



"A Joyful Psalm" #109: Psalm 131

Confession time: I might be a "Momma's boy." When I was a young kid, my parents would sometimes call in a babysitter for their date night. I was never fond of a babysitter, and I didn't like it when my parents were away. As the evening would progress, I would become home sick for my mom. I would sneak into her room and take the bath robe out from her closet to snuggle with. Instant comfort!

Similarly, the Catholic Church serves as our Mother. In 1215, The Fourth Lateran Council called the Church "the mother of all the faithful." In his 1891 encyclical Rerum Novarum, Pope Leo XIII spoke of the Church as "the common Mother of us all." This is because the Church is the Bride of Christ: She is constantly seeking out her children.

In the Second Reading today, St. Paul says, "We were gentle among you, as a nursing mother cares for her children." (1 Thes. 2:7) Similarly, Psalm 131 states, "I have stilled and quieted my soul like a weaned child. Like a weaned child on its mother's lap, so is my soul within me." (Ps. 131:2) Going to Mass and singing the hymns, smelling the incense, and saying the prayers is like wrapping ourselves in Mother Church's warm bath robe. And should we drift away, we can always return to Mom for instant comfort. The Catholic Church is for everyone. Even Momma's boys.

Bulletin Readers have asked me to share some highlights of my years as a priest.

In early 1957, the five of us deacons from the Diocese of Wheeling were told that we would be ordained, not at St. Joseph's Cathedral in Wheeling but at St. Francis Xavier's parish in Parkersburg. This was due, I'm sure, to the fact that (Fr.) Robert Park and I were both from St. Francis Xavier. I was delighted because after eleven years in the Seminary, people were beginning to wonder whether I would ever be ordained.


We had all speculated to what five parishes we would be assigned, we were not even close.

We had not considered Southern West Virginia, Beckley, to which Fr. Mascioli was assigned. We never imagined convert Fr. Park for his home parish, St. Francis Xavier in Parkersburg. Blacksburg, in Southwestern Virginia, was completely outside our radar for me.

The five of us were comfortable giving our first blessing in English and Latin. As a surprise to my father and grandfather, I had made the effort to learn the priestly blessing in Arabic. After a short time, all the young Syrians, who like me did not know Arabic, got back in line requesting the blessing in Arabic.

My mother's family, my grandfather, 3 uncles, and 1 aunt owned a trucking company. Giddee (affectionate name for grandfather) told me, "We're buying you a new car for your ordination, a Cadillac. "No, Giddee, I can't go to my first parish in a Cadillac." "Ok, then," he said, "we'll get you a Buick." "No, Giddee, I don't know my pastor. I don't know what he drives." I ended up with a red and white, 8 cylinder, fully equipped Fairlane Ford.

My wonderful new pastor drove a Buick.

October 17, 2023 Catholic Just War Theory applied to Israeli-Hamas Conflict

The Catholic Church has a long history of reflecting on the justification, conditions and conduct of war. Let's look at the conflict between Hamas and Israel in the light of traditional Catholic just war theory (cf. Catechism of the Catholic Church, # 2309).

When a country is attacked, a defensive war is justified. War should only be undertaken because of lasting and grave harm. It should be the last resort, other means of ending conflict being impractical or ineffective. There must be serious prospects of success and the use of arms should not produce harm and disorder worse than the evil to be eliminated.

Considering Hamas, it is conducting an aggressive war, despite its claims to the contrary. The attacks launched earlier this month were not the last resort to address legitimate Palestinian grievances. While the Middle East is a cauldron of resentments and hatreds, gains such as the Israeli-Egyptian peace treaty and the Oslo Agreements show that, with good will and international support, progress can be made.

The main obstacle to peace is Hamas' hatred of Jews and its desire to destroy Israel. Instead of seeking to negotiate with Israeli authorities, Hamas has launched attacks that have caused irreparable harm by killing many hundreds of Israelis with no real possibility of succeeding in destroying Israel. Hamas' practice of hiding its fighters among non-combatants, including women and children, is cowardly and reprehensible. By attacking Israel and stirring it to a vigorous counterattack, Hamas has brought on worse evils that it seeks to eliminate.

On the Israeli side, it has a right to defend its people and to neutralize Hamas' ability to strike again. The harm caused to its people is grave; families cannot replace those murdered by the terrorists. One can argue that recent Israeli governments should have been more open to dealing constructively with the Palestinian people in Gaza and the West Bank, but Hamas has shown that it is an unwilling partner for dialogue.

Israel will successfully defend its own territory from Hamas and will rebuild its defenses against future attacks. It is less clear that it can completely eliminate Hamas from Gaza. The danger for Israel is that a blockade on food, water, medicine and electricity and a full-scale ground war in Gaza will cause such loss of life that Israel will lose the international sympathy it now enjoys, even from its usual critics, and future prospects for peace will be severely undermined. Israel's strategy should focus on swift action towards its stated goals followed by cooperation with the international community and humanitarian organizations who seek to help innocent Palestinians, particularly those injured and displaced.

Those of us who cherish Israel and want Jews to flourish in their historic homeland can and must pray to the God who is over us all, that peace based on justice may someday and somehow be achieved in the Holy Land.
