talking to myself.

During Christmas vacation I made an effort to meet deaf people in Parkersburg, many of whom worked in the printing business. I met one leader in the deaf community who invited me to his New Year's party. I approached his house and heard very loud music. I rang the doorbell and the light flickered on and off. The music was loud because deaf couples were dancing not to the melody but to the beat of the music.

Early on my host offered me a cigarette. With great difficulty, I tried to explain in sign language that while I was not opposed to smoking, I did not smoke. Soon afterwards, he introduced me to a young, very attractive deaf woman. I was flummoxed (I am finally able to find a use for this word), knocked off balance, did not know what to say or do. He wanted me to dance with her. I had not danced or even shook hands with a female since taking ballroom dancing 10 years earlier in the ninth grade. I could not stammer in sign language. In very inept sign language, I tried to explain as a candidate for the priesthood, I did not dance. I ended up letting a young deaf woman give me private lessons in sign language.

I thought by this time he thought Catholics were strange, maybe even crazy.

Next, he offered me an alcoholic drink. I really didn't want it, but I was going to down it if it killed me. I found it very distasteful, but I drank it all.

Many parishioners will remember we had 3 ladies of the parish "sign" the Mass. We had one young man in the parish served by this ministry. Equally important was the message we proclaimed by this ministry. "The Word of God goes to all people."

Our human experience in this world is not purely physical. One of the great deceptions within our society is that there is nothing beyond what we can see and touch. This is called *materialism*, and though its error seems obvious, it is rather easy to get caught up in the slogan of: *Money makes the world go 'round!*

Like the Jewish leaders in this weekend's Gospel Reading, we can become so absorbed in the material world that we forget that we ourselves are stamped with an image (Gen. 1:27). St. Augustine wrote, "We are God's money. But we are like coins that have wandered away from the treasury. What was once stamped upon us, has been worn down by our wandering. The One who restamps His image upon us is the One who first formed us."

The Lord God is the One who formed us, and we owe Him *all* the glory and honor that we can muster: "Give to the LORD, you families of nations, give to the LORD glory and praise; give to the LORD the glory due his name!" (Ps. 96:7-9)

Catholic Just War Theory applied to Israeli-Hamas Conflict

The Catholic Church has a long history of reflecting on the justification, conditions and conduct of war. Let's look at the conflict between Hamas and Israel in the light of traditional Catholic just war theory (cf. Catechism of the Catholic Church, # 2309).

When a country is attacked, a defensive war is justified. War should only be undertaken because of lasting and grave harm. It should be the last resort, other means of ending conflict being impractical or ineffective. There must be serious prospects of success and the use of arms should not produce harm and disorder worse than the evil to be eliminated.

Considering Hamas, it is conducting an aggressive war, despite its claims to the contrary. The attacks launched earlier this month were not the last resort to address legitimate Palestinian grievances. While the Middle East is a cauldron of resentments and hatreds, gains such as the Israeli-Egyptian peace treaty and the Oslo Agreements show that, with good will and international support, progress can be made.

The main obstacle to peace is Hamas' hatred of Jews and its desire to destroy Israel. Instead of seeking to negotiate with Israeli authorities, Hamas has launched attacks that have caused irreparable harm by killing many hundreds of Israelis with no real possibility of succeeding in destroying Israel. Hamas' practice of hiding its fighters among non-combatants, including women and children, is cowardly and reprehensible. By attacking Israel and stirring it to a vigorous counterattack, Hamas has brought on worse evils that it seeks to eliminate.

On the Israeli side, it has a right to defend its people and to neutralize Hamas' ability to strike again. The harm caused to its people is grave; families cannot replace those murdered by the terrorists. One can argue that recent Israeli governments should have been more open to dealing constructively with the Palestinian people in Gaza and the West Bank, but Hamas has shown that it is an unwilling partner for dialogue.

Israel will successfully defend its own territory from Hamas and will rebuild its defenses against future attacks. It is less clear that it can completely eliminate Hamas from Gaza. The danger for Israel is that a blockade on food, water, medicine and electricity and a full-scale ground war in Gaza will cause such loss of life that Israel will lose the international sympathy it now enjoys, even from its usual critics, and future prospects for peace will be severely undermined. Israel's strategy should focus on swift action towards its stated goals followed by cooperation with the international community and humanitarian organizations who seek to help innocent Palestinians, particularly those injured and displaced.

Those of us who cherish Israel and want Jews to flourish in their historic homeland can and must pray to the God who is over us all, that peace based on justice may someday and somehow be achieved in the Holy Land.


