



Last Saturday, December 2, Charleston Catholic High School participated in our annual Christmas tradition of hosting a Christmas party in Clay County. This year marked a return to a Christmas party after a few year hiatus. A group of seniors and faculty and staff met very early Saturday morning to travel to Clay County and get ready for the Christmas party at the Risen Lord Church. We started by unloading the trucks of about 320 presents and 220 food boxes, along with boxes of cookies and other treats and supplies.

CCHS has partnered with the parishioners at Risen Lord Catholic Church in Maysel for over thirty years to plan and carry out the project. This year our Christmas party welcomed 118 families to get their pictures taken with Santa and Mrs. Claus, enjoy some hot chocolate and homemade cookies, and pick up stockings, presents, and food boxes.

This annual service would not be possible without the support of the entire CCHS community, students, families, faculty and staff, and others. We thank the Sacred Heart Grade School children, their families, and faculty and staff who continued their tradition of involvement by providing over 140 food boxes for distribution to families at the party.

The project is a highlight of the school year. It is such an important reminder of the power we have to make a difference in our world. In the first week of Advent, this project offers hope in the next generation and hope in our world that we can all do our part to make things better.







#### From our music director...

#### "A Joyful Psalm" #114: Psalm 85

I lived in Southern California for a time, and we would occasionally make a trip into the San Gabriel Mountains just East of Los Angeles. After leaving the noisy city and driving some steep roads, you finally park your car to step out into an impressive landscape. The view is incredible, and the sound is completely still and quiet. Your entire vantage point is that of perfect clarity for sound and sight.

The readings this weekend challenge us to seek a perfect vantage point of clarity (and climbing to great heights!). The First Readings states: "Go up on to a high mountain, Zion, herald of glad tidings; cry out at the top of your voice, Jerusalem, herald of good news!" (Is. 40:9-11) This sentiment is echoed in the Communion Antiphon: "Jerusalem, arise and stand upon the heights and behold the joy which comes from God." (Bar. 5:5-9)

During the season of Advent, the Church encourages us to climb to great heights to give us clarity of mind, body, and soul. We go to the Sacrament of Confession to make a straight path for God into our hearts. We commit to extra acts of charity and service to share a joy, which comes from God. In these ways we can more clearly *see His kindness*. We pray that He *grants us salvation*. (Ps. 85:7)

Draw us into the circle of love that surrounds the newborn Christ child. Help us prepare our hearts to welcome him home with a deep abiding love and with gratitude for his friendship. Through Christ our Lord. Amen.

#### Sunday, December 10, 2023-Prepare a Home for the Lord

Today's readings: Isaiah 40:1–5, 9–11; Psalm 85: 9–10, 11–12, 13–14; 2 Peter 3:8–14; Mark 1:1–8. The Lord is always coming toward us, seeking a home in our lives. Advent mindfully prepares our hearts as a permanent dwelling place for the Lord. The letter of St. Peter urges us to "conduct ourselves with holiness and devotion, waiting for and hastening the day of God" (2 Peter 3:11–12). Time is precious during this year's short Advent as it competes with the secular frenzy of the season. Stay attuned to the spirit of Advent as you prepare for the coming of our Lord.

Adorn your surroundings with reminders to keep your focus on spiritual preparation. Religious imagery forms us in powerful ways. The practice of setting up a nativity scene at home begins in Advent and continues through the celebration of the Epiphany. St. Francis of Assisi began this custom in 1223 when he celebrated Christmas with his brothers at Greccio with a staging of the stable in Bethlehem that included live animals. This tradition quickly spread, and people began to construct nativity scenes in their homes, churches, and public spaces. You might set up your entire scene all at once, leaving the crib empty for the Christ child to arrive on Christmas Eve. Or set up the scene slowly, placing the figures far from the scene and moving them closer day by day with the Magi arriving on Epiphany with gifts for the child Jesus.

#### This Week at Home

#### Monday, December 11-Christ Will Come Again

Today's readings paint a hope-filled picture of the way Christ comes to us at the end of time, often referred to as the parousia. At this time, illness, disability, drought, hunger, sin, conflict, and every source of discord will be wiped away and the full glory of the Lord will be revealed. Prayerfully, reflect on today's readings, resplendent with the promise that our God comes to save us. Today's readings: Isaiah 35:1–10; Psalm 85: 9–10, 11–12, 13–14; Luke 5:17–26.

#### Tuesday, December 12-Our Lady of Guadalupe

Today we continue to celebrate Mary's radiant appearance to Juan Diego on Tepeyac Hill, Mexico, in 1531. Mary, whose features were those of a Mesoamerican Indian, offered hope to the oppressed native peoples, who in turn, named her Nuestra Señora de Guadalupe. The Feast of Our Lady of Guadalupe is widely celebrated around the world. Venerate our patron saint of the Americas in a special way today: place her image near the Advent wreath, prepare a special meal, pray the Rosary, recall the miraculous story of her apparition and all that followed. Today's readings: Isaiah 11:1–10; Psalm 72:1–2, 7–8, 12–13, 17; Luke 10:21–24. Zechariah 2:14–17 or Revelation 11:19a; 12:1–6a, 10ab; Judith 13:18bcde, 19; Luke 1:26–38 or Luke 1:39–47.

#### Wednesday, December 13-St. Lucy

The Church remembers St. Lucy, a fourth-century martyr whose name means "light," as the patron saint for those with eye disease. Many cultures celebrate St. Lucy with festive customs. In Sweden, this day is called Luciadagen. The eldest daughter of the family dresses up as St. Lucy and greets the family with special breads. Legends tell of St. Lucy's handing out bread in the time of famine. Make or purchase two loaves of braided bread and adorn them with candles. Enjoy one and surprise a neighbor with the other. Today's readings: Isaiah 40:25–31; Psalm 103:1–2, 3–4, 8, 10; Matthew 11:28–30.

#### Thursday, December 14-St. John of the Cross

Today the Church commemorates this saint from sixteenth-century Spain: St. John of the Cross, whose spiritual writings continue to offer inspiration. Severe persecution and suffering in prison unlocked his poetic gifts. His memorial is placed in Advent because his writings so often highlight Christ as light penetrating the darkness. Light a candle to remember John of the Cross as a reminder that Christ, our light, illuminates our hearts especially in times of suffering. Today's readings: Isaiah 41:13–20; Psalm 145:1, 9, 10–11, 12–13ab; Matthew 11:11–15.

#### Friday, December 15-Follow the Lord

The response of today's responsorial psalm proclaims, "Those who follow the Lord will have the light of life." Catholics often celebrate the sacrament of reconciliation each Advent as an essential element of their spiritual preparation for the celebration of Christmas. We need help to resist the temptation to sin and to grow in holiness. Do not delay. Seek reconciliation this Advent and make room in your heart to welcome Jesus. Today's readings: Isaiah 48:17–19; Psalm 1:1–2, 3, 4, 6; Matthew 11:16–19.

#### Saturday, December 16-Las Posadas

Las Posadas (from Spanish meaning "the inns") is a widely observed Advent tradition celebrating Christian hospitality beginning December 16 and continuing for nine days until December 24. The posadas symbolize Mary and Joseph's difficult search for a place to stay. There are many creative ways to observe Las Posadas. Through the celebration we are reminded that by welcoming the poor and needy, we also welcome Jesus. Today's readings: Sirach 48:1–4, 9–11; Psalm 80: 2ac, 3b, 15–16,18–19; Matthew 17:9a, 10–13.
