Dear Parents, Grandparents, Caregivers, Teachers, and Staff of Sacred Heart parish and school,

On behalf of St. John's and the Episcopal Diocese West Virginia, we want to express our shared distress and equally shared concerns over this last Wednesday's disturbing event while children were lining up to begin their school day. The protection and safety of the children at Sacred Heart, and of all our children, comes first.

We are grateful that the board of Manna Meal has chosen to put a "pause" on in-house service at St. John's. This should provide immediate relief for many of our fears and concerns. As the interim priest and as the new bishop, we have been in active conversation with Manna Meal for over a year to address the increasing reports of violence, drug use, and unmanaged mental illness on the properties and in the neighborhood of both of our congregations. Manna Meal began as a ministry of the church over 45 years ago but has since become an independent ministry, though still operating at St. John's. Even as late as this last week, we were actively renegotiating our relationship and the Memorandum of Understanding between St. John's and Manna Meal, knowing a transition was most necessary. Now we are called to completely reimagine what this ministry will look like for those who need this service in Charleston.

Jesus in Matthew's Gospel said, "I was hungry and you fed me," calling on us to ever care for the least and the lost among us. When the Manna Meal ministry began over a generation ago, the population it served was quite different. Today a largely different approach needs to be taken to feed and to properly care for those unhoused, addicted, and hungry in our midst. As faithful followers of Jesus Christ we are committed to fulfilling our Lord's command to feed the hungry, clothe the naked, visit those who are bound, and to respect the dignity of every human being. It will, however, look different than it has in the previous generation.

On Wednesday afternoon we met with Fr. Higgs and Principal Kurtan. We offered our equally shared concerns and any support that we may provide to the Sacred Heart community. We are grateful for our common life together as members of the Charleston community and as people of faith. St. John's and the diocesan office are open for any dialogue or conversations that you may wish to have as we move forward.

Thanksgiving Day

Thanksgiving Day may be observed with a special Mass at Catholic churches throughout the United States of America. The day is a secular holiday with strong religious roots. This day implies that there is a God, that God is provident, that we recognize what God has done, that we can address God about our blessings, and that the best thing we can say is "Thanks."

The United States Conference of Catholic Bishops includes this day on the liturgical calendar for the country as an optional memorial. Parishes are therefore not obliged to observe it. They may celebrate whatever weekday Mass would otherwise fall on that day this year. But most parishes choose to make this a special Mass of Thanksgiving. If anyone knows how to give thanks to God, the Church should know how to do it best. The very word Eucharist means "thanksgiving." There is no more fitting way to celebrate this feast than to join in prayer at the table of the Lord.


The Roman Missal offers a set of prayers that the priest may use for a Thanksgiving Day Mass, including a special Preface to open the Eucharistic Prayer. Readings may be taken from the lectionary's Mass "In Thanksgiving to God." There are several choices here, so the readings you hear may change from year to year.

Some churches observe other customs. There may be a food collection at Mass so that those who have trouble paying for groceries will benefit from the generosity of the faithful. Or parishes might invite you to bring some of the food you will eat at your own table this day. In that case, you may hear the Blessing of Food on Thanksgiving Day from the Book of Blessings.

Bulletin Readers have asked me to share some highlights of my years as a priest.

My first parish assignment was at St. Mary's at Blacksburg, Virginia, with the missions of St. Jude Parish in Radford, VA. And Pulaski, VA where Sunday morning we celebrated Mass in the hotel, the Maple Shade Inn.

In addition to the parish, I was full-time chaplain to the students at Virginia Polytechnic Institute (VPT) and Radford Women's College. This was before the days of RCIA, so I spent much of my time giving private convert classes. This was also due to the students erratic schedules.

Southwestern Virginia was part of the Diocese of Wheeling, WV until 1974. Prior to 1974, Diocesan Bishops had asked officials in Rome to realign Boundaries to state territory, but their requests had been lost. Bishop Hodges accomplished it in 1974 and made Sacred Heart his Co-Cathedral.

The Knights of Columbus want to thank everyone who attended our First [Trial] Fish Fry this past Monday. We were pleased that so many of you stayed to hear Father Thien speak and show his pictures and video. It was a special treat to be able to see the program he put together. During his talk Father Thien said that since the Sacred Heart Parishioners and the Knights started giving monetary donations to the Risen Lord Food Pantry in November 2019, we have contributed \$32,701 to this worthy project.

We feel that the Fish Fry went well enough that we will continue to have them and try to modify the operation, perhaps adding coleslaw and working on the hush puppy recipe. The fish we served Monday was Pollock. We would like to try a different fish for the next Fish Fry. The rest of the menu will be similar: Fried or Baked Fish, Baked Potatoes, French Fries, Green Beans, Hush Puppies, beverage and dessert. More details to follow. We are looking to have a second [Fish Fry on Thursday December 14, 2023, again at 6:00 p.m.](#) Jack Walsh will be the featured speaker following the meal at 7:00 p.m. The location is the Sacred Heart Grade School Cafeteria.

The **Thanksgiving Food Drive** to benefit the Risen Lord Food Pantry is underway. Father Thien passes along that most months he helps around 230 families with food, this past Thursday the 16th however, he helped 333 families, now that Clay County is again without a commercial grocery store. Most of you already know that Father's most requested food items are 1. Peanut Butter, 2. Canned Tuna Fish, 3. Canned Soup, 4. Any Canned Vegetable, 5. Canned Fruit. From our music director...

"A Joyful Psalm" #111: Psalm 128

God bless the women in our lives! The readings today highlight one of the reasons why the Catholic Church holds women in such high regard. The first reading states, "When one finds a worthy wife, her value is far beyond pearls. Her husband, entrusting his heart to her, has an unfailing prize...blessed the woman who fears the LORD, for she is to be praised." (Prov. 31:10;30) Amen! The women in our lives are *beyond pearls*, and they are *to be praised*.

Psalm 128 echoes this sentiment: "Your wife shall be like a fruitful vine in the recesses of your home; Your children like olive plants around your table." (Ps. 128:3). Psalm 128 poetically describes the truly awesome, God-given superpower that is bestowed to women: the ability to share in the life-giving power of God; the power to create a new human life. *This is incredible!* This is the reason that you might see some women veiled at Mass. It isn't because they are *holier than Thou*. It's because we veil things that are set apart for sacred duties. We veil the Tabernacle, which holds Our Lord in the Eucharist. We veil the Altar, which represents Christ and the One Sacrifice. We veil the Chalice, which holds the Precious Blood. We veil a bride in white to represent her purity and the new life that she can give to her new family. (The groom is dressed in black to represent death, as leaves behind his former life in sacrifice for his new wife and family) Thus it is that some women are veiled, as they can be sacred vessels for God's creation.

The Venerable Bishop Fulton Sheen states, "A woman is capable of more sacrifices than a man. Man is more apt to be a hero, through some great passionate outburst of heroism. But a woman's love makes a thousand small sacrifices, sprinkling them through the days and the months." May God bless all the women, mothers, and grandmothers in our lives!

SCAM ALERT




